# Reds lose grip on E.T.U.

## ELECTION DEFEAT CLAIM

LEADERS of the non-Communist group in the E.T.U. have claimed a victory in the election held on the 21st of September.

They based the claim on an unofficial assessment of votes cast in the national-wide election.

The official figures will not be announced until early in November.

The present executive committee, which stays in office until January, consists of eight Communists or Communist supporters, and three non-Communists.

Twice expelled

Last week the national executive of the Labour Party decided to expel the group from the party on the ground that the party's programme and therefore constitution "cannot" be applied to the E.T.U. as it is not a trade union.

A month ago the E.T.U. was expelled from the Trades Union Congress because it had been found to be a Communist front.

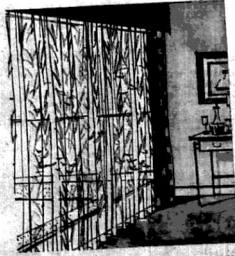

He strongly favored the direct election of Uganda members to a Uganda National Assembly. But conference delegates reported that the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Macleod, and the Baganda delegates had agreed in principle to a new procedure of indirect elections to the Assembly.

The walk-out decision was announced in a detailed conference by Mr. Kiwanuka about 30 minutes after the morning session had started under the chairmanship of Lord Perth, Minister of State for the Colonies. Mr. Kiwanuka and the other elected Minister, Mr. B. K. Barigwisa (Local Government), led members of the Legislative Council, who had been invited to attend the Kingdoms of Toro and Ankole.

The collapse of the conference was the result of the Minister's lack of interest in the talks. He had been absent from the conference for several days. He had announced that they could not leave the talks.

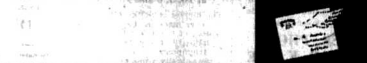

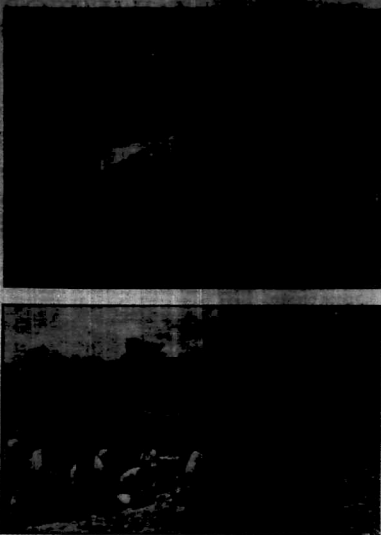
