MR. ANTHONY EDEN'S VISIT TO MOSCOW
Important Talks With M. Stalin

December 29.—Mr. Anthony Eden's talks in Moscow with M. Stalin and M. Molotov first announced last night, are part of a plan to develop a grand world strategy to bring the Axis powers to their knees. Mr. Eden's visit, like that of Mr. Churchill to Washington, has been kept a close secret. It is now revealed that many other distinguished statesmen joined in the talks—Mr. Eden, Mr. Stafford Cripps, our envoy to Moscow, and our envoys to Iran and Turkey. Mr. Eden was accompanied by Lieutenant General Nye, Vice-Chief of the Imperial General Staff, and the Alexander Cadogan, Permanent Under-Secretary for Foreign Affairs. Military experts from China were also present.

Hittler Doomed
 In the words of the joint Anglo-Soviet communique the conversations stressed the necessity for the utter defeat of Hitlerite Germany and the adoption of measures to make completely impossible any repetition of German aggression in future. The communique added that an important new step forward was made towards closer collaboration between Britain and Russia, both now and in post-war days. It is learned in London that Mr. Eden had already started on his journey to the Soviet capital before Moscow received the news. During his stay he visited the battle front in the Moscow zone.

America Pleaded
 Washington messages speak of the satisfaction with which M. Stalin and Mr. Molotov have received and say that the communique shows that the conference has been so successful as to have held in cordiality. Mr. Molotov stressed the frankness and cordiality that marked Mr. Eden's visit and say that altogether the Foreign Secretary and M. Stalin had already started on his journey to Moscow to meet M. Molotov five days.

A Sure Guarantee

AGREEMENT ON PRICE LEVELS FOR EAST AFRICAN PRODUCE
Important Decisions By Supplies Boards

MEETINGS of the East African Price Supplies Board and the East African Civil Supplies Board were held in Nairobi before Christmas. The Directors of Agriculture of Kenya, Tanganyika and Uganda attended the War Supplies Board meeting and considered with the Board the action necessary to carry out a coordinated programme of increased agricultural productivity in 1942, and estimates of the East African increase in wheat, barley, maize, sugar, beans, and potatoes, copra, rice and sisal which could be produced during the coming year.

Agreement was reached on the price levels which it was recommended should be guaranteed to producers of certain commodities in all the East African territories, and a further announcement on this point will be made as soon as possible. The question of import duties on military authorities, and release of stocks, was also discussed.

Mails To East Africa
SPEED-UP DESIRABLE
 ["STARBUR" CORRESPONDENT]
 An Executive Meeting London, 29th Nov. 1941. The Joint East African Board followed the annual meeting which took place on Tuesday, September 30, at the Abscon Hotel, in the Club in the absence of Colonel Hoddson, who was indisposed. The first business of the meeting was to elect a Chairman and Vice-Chairman and Colonel Hoddson was duly re-elected for the ensuing term as Chairman and Mr. Abraham Holm as Vice-Chairman.

There was a good attendance and many important matters were discussed, though some of them were naturally incidental owing to the war. Among the subjects of general interest was the necessity for quicker aerial services to and from East Africa. The Secretary pointed out that this was a request from the Air Liaison Committee of Commerce to the effect that the Air Mail Service to East Africa should be speeded up. They had got into touch with the Postmaster General who answered that the desirability of improving airmail communications with East Africa was fully appreciated and any improvement which became practicable would at once be made that all that could be done in the year. The Secretary then informed the Secretary of the Dar es Salaam Chamber of Commerce, Mr. M. H. Barlow, that the Service had improved in the last few months. His last letter had arrived in just over a fortnight from London, which was better than it used to be.

Several members gave their experiences which were not all so favorable as this and Mr. J. Cameron thought the mails between South Africa and East Africa could be improved. It was decided that the Secretary should take up that matter following up his previous letter.

Letters To Enemy Territories

INSTRUCTIONS TO SENDERS

ARRANGEMENTS by which members of the public in Kenya and Uganda may communicate with persons in enemy countries or territories in the occupation of the enemy are given in the following communication issued by the Kenya Information Office.

It is notified that general information that arrangements have been made to permit postal communications and money remittance facilities with persons in enemy territories is subject to the following conditions:

The territories included in the arrangements are: Belgium, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, Finland, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Greece, (Mainland), Greek Islands, and Crete, Holland, Hungary, Italy, and Italian possessions, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Norway, Poland (German occupied), Rumania and Yugoslavia. (The service is not at present available for Occupied France and the Channel Islands.)

1. Communications must be clearly written or typed on one side of the paper only, in plain, unwater-marked stationery, and must not exceed two pages of normal size. Writers should not put more than one letter in the same envelope. Erasures and corrections of mislaid stationery and additions by other people are not permitted.

2. Letters and envelopes must omit the sender's address. They may be in English or in the language of the country for which they are intended (except Czech and Hebrew) must contain nothing but matters of personal interest.

(a) No reference may be made to any town, village, locality, ship or journey, or to the Consular or any other phase of the war, or to the means by which the letter is sent. No printed matter, map, plan, sketch, drawing, picture, photograph, or other material representation, or postage or revenue stamps may be enclosed.

(b) Business letters and letters containing directions about property or money matters, or letters which contain money or remittances of any kind, are not admitted.

3. Each letter must be placed in an open unsealed envelope (if mailed) to the addressee, who should be asked to address any reply to your full name, care Post Box, London, Portugal, Poste Restante addresses are not accepted. The use of titles or Naval, Military or Air Force Ranks is forbidden. The London Post Box must not be mentioned on the flap of the envelope.

The open envelope containing

the letter should be placed in the outer stamped envelope and sent to the Chief Officer, P.O. Box 251, Nairobi and marked "For Enemy Territory" together with a memorandum (printed order for return) which contains the address of the sender. A married couple should give their own as well as the husband's initials.

The communication to the Chief Officer must be fully prepaid at the usual inland postage rate and must enclose a postal order for value to include the following charges: return of international postage (cannot be intercepted); a 2/- charge in respect of each letter plus

Postage charges to cover the forwarding of the complete communication to Great Britain.

The 2/- charge of one envelope containing one communication not exceeding 10000 in weight from the sender in Great Britain to the Neutral Country.

Postage from the neutral country to the enemy territory.

In case a reply is sent from the neutral country to the sender, no surcharge will be levied. The fee does not include the cost of postage of the reply in an enemy territory to the neutral country.

The amount included for postage charges to cover the forwarding of the complete communication to Great Britain should be calculated at the following rates:—

If by dispatch by surface post 80 cents

If by dispatch by airmail 1/20 per cent for each half ounce or part thereof.

The cover for airmail territory if by dispatch by airmail, neither must a blue airmail label be affixed. A slip can however be attached by means of a clip, indicating that dispatch by airmail is required.

4. The register of mailed services is not available.

5. The service is at the sole risk in all respects of the party requesting the service, and is on the express understanding that no action will lie against the Cross-ship or any other authorities by reason of any act or default on their part or on the part of any person or agent employed by them.

6. A communication for prisoners of war in the British and Allied Naval, Military and Air Force possessions and civilian internees (in enemy or enemy-occupied territory) must not be sent under this service, but forwarded through the normal route of post and in accordance with any regulations that may be issued in this connection.

7. The following arrangements do not concern post-pondence posted by interceptors.

8. Parcels cannot be dealt with by this service.

THE LIQUOR LAW AND MOMBASA

In the Official Gazette today (23rd December) there has been issued the Defence (Hours of Sale) (Abolishment) Regulations 1941. These Regulations revoke with effect from the 1st January 1942, Sections 1 (1) and (2) of Regulation 1 and 2 of the Defence (Hours of Sale) of Liquor Regulations 1941 (published in the Official Gazette on 7th October, 1941), and substitute for them the following:

(a) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and notwithstanding the provisions of the Ordinance in the terms of any licence or grant thereunder, no person shall be licensed premises sell or supply liquor for consumption of liquor by any person, or buy or consume any liquor, any day at any hour other than those following:

(i) in the Coast Province (excluding the Municipality of Mombasa) between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2 p.m. and between the hours of 4 p.m. and 10.15 p.m.;

(ii) in the Municipality of Mombasa (other than in licensed premises in respect of which a Wine Merchant's and Grocer's Licence granted under the Ordinance (before the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2 p.m. and 10.15 p.m.)) in the Municipality of Mombasa on premises in respect of which a Wine Merchant's and Grocer's Licence granted under the Ordinance (before the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon);

(c) In any place of the Colony, other than in the Coast Province, between the hours of 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between the hours of 8 p.m. and 10.15 p.m.

(2) Nothing in this Regulation contained shall be deemed—

(a) in any part of the Colony other than in the Municipality of Mombasa to apply to the sale or supply of liquor by a holder of a Wine Merchant's and Grocer's Licence granted under the Ordinance; or

(b) to prohibit any person who resides on licensed premises, his family or any person bona fide visiting him at any time to consume liquor in the private apartments of such person;

Provided that for the purposes of this Regulation no person shall be deemed to reside on licensed premises unless he has hired private apartments on such premises for a period of not less than seven days.

"This, in addition to the restrictions already imposed upon the hours during which liquor may be sold, thus completely prohibits on any day the sale or provision of liquor, or its purchase or consumption, on premises within the Municipality of Mombasa, in respect of which a Wine Merchant's and Grocer's Licence has been granted, except between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon.

NEW VISTAS IN THE CITY Beauty Revealed By Destruction

Those who know the London streets always the north side when walking eastward along Fleet Street. Thus they can witness St. Paul's Cathedral and the great stately building rising clear against the sky. Today, in the aftermath of last week's German assault from the air, the City is dominated more than ever by the dome of St. Paul's.

The church of St. Giles, Crispin-gate, has nothing but its battered and tattered walls left and a tower that is no less scarred. It is the most ruin in this vast area of wreckage on either side of the river.

Near St. Paul's, as in Queen Victoria Street, it is often more than the cathedral than the dome that has been opened to view by the demolition of buildings. Artists have for months past recorded their impressions of these new scenes, taking their stand among the ruins like Managua's new Zeisslers.

London plans trees come frequently into the new scenes. Beside the church of St. Dun a battlemented wall are seen the narrow alleyways of trees in the gateway of Saffron Hill and in St. Dun's Lane. In the opposite direction, Queen Victoria Street has acquired just a very little of the right enjoyed only by Upper Thames Street in revealing glimpses of the river at the end of long and narrow passages.

Church towers and steeples seem to all this changed scene to have an air of the old. The bold white spires of the old St. Dun's church from which they had been hidden, as at Bartlett's Passage in Peter Lane. At the western end of Smithfield, St. Dun's stands out as a landmark in company with the dome of St. Paul's. Just beyond there is last remnant of tragic demolition bounded by Charterhouse Street, Farringdon Street and Holborn Temple and St. Andrew's. Habitations of serenity still remaining in the quiet streets of the north of St. Giles.

At a higher level, the empty spaces from which the wreckage of bombed and gutted buildings has been cleared seem like pits. From such heights one can see the ground, comparing these remaining islands with what remains of the old. One can pick out from the wide sweep some ancient masonry, the walls of the old Temple of the Godhand.

There are some places, notably the Temple, where so much has been destroyed in these special times that the changed view is overwhelming only the change in the whole scene. It may be that along some narrow St. Peter's street is something new, perhaps the entire aspect of the Temple has been seen in its huge and rare time appearance.

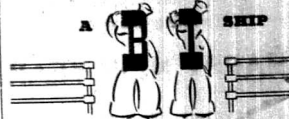

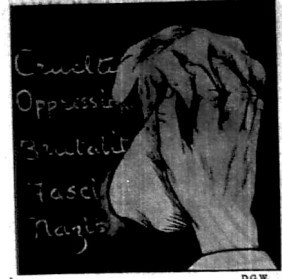

BRITONS IN A U.S.A. PEACE HAVEN

[STANDARD'S CORRESPONDENT]—Lan.—An arduous 400-mile expedition from New York into the wilds of Maine has ended in the discovery of an idyllic haven where a big group of healthy British men, young and middle-aged, have been living happily. Their work was carried out under the munificent protection of Dr. Frank Buchman's Moral Re-orientation Force (writes John Waller in the Daily Mirror).

News that a Daily Mirror representative was in the neighbourhood has sent Buchman into hiding. Some of his British proteges have also been vanishing since.

Driving with my guide through Maine woods early in the morning from Augusta, I suddenly came across at Tallwood and nestled healthily on the beautiful shores of Lake Umbagog.

It consists of a mansion, several small houses, many acres of farmland, bathing and boating beach, and accommodation for Moral Re-orientation's private fleets of rafts and motor cars.

The former Tallwood employe whom I met as a "Farmer" described it to me as a "Paradise" where women do nearly all the work, while men labour and pass out tracts.

He told me, "Britons, some in little groups receiving messages from God, sing, swim in the lake and go boating."

GRECE AFTER THE VICTORY

I advise you to guard yourselves against those inevitable people who years after political emancipation and find no other means of getting on, but of agitating for individual rights and freedom. For the enemy does not allow us to rest.

For those men, who are fortunately but few in number without any support among the people, and who unseasonably assist the enemy because they feel that you will not see the prosecution of the way you may wish to attempt your own reform to later in order that we may be able to establish real liberty in the country when victory comes."

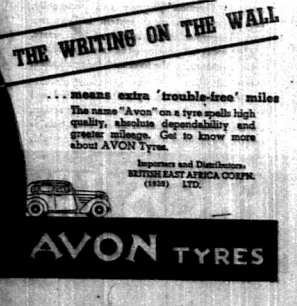
