**HEROES OF TRAIN WRECK**

THE Sultan of Tonggama in Malaya has awarded Gold Medals to four New Zealanders who were heroes in the railway disaster of the Wellington-Auckland express near Tangiari on Christmas Eve.

The awards are to Arthur Cyril Ellis, 27-year-old postmaster, and Mr. John Wren Holman. Two others, Mr. William Ian Inglis, the train's guard, and Mr. Arthur Dewar Bell, were awarded the British Empire Medal for their courageous actions after the train plunged from a broken bridge into a flooded river.

Mr. Ellis made a dramatic attempt to stop the train a few minutes before it crashed. His saw damaged length of track and tried to signal the driver, who, however, failed to see him.

**UNION PLANS NEW MOVES**

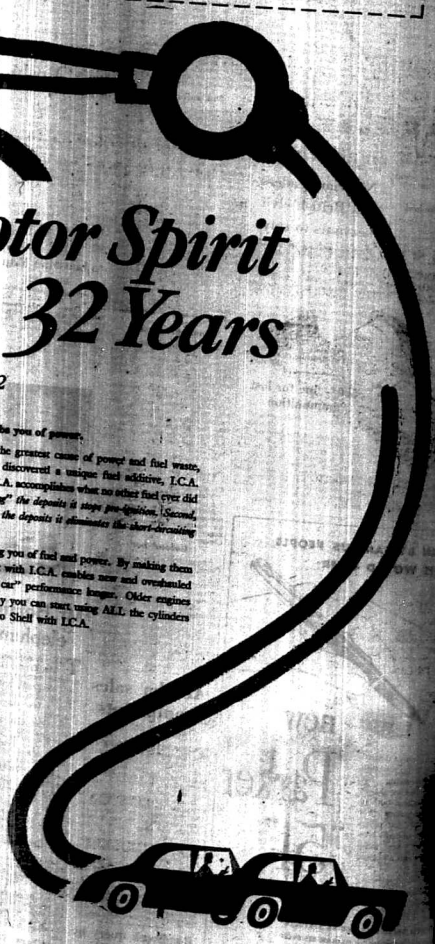

BRITISH 5-POINT PLAN FOR GERMANY

Mr. Molotov said to be encouraging PROPOSALS BY SOVIET

FRANCE and the United States endorsed Britain's five-point plan for uniting Germany when the Big-Four Foreign Ministers resumed their conference in Berlin for the sixth session. The Soviet Union did not reject the plan, but said it would put forward its own proposals later.

One diplomatic correspondent said Mr. Molotov gave the clearest indication that he would reject the part of the British plan which proposed free German elections under strict supervision to guarantee a fair vote. A statement issued to the session, the correspondent added, was the warmest of British Foreign Office support for Mr. Molotov's remarks. He described them as "encouraging" and the "Four-Power debate as 'serious and conciliatory'."

French official circles in Berlin interpreted the British comments sceptically. They suggested the Soviet Minister would next week put forward proposals that would nullify the British plan. The main feature of the plan which was put forward by Mr. Molotov was that:

- Five elections throughout Germany.
The convocation of a National Assembly, resulting from these elections.
The drafting of a Constitution and the preparation of laws to regulate the constitution.
The adoption of the Constitution and the formation of an all-German Government responsible for the regulation of the peace treaty.

The signature and entry into force of the peace treaty.

## SAVINGS CERTIFICATES AS WAY TO RAISE CAPITAL

### Proposal in Dar es Salaam Chamber

**A** COMBINATION of factors had made 1955 a difficult trading year, and to some extent the country's credit position in its retiring president's address at the annual meeting of Dar es Salaam Chamber of Commerce.
