Minister's pledge to 'The Six'

BRITAIN yesterday told the six European Common Market countries she wanted to help in promoting, through their community, the widest possible measure of European unity.

The Deputy Foreign Secretary, Mr. Heath, said in a statement that he would be found to be in agreement with the European Trade Association.

In a policy statement at a preliminary conference in Paris with Ministers of the six, Mr. Heath said Britain's aim was to join the Common Market but had been disappointed. He hoped his statement would amply justify the British determination to bring the negotiations - due to open in Brussels in the first half of next month - to a successful conclusion.

Two years for Tanganyika born Britons to their choice of CITIZENSHIP

Essential for one country

DUAL nationality will not be permitted for Tanganyika citizens after independence, it is considered that as there are several different races in the country there should be no mixing of loyalties, and citizens should owe only loyalty to Tanganyika.

This is one of the proposals contained in a Government Paper published today. The paper, which sets out the Government's recommendations for the establishment of Tanganyika citizenship after independence, will be debated by the National Assembly at its present meeting.

Automatic change

All persons becoming Tanganyika citizens on independence Day by operation of law who also remain citizens of some other country will have up to two years in which to renounce that other citizenship. If they do not make such renunciation, they will cease to be Tanganyika citizens at the end of that period.

Tanganyika citizens born after December 31 of this year shall obtain another citizenship will have to choose between the two within one year, while any person entitled to register as a Tanganyika citizen who wishes to register as a citizen of another country will have to choose to renounce any other citizenship.

Persons who will acquire Tanganyika citizenship automatically by operation of law on independence Day will be first, all British-registered persons and citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies born in Tanganyika, and of whose parents was also born in Tanganyika; and secondly any person who is a British-registered person or citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies from outside Tanganyika whose father either was, or had been, a Tanganyika citizen; by the operation of law on independence Day.

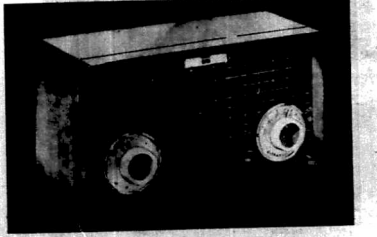

Floods follow drought in Nyeri area

REGNERATION seems to choke Kenya — in its weather as well as its politics. After a drought, probably the worst for several decades, the Colony has been hit by floods, first in the western part of Coast Province, and this week in the Nyeri area.

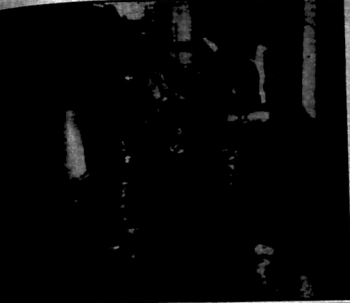
Over the weekend alone nearly five inches of rain fell in the district, and the level of the Chania river rose to about six feet above normal. The valley below was heavily flooded.

At least two people are missing and three others injured in the floods. Two men were swept away when they tried to cross a footbridge.

Nyeri township's electricity supply was interrupted for a day after the Sogoma power station plant had been flooded to a depth of 30 inches. Afterwards, output was restricted, but by last night it was expected to be normal again.

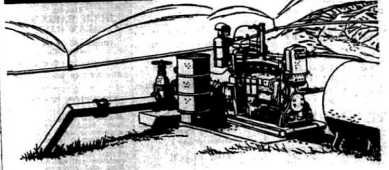

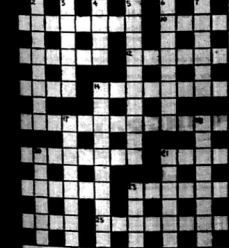
