

CONSTITUTIONAL talks opened in Nairobi yesterday under the chairmanship of the Governor of Kenya, Sir Patrick Renison. # Shoe worn fills great need

By SUSAN DOZZEL

In a place like East Africa where a new pair of shoes is as much of a status symbol as the latest model car is in other parts of the world, the shoe factory is an event of great significance. This is especially so when it is a factory that has been almost entirely for the shoe requirements of the lower income groups - people who have very little money to pay for them when the price of food and rent and other basic necessities have been high.

It is estimated that there are 26 per cent of the population in the East African States who are shoeless. The shoe factory in East Africa still goes hand-in-hand with the need for cheap but lasting shoes, therefore, the shoe factories are good for the factory of the National Shoe Company which will be opened officially early in December. The factory that Tanganyika became independent.

### 6,000 A DAY

Production began, however, ultimately it will reach 6,000 pairs a day. The factory is located on the main arteries of the Nairobi Industrial Area, but the controlling families have interests stretching all over East Africa. Plans for the National Shoe Company began about three years ago. They were first stimulated by the Aga Khan, who has been in East Africa for many years, and the remainder of the management is from Denmark and Germany.

### BOOT POLISH

The production manager is Mr. James Berg who arrived in Kenya in February on a semi-permanent basis. He is impressed by the speed with which some of the African shoe operators have acquired their skills and thinks there are just as good a number of them as American operators of which he has experience.

At present the factory employs three Europeans, ten Asians and 120 Africans. When employment production is reached the total number will rise to 250. Part of this labour force will be making Kileleshwa shoes under the supervision of European technicians in an extension to the factory which is not yet completed. It has 13 plants already established in various parts of the world. The factory is making canvas, rubber, leather, and plastic shoes. Even the manufacture of an ordinary canvas shoe is a very complicated and organized process. A great deal of machinery is required for the basic rubber, and great care and carefully weighed proportions. Everything is done through a making machine.

Several times a month it becomes a common sight to see a small group of men, some of whom are young, gathered around a table. They are engaged in a discussion about the future of the shoe industry in East Africa. The group is made up of a few of the leading shoe operators in the country, and they are meeting to discuss the various problems that are facing the industry. The group is known as the 'Small Group with Bright Future'.

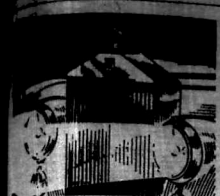

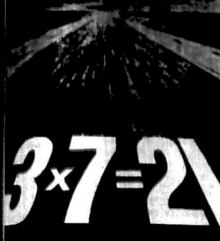

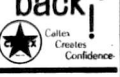
