Pedal stuck—but the show went on

It happened in the middle of the *Moonlight Sonata*—the pedal stuck on the £1,500 concert grand.

At the keyboard at the world-famous pianist, Peter Katin, in front of him in the Kenya National Theatre, Nairobi, sat a packed audience of business and socialites.

With the sticking pedal emitting his melodic notes, he played gallantly on until the interval.

Wanted—A tuner

During the interval, the concert manager, Mr. David Behrnt, drove into Nairobi to look for the piano tuner.

The tuner, who was not to be found, arrived. But the show had to go on.

Undismayed, Mr. Katin turned to worried stagehands and said: "If you get me a screwdriver I'll try and fix it myself."

A screwdriver was brought and as the audience slipped their drinks in the foyer the pianist got down on his hands and knees to remove the keyboard.

He used the screwdriver to take out the keyboard and adjusted the dampers operated by the fallboard.

When the curtain rose the piano was in the programme—only a few moments later a malfunction of the piano and the audience and told them.

Wrong notes
Afterwards, in his dressing room he said smilingly: "It has happened to me before, but I was lucky enough to have a tuner around. It's just one of those things."

The piano was given to the National Theatre nine years ago and has been played by Julius Kachon, Paul Barakat, Shokla, Daniel Wanyenger and Ger Kerner.

The assistant manager, Mr. Ewart Morris, commented: "The trouble is that it isn't used enough."

The United States presenter launched the piano as the space ship *Ranger 1*—a major step in carrying the Olympic flag to the moon.

DR. JAGAN SWEEPS TO POWER

DR. CHIEHDI JAGAN, leader of the first Guiana's first internal self-government election, Georgetown in triumph yesterday to become the first Premier of British Guiana.

WEST DEPLOYS TROOPS IN BERLIN

BRITISH, French and American troops were deployed in West Berlin yesterday to "ensure the integrity of the sector border" with East Berlin following tighter border controls announced by the East German Interior Ministry.

A spokesman said the deployment was ordered by the three Western commandants in the city. The British force consists of "C" Company of the King's Royal Rifle Corps, the Green Jackets—who moved up to the Brandenburg Gate, the main crossing point between the two sectors. The U.S. Army sent several armoured vehicles and tanks to the border, according to an American spokesman.

Headquarters of the British force were set up on the Platz der Republik after the British troops moved into the city.

Early hundreds of West Berliners, some of them wearing East German uniforms, were seen at the border.

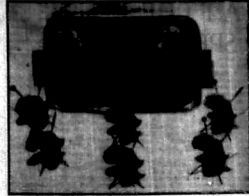
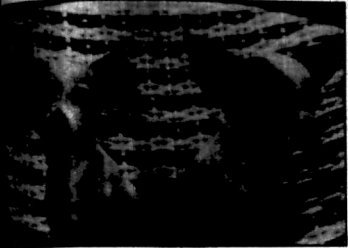

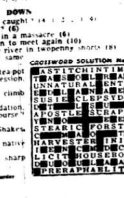

He held a Press conference where he said the United Nations wanted to get rid of the Katanga Government by force, and that the U.N. was 'in the main doing the work of the Congo'.
