

KENYA 'TANGANYIKA NOW' DEMAND

Tanganyika and Uganda adamant

TANGANYIKA'S Vice-President, Mr. Kawawa, said at a weekend Press conference in Entebbe that his country and Uganda would 'never' be free today.

Mr. Kawawa, who was on his way to London for talks with the British Government on the future of the East African Common Services Organisation, was met by Uganda Prime Minister, Mr. Obote, the Minister of State, Mr. Magufuli and other Ministers and officials.

He had been asked if he and Mr. Obote had any definite plans to present to the British Government on Kenya. Mr. Kawawa replied that although they had no such plans "we are friendly men."

Mr. Obote said that the issue was clearly on the British Government. "They have to tell us why Kenya cannot be free right now. It is not a question of begging. We shall never give up our independence. The British Government should know that to request us to be good members of the Commonwealth is not an easy and impartial party next door within our E.A.C.S.O."

Greater solidarity

Mr. Kawawa, replying to another question, agreed that the talks he was to have in Entebbe were devoted increasing solidarity between Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika. Further questioned, he said that the position to the British Prime Minister, Mr. Macmillan, was a joint mission between Tanganyika and Uganda. Mr. Obote said talks in Britain would be on the question of independence status, bearing on the question of C.S.O.

He added, "If we are lucky enough to have any meeting from Kenya in London, of the time, either on leave or attending some functions, we may consult him from time to time if it is necessary."

Mr. Kawawa said "Why do you think that two parties is necessary? It is a question of 'one party' system. If it is the wish of the people to have a one-party system, it is democratic."

He added that in Tanganyika there would be freedom with the party for criticism, but within that one-party system discipline which "we had been imposing" on the "people."

Mr. Obote and Mr. Kawawa spent yesterday together at Entebbe. They are due to leave for London today.

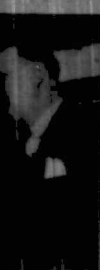

The Brewing Industry in Kenya wish to bring the following to the public's notice in view of the possible hardship to consumers if the strike lasts, and also in view of allegations by the union that offers made in recent negotiations have been misrepresented.

The facts are as follows:-

Offers were made for entry points for the lowest grade unskilled workers as under:-

- Offer (a) 220/- per month with share of profits (about 2% per month in this grade) plus annual increments of 10/-.
- Offer (b) 245/- per month, no bonus or share of profits, but an annual increment of 10/-.
- Offer (c) annual increments to disappear, but share of profits to remain, plus an increase of 25/- to all in this grade.

Proportionately higher increases were made to higher grade personnel.

These offers were in addition to:-

- (1) 30 days' paid leave per annum;
- (2) Leave-Travel Allowance;
- (3) Sick leave of three months on full pay followed by three months on half pay;
- (4) Provident Fund;
- (5) Long Service Gratuity;
- and many other benefits to all employees.

These offers come on top of very fair treatment in the last few years. For instance, an unskilled worker employed on shifting beer cases, who joined the Company on 1st January, 1958, received then a wage including housing element of 145/-.

On 1st July, 1959, this was increased to 205/- (including share of profits and housing element).

- On 1st January, 1960—received 10/- increment to 215/-.
- On 1st September, 1960—received increase to 230/-.
- On 1st January, 1961—received 10/- increment to 240/-.
- On 1st January, 1962—received increase of 30/- to 270/-.
- Also on 1st January, 1962—received increment of 10/- to 280/-.
- 1st January, 1963, under offer A will receive 290/-.
- Also on 1st January, 1963, would receive 10/- increment to 300/-.

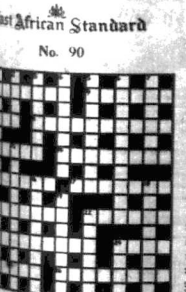
We apologise to the public sincerely for interruption of beer supply, but we feel that the public will agree with our decision to stand firm, because if we accede to unreasonable demands in face of strike threats we are liable to be exploited to a stage where the public are faced with pay unreasonable prices for beer.

In periods of prosperity in the industry we pay, for the good of the public as a whole, large sums in income tax, company tax, corporation tax, excise duty, etc, but we do not see why the workers in other industries and the general public should be penalised in the price which they have to pay for their glass of beer to inflate to unreasonable proportions the demands of persons who by chance are employed in the beer industry.

It will be clear that, as a prosperous industry at the present time, we are prepared to lead in terms and conditions of service, and we have clearly demonstrated this, but we hope that the public generally, and beer consumers of all races, will agree with our standing firm to keep these within reasonable limits.

LONDON TALKS START TODAY

Mr. Sandys may touch on N.F.D. question

A series of meetings between the Uganda Prime Minister, Tanganyika's Vice-President, Mr. Kawawa, and the British Secretary of State, Mr. Macmillan, is to take place in London today.

At London Airport yesterday Mr. Ochei, speaking both for Uganda and Tanganyika, restated the argument familiar in East Africa—that the whole political and economic development of East Africa was being held up by Kenya.

In praise for Kenya's early independence, Mr. Ochei said: "I want to tell Mr. Macmillan that if the British Government should begin to doubt the sincerity of the Ugandans and Tanganyikans, it would be accused of meddling in their affairs."

On the economic side, Mr. Ochei emphasized that British income control in Nairobi was hurting trade in East Africa and Kenya achieved independence. It was, however, necessary to say that the British Government was affected or that they had no right to interfere. The Uganda Premier hinted that he was going to press Mr. Macmillan on an election date for Kenya.

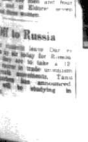

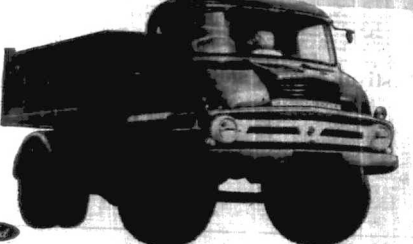

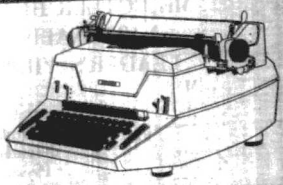

The communiqué issued in London after the two-day talks on East African problems disclosed that after his visit to Kenya the Commonwealth and Colonial Secretary will go on to Uganda and Tanganyika. There is still no definite date for Mr. Sandys' visit, which is expected to be in the middle of this month.

The British Prime Minister, Mr. Harold Wilson, took a working party to the talks with Mr. Kawawa and Mr. Obote, and the communiqué noted the East African leaders that the British Government recognised their countries' "legitimate interest in developments in Kenya".

It made no mention, however, of a date for either the British elections or internal self-government.

The communiqué said: "The Commonwealth Secretariat made it clear to the two Ministers that the British Government was as keen as they to expedite as much as possible the holding of elections in Kenya. He discussed with them the details of the programme for the new Constitution and the further electoral provisions which were contained in the draft."

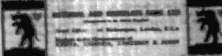

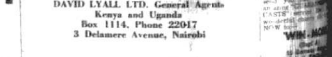

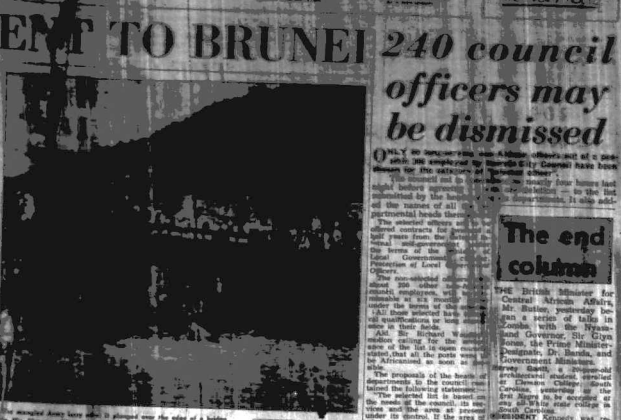

No hope of a home for 7,000 in Kambaa

There are an estimated 7,000 to 8,000 squatters on an unsheltered home-made camp in Kambaa and at the moment there is no hope of housing them. The estimate was disclosed yesterday by the City Engineer and Surveyor, Mr. J. Mullins. "To house these people we would have to build about 1,500 houses. We just don't have the money," he said.

The Kambaa Council estate went between the Government and the Council for about £700,000 — and the Council had nothing to show for it. The Government has paid a proper deposit and £130,000 for the estate and all of that £130,000 will be used in building houses which are falling down.

Falling to ground

The Council has over the three African branches of Kambaa, Nguru and Kiwa from the Government for up to 250 of the houses on the estate on a long-term basis. Council officers, 112 were found to be in a state of disrepair and had to be demolished while they were still in the ground.

Some of them were literally falling to the ground, and others were in such a state of decay that they had to be pulled down. It is estimated that about 100 houses will be demolished and the remainder will be repaired.

Three days' celebrations

He was accompanied by his Ministers and a large number of guests. The ceremony was held in the presence of the Governor, Sir Glynn Jones, and a large number of guests.

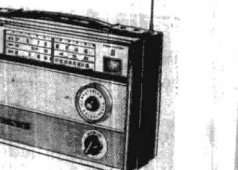
