

Chinese Pirates Capture British Children?

WARSHIPS SEARCHING FOR MISSING VESSEL

Considerable Anxiety

CONCERNING FATE OF SEVENTY-TWO BOYS AND GIRLS

Considerable anxiety is being felt for 70 British School-children of the China England Mission School in Chefoo, who, with their mistresses and masters were proceeding to Chefoo from Shanghai in the "Tungchow," which is a vessel on a day late and it is feared she may have been attacked by pirates.

The British naval authorities have despatched the warships "Sulfolk" and "Sandwich" and the aircraft carrier "Hermes" with aeroplanes to search the area.

The "Tungchow" is a vessel of 2,104 tons and belongs to the China Navigation Company. The officers are British, but she has not replied to wireless messages for some hours although the weather conditions are reported good.

The children had come mostly from southern and central China and are of ages ranging from six to 16. They had been on their Christmas holidays and were returning to school. It is feared that they had been home to their parents who are missionaries in various parts of China, the others are children of British merchants or officials. This trip is made annually and is the children's main holiday of the year for the weather is at its best.

The Eight Industrial States

A private meeting of the governing body of the International Labour Office has closed by the vote of one to one of the eight industrial states on American, France, Germany, Great Britain, Italy, Japan and the U.S.R. and that these will form the governing body from the beginning of the next session in April. AUTHOR AND DIPLOMAT

Death of Mr. R. Washburn Child

London, Jan. 31.

The death of Mr. Richard Washburn Child, former Ambassador to Russia, was announced today.

Mr. Richard Washburn Child, the famous American author and diplomat, was born at Worcester, Massachusetts, in 1861. Educated at Harvard University, where he took degrees in law, he was admitted to the bar in 1886, and was engaged in the practice of law until 1917.

In 1917 and 1918 he was assistant to Mr. Frank A. Vandenberg in the Finance section of the United States Treasury and the following year was appointed editor of "Collier's" weekly.

From 1921 to 1924 Mr. Child was Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to Italy. He was the son-in-law of the Count of Foligno, Italian nobleman, and was the chief representative of the United States at the Conference of Ginnoli in 1922 and at the Conference of the same name in 1924. Among his many public activities in the United States he acted as chairman of the National Crime Commission.

He published a number of books on foreign relations and diplomatic relations, and collaborated with Signor Mussolini in the latter's "Autobiography."

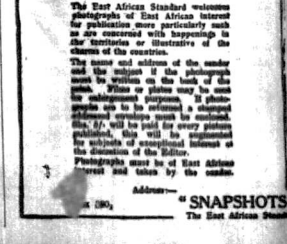
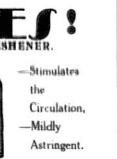

KENYA CHAMPIONSHIP. In the final match held on Tuesday last H. Middlelich, the European Champion won the first game against Barakat Ali, Champion of the Indians. The second game will be played this evening at 8.15 in the K.I.B. and H. Indian Institute in Eastern Hill. Visitors will be welcome. The arrangements will be the same as on Tuesday as described in our Chess Column of last week. They proved most successful and visitors are enabled to discuss freely every move in the game without disturbing the players.

French Defence. The Indian won the first and played the White pieces, Middle-

lich replying to J. P-K4 with the French Defence. The game was interesting, and Middlelich gained command of the centre very early, playing for positional advantage which ultimately covered a win. From the 22nd move, however, he weakened the King's side Pawn as at the 16th move Barakat Ali had a definite win if he had properly pressed his attack on the King's side, but by making an aimless and weak move, the Indian lost the chance and never got another Middlelich's centre. Pawns formed an inviolable 'square' which prevented forward dividing White's forces. The position can readily be understood on referring to the diagram and notes below the same.

The game was played strictly by the clock, and Middlelich had made his 20th move only ten minutes before his flag fell marking the first hour. The last nine moves of this twenty took him an average of 60 minutes per move, the first eleven averaged one minute each.

Barakat Ali played too fast, his average being about 2 minutes a move in the first hour, and faster still in the second hour. Unaccounted to clocks, both players seemed a little worried about the time limit and their game suffered a little in consequence.

Referring once more to the diagram of the critical position after Black's 15th move, it would seem that Barakat Ali feared to have his Queen trapped if he put his Knight behind her. Analysis shows that there was no danger to White in it at all, the lost the game because he didn't do it!

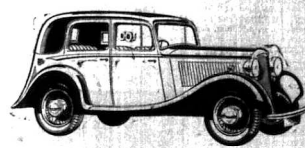

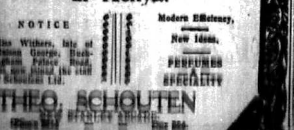

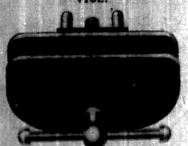

Anglo-French "Talks" Open in London

AGREEMENT STATED TO HAVE BEEN REACHED

An Air Convention

LIMITATION OF ARMAMENTS TO 1932 BASIS

The momentous discussions between French and British Ministers began in London on Friday and are stated to have had a successful outcome.

Although no official announcement has been issued, it is learned that an agreement has been reached for a general convention limiting armaments to the basis of an 1932 agreement and for an Anglo-French Defensive Air Convention.

A meeting of the British Cabinet was held on Saturday, it is believed to discuss an "impressive" French estimate of German military strength.

Rumoured Secret Dossier

(Nairobi News Service.) London, Feb. 4.

The momentous Anglo-French discussions began at 10.30 this morning at 10, Downing Street, when Mr. Ramsey MacDonald, Mr. Stanley Baldwin, Mr. Anthony Eden, Mr. Plimsdon and Mr. Laval, accompanied by their experts, discussed some problems of the morning which they adjourned for a luncheon given by Mr. Baldwin at 11, Downing Street.

It is learned later that the conversations in the morning were largely devoted to a general exchange of views on the French thesis regarding security. The statements will settle down to the more important details in the afternoon. No communications have been issued on the morning's proceedings.

The general field of the discussions embraces Germany's re-armament, her claim to equality

with which the dossier of views is taking place.

It is understood that the question of an Air Armament Convention was among the points raised by the French Ministers. There was also discussion on the number of trained men bearing arms in Germany.

It is emphasized in French circles that the discussions are purely for the purpose of exchanging views and do not contain any definite proposals.

The Anglo-French ministerial conversations on February 2 (Hermon) to continue the general examination of the principal questions. The French proposal of a general outline of the talks is to establish the following measure of agreement on the best method of reducing the drift in European affairs and of establishing peace whereby France and Britain may join their contributions to the general security of benefit to all countries. The conversations are proceeding in the strictest secrecy.

Fuller Equality

The security system taking shape is designed to establish the fullest equality for all nations both in rights and security, and there is complete agreement between France and Britain that whatever the final solution is to be, the arrangements which had taken place in Germany in reconstruction of Treaty obligations, the procedure adopted must be followed in the machinery of the League of Nations.

The French proposal, Mr. Plimsdon will be the guest during the week-end of Sir George Henry, and an understood amongst other who will meet the distinguished guests at the residence of the Evoluquer, Mr. Neville Chamberlain.

Sharing and the Franco

Reports that Mr. Plimsdon would share before Mr. Neville Chamberlain a preliminary summary of findings in the supreme need of settling the Franco and German relationship must be awarded British Official Wireless Service.

TO COPE WITH FOREIGN COMPETITION

(Nairobi News Service.) London, Feb. 4.

In the House of Commons this morning was taken in connection with the Shipping Bill, the chief provision of which is a subsidy of £2,000,000 for the assistance of tramp shipping.

Mr. Walter Runciman emphasized that the subsidy should not be dissipated by unscrupulous competition amongst British shipowners but should be utilized to secure as far as possible, the greater employment of British vessels at the expense of foreign subsidized vessels.

British shipowners should press foreign governments for co-operation in order to obtain an adjustment of the dumping of world shipping to the capacity of the British fleet.

Secret Dossier

(Nairobi News Service.) London (later). It is rumored that the French presented yesterday a secret dossier of the French General Staff dealing German re-armaments. It is understood to contain information never previously disclosed to British Ministers although known to the British General Staff.

The "talks" were interrupted by prolonged. They began at 8 p.m. and were adjourned at 8.30 p.m. Sir John Simon said: "We have not quite finished, but things are going quite well."

The Anglo-French "talks" were adjourned at 11.45 p.m. today until tomorrow afternoon. Sir John Simon told Reuters that the discussions were proceeding very well.

The Special Correspondent of the Haver Agency in London declares that the Franco-British agreement is certain to be reached. It is believed that the military clause in the Treaty of Versailles will be abolished except as regards demilitarization of the left bank of the Rhine. A Defensive Franco-British Air Convention has been agreed upon.

Substantial Agreement

(Nairobi News Service.) London, Feb. 4.

It is learned that a substantial measure of agreement has been reached. The main points will be expanded to-day and signed tomorrow. The conversations will be resumed at 6.30 p.m. Mr. Laval has postponed his departure until Monday.

London (later). It is learned from an authoritative source that the expected agreement was reached at the resumed Anglo-French discussions on Friday afternoon at a conference to which the British and French Governments are invited.

Information obtained in London should be expected to confirm the report of the lines of the agreement providing for a general convention on limiting armaments to the basis of the 1932 agreement and for an Anglo-French Defensive Air Convention.

Paris, Feb. 4. A forecast of the agreement is that Germany will return to parity and Italy will be asked to contribute to an Anglo-French Defensive Air Convention. The Dominions Eastern Pact will be signed.

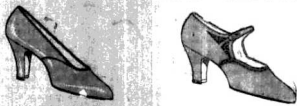

In the United Kingdom the Exhibition will be represented by the Federation of British Industries, assisted by a small Advisory Committee intimately connected with South Africa and her interests.

Julius Celebrations
While the Exhibition has the support of every part of South Africa, it is of particular interest to Johannesburg along that City will be holding its Julius celebrations at the same time. Johannesburg received its first Charter from President Kruger in October, 1886, and has since an immediate and neighbouring white population of nearly half a million. STATEMENT BY ECONOMIC COMMITTEE MINORITY

Inadequate Steps

TARDY RECOGNITION OF THE FACTS BY THE GOVERNMENT

A picture of the effects of the depression upon Kenya is provided in a special chapter of the Report of the Minority of the Economic Development Committee. The Report considers that the Government of Kenya has been tardy in its recognition of the extent of loss of the national income through the price collapse, that the policy of expediency and retrenchment and increased taxation cannot be applied again, that the Government's policy retarded recovery and that is necessary required is a downward readjustment of all State costs, interest rates, transport charges, etc.

Threat to Social Order

An amusing statement of the effects of the depression in Kenya is contained in the Minority Report of the Economic Development Committee, following upon their examination of statistics relating to the position of the industries, the loan expenditure, the Colony's foreign exchange position, and the effects of the depression upon the internal economy of the Colony and to the Government's policy as it has been applied to meet the needs of the situation. The first effects of the collapse in World Trade (which is high) was to strike at the root of the Colony's income, that of its export producers. In the absence of any country-wide policy to meet the threat, all exporters took the only action which was open to them—an attack upon their costs of production.

Rex Taxation

Another disability facing the taxpayer is due to the fact that the Government has imposed upon the income tax competition between the two countries. The right to impose a tax is a privilege which the Government has to exercise with care. It is not a privilege which can be exercised at will. The Government has to consider the interests of the taxpayer and the interests of the community.

Meeting the Threats

Paced with little hope of improvement in the external market, the industrial community has to guard their existence. The underlying principle in all cases is to reduce costs, namely that of cost-guaranteeing to the industry the internal market as a price which would be equal to some extent the loss on export. 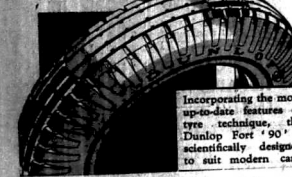

Land Tax Proposed

TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR ASSISTING DISTRESSED FARMERS

The Indian attitude to the economic problems of Kenya has been the subject of the recent enquiry by the Economic Development Committee as reported stated by Mr. D. D. Puri, the sole Indian Member, in Notes of Dissent attached to the Report.

He considers that most of the troubles of the Colony are traceable to the fact that the Highlands have been left to the hands of a few large owners of arable land for Africans, while the Indian farmers have not been able to become a producing community.

He objects to the continued reservation of the Highlands, objects to the use of general revenue for the subsidizing of European agriculture and considers that the Indian community should not be called to contribute to taxation to be used for such a purpose. His remedy is the creation of a special Agricultural Assistance Fund out of the proceeds of a tax on undeveloped land.

Mr. Puri opposes any form of marketing legislation, criticising the proposed pool for maize, asks for a searching enquiry into the wheat pool, and asks for the strengthening of controlled marketing of native produce, and suggests greater production in the reserves.

His support is given, however, to the picture presented by the Minority Report of the Colony's balance of trade, and in favour of the truth that the same contention is contained in the Majority Report.

The Economic Committee's Report

The final section of the Report of the Economic Development Committee was read by the Minister of Agriculture and the Minority Report was read by the Minister of Finance. Mr. Puri, the sole Indian Member, who began by saying emphatically that the Indian community is in the delirium as it is proved to be by the evidence of the conclusions arrived at and the recommendations were in any way possible and reasonable. SAFARI BY AIR IN A HURRY!

Europe, S. Africa and E. Africa—19 Days

VICTOR'S RAPID TOUR

A flying visit of East Africa across the sea to be made on the short visit just made to the country by Victor's Rapid Tour.

Mr. Victor arrived at Nairobi from South Africa on January 27, and having only a few days to spare and wishing to see as much as possible, he got in touch with Messrs. Wilson Airways Ltd. for the arrangement of his tour and the object was that of a six weeks on the Wednesday morning he left in one of the Company's Post Mails.

His first stop was at Nanyanga where he was taken out by car to see the neighbouring herd of elephants. He arrived in Mombasa in time for lunch and in the afternoon visited local coffee and oil estates.

On Thursday morning he flew from Mombasa to Arusha, and having a car driven out to the Nguru Nguru estate to see the mining of game always in that vicinity, returning to Arusha the same evening.

Friday's flight was first to the Serengeti plains, where the air pilot remained for several hours to enable Mr. Victor to get close to more game and then on to Morogoro, where the night was spent.

A Record?

On Saturday he was taken along the south shore of the lake and then along the west shore to Bihoko where four or five hours were spent. Then on to Euphrate and thence arriving there in the evening.

On Sunday Mr. Victor inspected the cotton and tobacco industries in the neighbourhood and returned to Entebbe the same evening.

From Entebbe Mr. Victor is visiting Fort Portal and the Mission Falls and on February 11 will join Imperial Airways service at Entebbe to fly home to Europe. This safari must be one of the quickest on record, for Mr. Victor will only spend 19 days on his journey between Johannesburg and Cape and yet in addition to spending two days among Nairobi and neighbourhood, he will have travelled some 1,200 miles in East Africa, getting a wonderful view of the country and its human and animal inhabitants both from the air and from the ground.

NEW ARRIVALS

2,090 Immigrants in December

Immigrants into East Africa through the port of Mombasa numbered 2,090 during December, 1924, as compared with 1,860 during November, 1924, and 1,867 during December, 1923; while emigrants for the same period numbered 1,210, as compared with 1,220 during November 1924, and 1,363 during December 1923. The excess of arrivals over departures in December, 1924, was 879.

Of the 2,090 persons who entered the Colony during December, 745 were from the United Kingdom, 1,079 from Kenya alone, leaving a net Kenya excess of 334. In addition to the above, 33 Europeans and 2 Indians entered, and the December left Kenya by air during December, 1924.

The estimated native population on December 31, 1924, was 17,500 Europeans, 34,565 Indians, 2,125 Colours, 12,121 Arabs, and 1,401 others, making a total of 57,712 persons.

4,645 since the census enumeration of March, 1921. The increase in the number of Europeans since the 1921 census is given as 69,355, while Indians have increased by 4,626, Ghanas by 663, and Arabs by 215.

VALUABLE STAMPS

Zanzibar Issues Worth £40 Each

London (By Air Mail). Some of the most valuable stamps were printed by overprints. Six stamps printed by the British Guiana "Official Gazette" are for sale now in London. Some are printed on the ordinary paper used for the stationery offices on sugar-cane paper between 1850 and 1862 these stamps were made by the Guiana, the rare one of 1850 now being priced as high as £7,000.

Other examples are the Fiji stamps of 1870, which were printed at the offices of the "Fiji Times," and some Indian stamps of 1865, engraved for Mr. and Mrs. G. F. Glandford of Bihar.

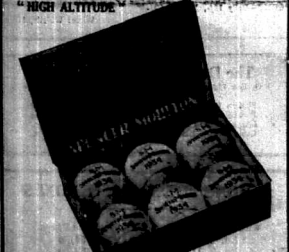

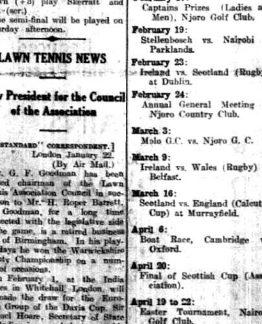

African Bites at the Telo District home, but by 1930 the S.F.D. administration considered that the present of the K.A.F. is temporary, since when the near-est military depot has been at Waji.

The New Proposals
The new proposal that the administration of the Telo District should be devolved from that of the other small tribes in the K.F.D. indicates that it is not now considered imperative that they should all remain under the colonial Administration.
Another development favourable to the re-union of the Telo District is the fact that the Lamu is the natural and obvious outlet for that district and since the opening of a motor road uniting the two Districts, there has been a considerable increase in trade between them, the further development of which will be to their mutual interests. Such development will be promoted and furthered by the re-union of the Telo District with that of the coastal administrative area.
So far, then, as the interests of the Abdulla and Abd Wad Sidi are concerned there seems to be no advantage in retaining the former boundaries of the Lamu District.

In regard to the riverine people above Masahubi, their products, customs, language, general interests, and even their chief diseases, are the same as those of the people living on the banks of the river. The re-union of these Districts would seem to be to their best interests and should facilitate their administration.
However, whether there may be a balance in keeping separate units may be taken as a fact that the government of the present time will be the most economical. This certainly can be ascertained by dividing up the Telo District in the manner suggested, though it might be found advisable to station one or two of the K.A.F. Detachments at Garissa, or the former home of the K.A.F., or to send one up from time to time as and when needed. It would usually be available during the rainy season when the river is in flood, by the K.A.F. units, or to send one up from time to time as and when needed.

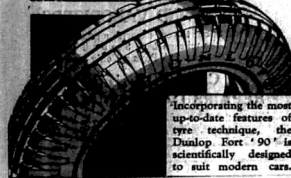

THE FEBRUARY MEETING IN RETROSPECT

The Jockey Club of Kenya should be congratulated with the result of the Nairobi February Meeting. Although some of the fields cut up under the rain was generally interesting, and at times exciting. The attendance of the public was mediocre, but it is understood that a financial loss was avoided. 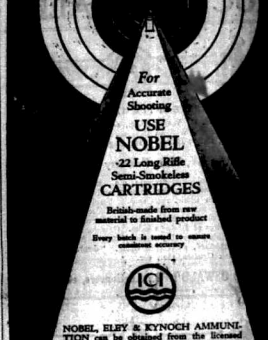
