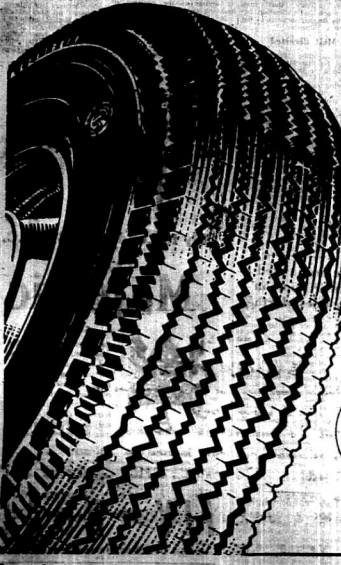

WESTERN REBUKE ON SOVIET ATTACKS Kremlin campaign in Asia deplored ATTACK ON PRESIDENT SURPRISES U.S.

WESTERN diplomats and newspapers reacted sharply yesterday to the bitter attack made by the Russian Communist Party Secretary, Mr. Krushchev, in the British press in Asia. In London, the speeches of Mr. Krushchev and the Soviet Premier, Marshal Bulganin, to the Russian parliament were considered further shots in the Kremlin campaign against anti-Western feeling throughout Asia. These latest attacks are expected to reinforce efforts made by some political and Trade quarters in London to speed the visit of the two Russian leaders to Britain.

Mr. Krushchev's charges that Britain had "robbed" China of her natural resources, famine and ignorance were sharply resented because Britain is proud of its part in independence in Asia in 1947.

Mr. Krushchev's view that 1955 marked a turning-point in the realization of world socialism was not shared. Officials maintained that the Soviet leaders had themselves deliberately prevented translation of the "Soviet spirit" into greater East-West cooperation by the opening of new cold war fronts in Asia and the Middle East.

The Foreign Office declined official comment on a spokesman's remarks that the Prime Minister's description of the Kremlin's attack as "a deliberate and calculated attempt to stir up anti-Western feeling" was "in the nature of a provocation".

U.S. reveals more Yalta documents STAIN LETTER TO MR. HOSSBEIL

The United States has made public more documents relating to the Yalta conference in 1945, which decided the post-war partnership between the United States and the Soviet Union. The documents were made available to the press by Mr. Hoover.

POLITICAL PURGE IN PERSIA Muslim terrorists for trial

LEADERS of Persia's Federal Islam Organisation, the first Muslim group which has organised political life in the country for ten years, are on trial at the present time. Five of them were arrested after the attempt on the life of the Prime Minister, Muzaffar Khatami, in November.

Several military tribunals in Persia have sentenced 150 persons to various terms of imprisonment. The charges against them are terrorism, murder, and the assassination of the Prime Minister.

Among those in custody are: Ali Shari'ati, who tried to shoot the Prime Minister; Ghassem Sabzevari, who tried to shoot the Prime Minister; and several other leaders of the Islamic movement.

The Islamic movement in Persia has been active since the death of the Shah in 1951. It has been accused of terrorism and of being a threat to the stability of the country.

Foreign links

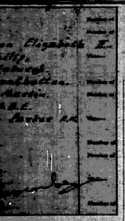
