#### Last Day for Entries June 10

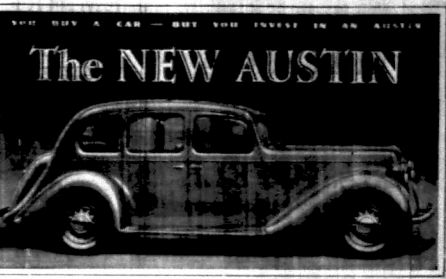

**NAIROBI LIVING COSTS GO UP AS WORLD COMMODITY PRICES RISE**

**Africans Also Affected**

The cost of living in Nairobi has gone up considerably during the past six months. The increase in world commodity prices is the main cause, having its effect on almost all branches of household expenditure. Town Africans have to meet higher prices for accommodation and food, so that Native wages are also considered likely to increase.

**Traders' New Minimum**

The increase in the cost of most goods, has almost without exception, been affected by the world's commodity prices. The East African Traders' Association has recently issued a new schedule of minimum prices to be observed by its members in the future. This revised tariff, which contains a 10 per cent increase of 14 per cent in the cost of general foodstuffs and 40 to 60 per cent in the prices of hardware, has been introduced for two months. It is a general tariff which does not take into account the fact that many goods have been imported at prices below the tariff. It is also issued because of the considerable increase in the prices of goods from the coast and the interior of Kenya. The price of hardware is closely connected with that of foodstuffs and groceries, and is the principal cause of the increase in the cost of living. AIR MAIL AT 20 CENTS PER HALF OUNCE

NEW RATES AS FROM NEXT MONTH

Post Office Give Details

From July 1, letters for Great Britain and Northern Ireland and many territories on the English-South African air route, will be carried by air for a charge of 20 cents per half ounce. No air mail label will be necessary.

Other Empire countries will come into the reduced postage scheme as the new flying services develop.

Internal mail in Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika will be carried by air at 10 cents an ounce (letters) and 10 cents for postcards.

Internal Reductions

The Postmaster General announces that, with the inauguration of the English-South African flying route, the Empire Airmail Service on July 1, the following reduced rates of postage will apply for first class mail: Letters and postcards posted in Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika will be transmitted by air to the participating countries at 10 cents an ounce for letters and 10 cents for postcards.

Internal Reductions

As mail parcel post will be discontinued pending further notification, but such items may be accepted as first class mail, prepaid at letter rates subject to the maximum weight of 4 lb. The existing maximum mail parcel rates remain unaltered. Registered correspondence may be transmitted by air at an additional fee of 20 cents 30 above the normal postage rate. Insured (except insured letters) may also now be sent by air, but the maximum fee for subject to the charges and conditions laid down in the regulations. As the "airmail" Empire Airmail Service develops, and it is anticipated that Empire countries will participate in the reduced postage scheme. Further details in this respect will be notified from time to time. The countries after this specified above, the existing rates of postage will apply to both air and surface mail.

Parcel Post

Postal articles other than letters and postcards will be subject to existing rates of postage and will be conveyed by surface route, unless provided at letter rates.

Germany and Italy have now both replied to the British proposals for fulfilling the "safety zone" conditions under which alone they declared that they would return to co-operation with the Non-Intervention Committee in the Spanish coast patrol scheme.

Substantially, the replies are the same, both agreeing, it is understood, to the "safety zones" principle, but both insisting that the proposal for international consultation in the event of another violation of the zones is unworkable.

# HOW UNION MEETS NATIVE PROBLEM

## "TRUSTEESHIP PRINCIPLE ACCEPTED"

### Commissioner's Address

#### SOUTH AFRICA SPENDS MOST MONEY ON AFRICAN DEVELOPMENT

The new legislation was a national acceptance of the principle of trusteeship, as opposed to common citizenship, stated Colonel R. B. Turner, Commissioner for the Union of South Africa, when he addressed the Nairobi Rotary Club.

Native development, said Colonel Turner, was progressing in the Union, which was spending more money on the development of Native reserves than all the rest of British Africa together. The same was true of Native education, as of agriculture.

#### Common Citizenship Rejected

In an address to the Rotary Club of Nairobi on Friday last, Colonel R. B. Turner, Commissioner for the Union of South Africa, gave a review of the "Problem of the Native in South Africa." While the problem had presented great difficulties to the Union over a long period, Col. Turner said that it was welcomed the opportunity of developing different concepts regarding South Africa's present day policy towards the 60 million people who live in the area. He said that the idea of the great change that had come over the whole South African problem in recent years and how the Union was, to "deal fairly" with the "Native" in the rest of British Africa. 

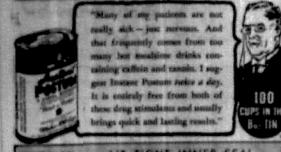

## Kenya's Bad Roads

CONDITIONS IN THE LAKE PROVINCE

To the Editor, "E. A. Standard."

Sir,—Much has been written in your esteemed journal in connection with the bad roads in Kenya and the application of a road policy in this country.

The road problem in this Province is greatly exacerbating the minds of the residents, miners, farmers, and cotton growers alike.

1. Kiunga-Kilgori road, which is the worst road, remains impassable.
2. The road to the salt mining area, No. 8, is impassable with great difficulty.
3. The road to the Uganda border via Yala and Naikani remains impassable.
4. The road to Kitui (South Kavirondo District) is impassable.

As a matter of fact in respect of road communication Kitui (South Kavirondo District) is cut off from the rest of the Province. This reminds us of the old days when the only way to visit that district was to travel on a Lake steamer via Rendu Bay.

During this week I had occasion to visit the Kitui region. Owing to the impassable state of the road I had to ship my car to Mendis Bay and travelled on the S. T. Ferry Anderson, the oldest tug on Lake Victoria. It greatly amused me when hearing the ship, because 29 years ago during the Kaiti Expedition in 1898 when I first visited that district I travelled on the same tug to Kuechaya and I have had to take the same route again after 29 years.

This shows that Nyasa Province is the worst off in regard to the road system. The Government should sanction a substantial sum in the annual Budget for the roads in this Province.

## WHITE STORKS: A MIGRATION INQUIRY

To the Editor, "E. A. Standard."

Sir—As a corresponding member of the German Ornithological Society I have received a circular letter from you who had been forwarded to me from East Prussia, which will perhaps achieve its object better if you will be good enough to give its contents publicity in your columns.

In each of the last three years the number of White Storks breeding in East Prussia has been about 30,000 birds. This species is exceptionally rare in East Africa, but it can be accepted as reliable. All the birds have their breeding grounds in streams, whether in Africa and an usually back in Prussia in the beginning of April. This year by the end of the month, when no more could be expected, only 12,000 had arrived. Over 20,000 storks from that province alone were therefore dead, diverted from their usual course or delayed somewhere on their journey.

The enquiry is of special interest to East Africa, because we know from the recovery of eggs that these Prussian birds regularly travel this way.

## Anonymous Letters Case at Nakuru

### Details of Detective Work

### MARKED ENVELOPES

(“STANDARD” CORRESPONDENT)

Nakuru, June 6.  
Summary proceedings opened in the Resident Magistrate's Court before Mr. B. P. Palatnikov, J.P., this morning in the case of Mary Kate Bates.

Mr. Neil Steiner, Crown Prosecutor, opened proceedings by stating that anonymous letters started on October 16 last year, and in all some 400 letters had been sent. They had caused a tremendous sensation in Nakuru, and had been a source of worry to the majority of those living in Nakuru. Between October 16 and January 1 this year there were 30 letters posted. Of these 10 letters had been sent. On May 21 letters had been sent. In which passed the post. Of those 10 letters, three were being produced in connection with the three charges in this case.

### Secret Marking

The first letter passed through the post office at Nakuru, and was addressed to Mr. Allan Bates. It was checked by Mr. Vincent Superintendent of Police who rightly told him it was marked and had it was stamped by two postal clerks, when it was addressed to Mr. Bates through the post office a notice through the post office, with the name of the Postmaster General. As this was the only letter posted there, there was no possibility of doubt about it or its contents.

In reply to the second charge a letter posted on May 21, this letter was stamped into the post office was sent three letters and one package addressed to Miss Margaret Bates. Evidence showed that the package addressed to the child had been re-addressed by Mrs. Bates. They were all dropped into the box together.

### Peculiar Address

The third charge refers to a letter posted on June 1. In this letter peculiarities have been taken in the post office between the date of the letter postage, and we can bring evidence to show that Mr. Bates' car was seen to arrive, and Mr. Bates entered the post office and left, then Mrs. Bates entered, made up two postbags, and then sent two letters. We can prove these two witnesses who are for actually posting these letters and a witness who sought them as they posted on.

### Distinctive Perfume

The first witness was Superintendent Vincent of the Nakuru Police who said that a large number of the letters carried a definite perfume. Asked by the Prosecutor whether he had come across that

perfume before the Superintendent had the papers that he had received on the person of Mrs. Bates. The Magistrate asked the Superintendent what perfume it was that the latter was unable to identify the perfume of the search and was unable to say that it might be a mixture of perfume and sand.

Continuing his story Superintendent Vincent told him on May 10 he was called to the Nakuru Post Office where the Postmaster General had him an unopened letter addressed to Mrs. Ellen Bates. The Postmaster told him that the letter was marked and that he had again recognized the perfume. He recognized the letter as one of the letters written by the person known to him by the name of Mrs. Palatnikov. The perfume was identical.

The witness went on to say that he marked the envelope in pink on the eye of the King's head, with a stamp with a pin and by marking it in certain places in pencil. These identification marks were still present on the envelope which had been produced in court. He had taken these precautions because he had included the letter back to the post office because he was not sure whether the letter was or was not eventually handed over to the post office.

### Post Box Watched

Summary proceedings opened in the Resident Magistrate's Court before Mr. B. F. Painebope yesterday morning in the case of Mary Koor Bales.

### Anonymous Letters Case at Nakuru

(Continued from page 1)

Postmaster General to inspect the letters. He asked that the Post Office be searched for any letters bearing the initials of the person and he was accordingly advised that the two C.I.D. men knew the suspect.

The second witness was Sub-Postmaster H. J. M. Bates, employed at Nakuru. He gave evidence that Mr. H. W. Warren had come to the Post Office and posted a letter addressed to himself which he identified in Court. The witness sitting on instruction thought the letter in Mr. Bates' hand as it fell from the Post Box chair.

On May 25, Mr. Bates was taken to the Post Office where his mail was delivered by him. The witness remembered by addressing one small parcel on inquiring about the strange incident it had been made indistinguishable to the Nairobi C.I.D. men.

The witness Bates said he had the name Bates on it. He also remembered seeing it on a letter in "junkie cylinders" with the name P. H. Warren on them. Another Indian witness J. C. Singh, who was present at Nakuru, gave evidence on a visit to the Post Office made by the C.I.D. men on May 19, when she brought Commission charges and asked them to see Air Mail letter, which she posted together with something else. After that, she gave the previous witness (Mrs. Bates) a letter addressed to Mrs. Bates. The same witness gave evidence of the further Post Office transactions including the posting of letters by Mrs. Bates on June 1. He was shown afterwards by one of the C.I.D. men two letters, one of which was addressed to Mrs. Greenwood.

#### Postmaster's Evidence

The Postmaster of Nakuru, Albert Ernest Cough, gave corroborative evidence regarding the action taken in the Post Office and his transactions with the Police. He recognized the envelope addressed to Mrs. Bates. He also identified two other letters handed to him by his staff, one addressed to Mrs. Greenwood and the other to Miss J. Hopkins.

At the end of the Postmaster's evidence, a question was asked by Mr. W. Allen, the Counsel for the defence. He requested whether postal clerks and Post Office staff were ordered to inspect by the Postmaster (General). The Postmaster replied that the Post Office staff were not ordered to inspect mail and which is supposed to be the duty of the Post Office staff. In reply to the question the Postmaster said that the Nakuru staff confirmed that they were not ordered to inspect mail. Further evidence regarding Post Office action was given by Albert Baker, a supervisor at Nakuru, who gave evidence of the Post Office staff. He identified in Court the letter addressed to Mrs. Greenwood.

#### The Case was resumed

Monday when the first witness called was Miss Iris May Meredith, Nursing Sister at the Nakuru War Memorial Hospital. She told the Court how she had seen, and witness to Mrs. Bates on June 1.

She was asked to identify the envelope and the letter which she identified in Court. She gave evidence that the letter was addressed to Mrs. Bates and was found in the Post Office on June 1.

The case was resumed on Monday when the first witness called was Miss Iris May Meredith, Nursing Sister at the Nakuru War Memorial Hospital. She told the Court how she had seen, and witness to Mrs. Bates on June 1.

#### Shop Accounts

The story was then taken up by Miss Mathie Rosemary, who testified in her father's shop at Nakuru. She said that she had written out the state of account addressed to P. H. Warren and another for Mrs. Watson Cowling, both accounts would be left together with a copy in the shop to be given out following her evidence. Miss War said that Mrs. Bates was a customer and often came into the shop.

Mrs. Mathie Mary Warner, mother of the person witness told the Court that her daughter had given her the letter addressed to Mrs. Henson and returned by the Post Office. She pointed out that it had no address, but thought it was hers about it was sent her brother to post the account of sister Mrs. Henson and she was quite certain that she had two things in on this occasion, one was usual for her to post a 10 cent stamp for an account. She pointed out the Superintendent's evidence regarding the account addressed to Mr. Henson which she said she was found to contain six anonymous letters.

#### G.I.D. Watcher

At this point the Court adjourned to the Post Office to see how the various officers went about when the hearing was held.

At the point the Crown Prosecutor said there would be no further need in giving the names of the persons to whom the letters were sent on May 22 as they were addressed and he suggested that the names should be withheld in order to keep the hearing simple and that the fourth letter was addressed to Mrs. K.

The witness went on to explain how later in the same envelope the names were marked and that the letter was open and contained a receipt from Messrs. Dunn, Hemby and Co. Mr. Witness examined the letter again in Court and remarked on the fact that it now had pencil and carbon marks on it which were not there before.

#### Deliveries Suspended

The Court resumed in the afternoon when for the defence Mr. Allen submitted that there was no case to answer as even if the evidence were allowed to stand there was no suggestion that a letter was received having therein contents of a scurrilous indecent and obscene nature and that he mentioned it was the only memorandum received under Section 93 of the 1946 Post Office Ordinance. He concluded that this ordinance was clearly found to prevent indecent literature from being sent to the public.

The Crown Prosecutor, Mr. Neil Sheworth contended that the ordinance was perfectly clear and related to "any letter having obscene content or indecent and abusive nature." He thought the Magistrate would be satisfied that the letters concerned did contain words of that nature and that the Postmaster General having knowledge that letters of this description were being sent thereby and would be perfectly within his rights under this section in instructing the Post Office which he did not hold up the letters and open them. The Magistrate said he would give a ruling on Thursday morning and the hearing was adjourned.

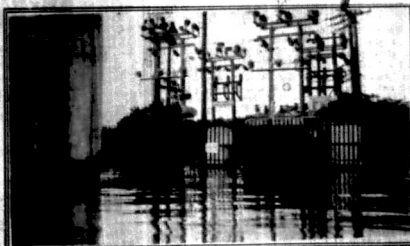

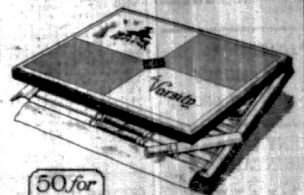
