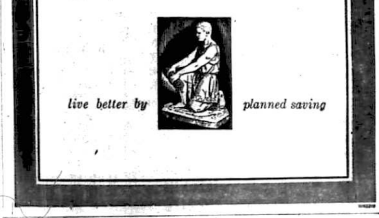



LISAIR Ian Malcolm Matheson (43), the Kenya Government Press Officer, yesterday appeared in a Nairobi magistrate's court charged under the Official Secrets Act with failing to take reasonable care of 43 official documents.

The four charges read over to Matheson by the Senior Resident Magistrate, Mr. E. Trevelyan, involve two Cabinet Office letters, a copy of a telegram from the Government of Kenya, two sets of confidential minutes, two memorandum references and 38 other confidential documents.

The charges are that the documents were questioned during various periods between June 19 1959 and April 15 1961.

Matheson was not required to plead and throughout the proceedings he sat in the dock wearing a hat in the face of a newspaper photographer.

After a preliminary appearance to Mr. J. B. Webber, who acted for the defendant, the charges were read to him.

Matheson was released on bail for the 14-day adjournment. He will be brought back to court on August 14.

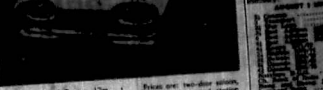

Food and shelter for under-nourished children

Every day, under-nourished African children from all over South Africa are taken to the City Council administration building to receive a ration of milk — distributed under the council's free milk scheme.

Some months ago, Councillor Mrs. Doris Clarke, speaking for the African children in the City, urged the council to make free milk for children who needed it. The council agreed, and various voluntary organisations offered to help with the distribution, including the Kenya Dairy Board's Nutrition Committee (of which Mrs. Clarke is deputy chairman) has undertaken to administer the scheme.

The free milk distribution has now been operating for some time, and children come to the scheme by their daily rations.

It is hoped that more children will register, so that more can be supplied, reducing the distance that some children have to travel.

Children who are seen to be

in need of extra food, by a welfare worker or doctor at a voluntary welfare centre, are sent to their nearest health clinic, and made suitable for use, then sent to one of the 150 collection points every day.

Best feed

Medical bills was chosen as a suitable food in this scheme, medical experts agree that it is the best food for children, containing a high percentage of strengthening full cream milk, with the fat content raised to 15 per cent.

On ensuring that some children had been registered for this scheme, several leading Ministers of African Affairs were asked for their views.

Nairobi, Kenya, said that it should be given priority.

"These kids need all the help we can give," he said.

Ald. Charles Butta said that the scheme was very important and should continue, "at all reasonable times".

On the other hand, Mr. J. M. Kinyari, extending the City Council's services to more, more and the supply.

Malnutrition can take two forms. It may be acute, and usually very thin with general wasting of flesh and a weak, listless or it appears very fat. This appearance can be very misleading especially in the ordinary run of life, but a result of overeating but little of water retention in the body.

In both forms the skin becomes distorted and green, the child's hair loses its lustre and turns a pishish colour.

Coloured mugs

Many voluntary organisations are helping with the distribution, while Kenya Co-operative Creameries has arranged for the transport of the refrigerated cans.

The Kenya Dairy Board administers the scheme, and has also donated the free milk mugs from which the children draw their milk.

Some children still turn up at the centres without their cans, as there seems to be some confusion in the parents' minds as to the scheme's operation.

Children's clubs have been recommended to be issued with a card, but is not able to have the milk under the scheme.
