138 'black list' arrests

HUNDREDS of Tanganyika Police joined in large-scale operations at dawn yesterday in an effort to curb the growing Mau Mau movement among Kikuyu in the Northern Province. £100,000,000 IN DEVELOPMENT FUNDS

IN its relationship with the Colonies the British Government lends long and borrows short. This is a process which is usually held to be financially un sound, but is justified in the present circumstances by the position of Authority which Britain still holds over the Colonial finances. It is true to say that the quick obligations piled up to the credit of the Colonies are not the result of any deliberate policy, but are the result of the actual use of the Colonial sterling balances which are accumulated as a result of investments in Britain, and the consequent expansion of the Colonies.

By the end of 1932 the balance reached £73,000,000, an increase of more than 50 per cent. in three years. It had provided long-term investments in the Colonies by Britain and other countries to the amount of £140,000,000.

The Secretary of State for the Colonies has said that the Colonial Government's expenditure in the year ending March 31, 1933, was £121,000,000, an increase of 20 per cent. on the £100,000,000 of the year ending March 31, 1932.

THE Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh are to spend three days in Uganda during the Royal Tour of the Commonwealth. Highlight of the occasion will be the inauguration of the Owen Falls hydro-electric scheme at Jinja by the

Queen during the afternoon of April 29. The Queen will preside over the laying of the foundation stone and the Duke will open to the public the greater part of the dam and its surrounding area. During the Royal visit the Majesty is to hold an investiture at Entebbe, including the presentation of commemorative medals to the Chiefs who are to present a colour to the 4th (Uganda) Battalion The King's African Rifles at a ceremonial parade in Kampala and visit Makerere College and the Cathedral of Namirembe.

When Her Majesty inaugurates the Owen Falls Project at Jinja, the great occasion will mark the re-inauguration of an inspiring prophetic remark made by Winston Churchill nearly half a century ago. It would be perfectly easy to say, when he visited Uganda as Under-Secretary for the Colonies in 1907, "I harness the whole river and let the Nile begin its beneficent journey to the sea by flowing through a turbine. It is possible that somewhere else in the world could be constructed a mass of water be harnessed up by so little machinery. The £22,000,000 Owen Falls scheme will generate 150,000 kW of electricity for East Africa's growing industries and provide water at the site for the hard-pressed agriculture of Egypt. Vast as

the project is, it is only one of several progressive measures which will benefit the five and a quarter million people of this prosperous British Protectorate. The country's communications are a vital factor in this development. The 1,000-mile-long line of East Africa and the extended Imperial year by year. An international port in the Great Lakes has been a major objective for some time. The most recent scheme is the proposed railway which has a terminus at Kampala, a mile from westwards to the "Ruwenzori" fabulous Mountains of the Moon—so potentially rich in coal and copper deposits.

of prosperity the great industrial achievements that will follow the inauguration of the Owen Falls hydro-electric scheme, and one can visualize the wealthy future that lies before the land of endless variety served on a lofty plateau outside the Equator, where over 5,000,000

Africans, peasant farmers of many tribes and many languages, 48,000 Asians and 5,000 Europeans live in harmony and happiness. To all these peoples, then, the visit of Her Majesty and the Duke of Edinburgh will be a symbol of greatest happiness and prosperity to come.



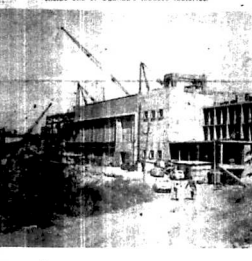

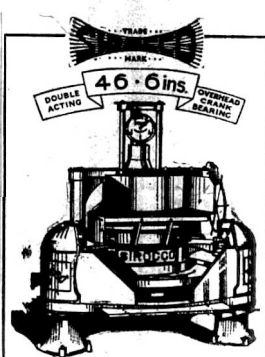

BURNS and scalds are among the most common of kitchen accidents yet we rarely take any serious precautions to avoid them, usually they are considered as necessary evils so we grin and bear them. But it only requires a little time to eliminate many annoying sources of burnt fingers.

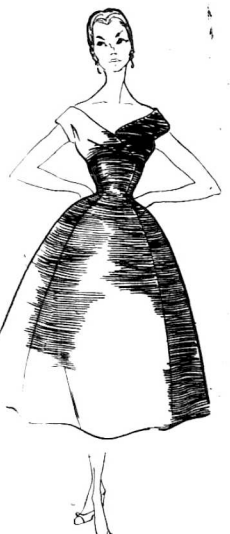
Elizabeth and I went today to look at a teenage department—Fulton and Mason's—and there we found that the process dress and the cupola skirt are top sellers at the moment.

First African Radiographers Train In Kenya

BY ALASTAIR MATHESON.

THE arrow-head showed up clearly in the X-ray plate. Another fraction of an inch and the victim would have died from a pierced wind-pipe.

Here was an aneurysm. One of the marvels of modern science used against one of the African's oldest weapons — an arrow shot into the neck of an African, caught red-handed by a fellow tribesman while stealing a pig.

And handling the X-ray plate, along with racks of others in the Kitumo Hospital, was yet another of the same tribe from South Nyanza — one of the first Africans in East Africa to train as a radiographer.

They have received their training in the modern radiography of some of Kenya's other hospitals, eventually operating X-ray equipment on their own. They have already gained experience in the up-to-date X-ray Department of the modern Kitumo General Hospital in Nairobi.

Kenya, by training these Africans in the complicated art of radiography, with its attendant knowledge of electricity and mathematics, has proved that it can be done. All the first trainees come from African secondary schools.

The trainees for the next course are already assembling in Kitumo and in this second course some Africans from Tanganyika will be studying alongside the Kenyan students.
