No prelude to I.D.A. —Mr. Smith

Government of Rhodesia yesterday declared a three-month State of Emergency, but denied it was a prelude to imminent seizure of independence from Britain.

Threats by African nationalist saboteurs were officially given as the reason for the State of Emergency, which applied throughout the country and will allow the police to arrest people without warrant.

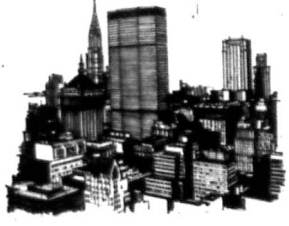

GOVERNMENT PROMISE ON LAND CONSOLIDATION

MISTAKES in Kenya's land consolidation programmes during the Emergency period were complained of in the House of Representatives yesterday when instances were cited of political dictation which were not permitted to argue their cases during court alterations to land titles.

Mr. W. KARURI (C.O.) moved that as land consolidation has been carried out in Kenya since 1950, whose land was misappropriated, the Government should amend the Land Registration (Special Areas) Act to enable those people who had been wronged to be compensated by the Government.

Yesterday in the House

The motion was approved with an amendment that the Government should "look into the possibility of amending the Act."

The Government has made an attempt to have the details altered, but it is not clear if it is of the different provisions, before entering into the Bill.

Mr. M. Karuri, urging the Government to "look into the possibility of amending the Act" was unanimously passed by the House.

Following the amendment, the Member for Kiambu, Mr. J. K. YAMU, said it was always a pleasure to have a Member who was not afraid to speak out on a matter which was of public interest. He said that it was not actually during the Emergency that the Assistant Minister for Lands and Settlement had said that a debate on the motion be held.

Forecasters will study latest weather findings

THE fifth seminar on tropical meteorology in Africa is to open on Monday at the East African Meteorological Centre at Dugesi, near Nairobi. The three-week seminar is to discuss the results of the most recent research in tropical weather forecasting and to demonstrate the latest synoptic techniques applied in the meteorological forecasts to understand the analysis and guidance which are issued.

The director of the E.A. Meteorological Department, Mr. J. W. Thompson, who recently represented Africa at a two-week international conference on tropical meteorological techniques in Geneva, said the conference discussed, among other things, the development of a new, world meteorological communications organization which would enable meteorologists to exchange information on the latest findings in their field.

Electronic computers

Thompson said that development through the use of computers in forecasting the weather was one of the most important developments in meteorology in the past few years. He said that the use of computers had enabled meteorologists to process large amounts of data and to produce more accurate forecasts.

Thompson said that development and the attendance there were taking place rapidly and his department was thoroughly involved and kept abreast of the work.

Thompson said that the East African Meteorological Centre was the largest meteorological centre in Africa and the greatest value of the centre was its role as a centre for the exchange of information and assistance.

Thompson said that the centre was currently operating in a temporary building and that a new building was being planned. He said that the centre was one of the most important centres in Africa for the study of tropical meteorology.

Britain still hopeful of settlement

HEREFORDS CATCH THE EYE AT KITALE SHOW

THE British Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, yesterday called two meetings of his senior Ministers to discuss the next move in the Rhodesian crisis.

The Commonwealth Secretary, Mr. Bottomley, said after the first meeting that "the door is still open" for a negotiated settlement to avert U.D.I.

Other Ministers at this meeting were the Attorney-General, Sir Elwyn Jones, who went to Rhodesia with the Prime Minister and Mr. Bottomley two weeks ago, and Lord Gardiner who, as Lord Chancellor, is a top constitutional expert.

Later Mr. Wilson called a meeting of the Cabinet's Defence and Overseas Policy Committee, which brought other leading Ministers into the talks. Mr. Wilson's reply to Mr. Smith's latest message on the crisis was discussed at both meetings.

Point-by-point answer

Mr. Wilson's reply to Salisbury will be a point-by-point answer to Mr. Smith's lengthy message delivered in London on Saturday. The British Government hopes to keep the dialogue between the Prime Minister and the Rhodesian Government going in order to buy more time and see if a move towards joint administration with the Rhodesian Cabinet can gain ground.

10 p.c. levy on hotels next week

UGANDA'S new hotel tax imposing a ten per cent levy on hotel bills will come into force on November 15. This is the effect of an Order published in the Uganda Gazette and signed by the Minister of Finance, Mr. Kalite-Saitali.

The tax was among the proposals announced in Kalite-Saitali's Budget speech earlier this year. The order now provides that hotel proprietors shall make levying agreed with their customers, and pay the proceeds to the Government.

It will be levied on a hotel customer's bill, including the charges for accommodation, meals, beverages served with the bill, laundry, telephone calls and sundries. Any service charged by the hotel will not be subject to the tax.

The Order says that all hotels situated in towns, or licensed under the Hotels Ordinance, shall be subject to the tax, with the exception of those hotels situated in Uganda's national parks, which will be subject to the tax at a rate of 10 per cent.

Drinks bought for cash at the hotel will not be included in the tax. The Order says that the tax must be collected from the hotel at the beginning of each month at the Kampala Club and the Kitale Club.

SOVIET ROCKET RAMP CAN DODGE 'SPIES'

THE Soviet Union yesterday showed off a new high mobile mobile missile carrier and said it can now move fast enough to elude detection by spy satellites.

Two of the heavy tank-like carriers armed with inter-continental missiles rumbled across the Red Square as the highlight of Russia's 50th Revolution anniversary parade.

The tracked carriers were described as self-propelled launchers, and were said to be the first time Russia had shown a mobile self-propelled carrier for a strategic missile.

A message from President Khrushchev to the Soviet People's Party was one of many sent to Moscow by world leaders congratulating the Russians on the anniversary of the October Revolution.

On the eve of the anniversary it was announced that the Soviet Union has offered better relations to both United States and China. But said it has not been asked to make the new move.

War of words
A Sri Lanka Deputy Prime Minister, Mr. Dudley Senanayake, said that the Kephren explosion in the North of Ceylon, which the Victorian border contacts can be traced to the island.

In a Kephren border post statement, he said Russia had done everything to get a long Peking and now demands that the Communist Party should be the Communist Party's partner in the annual anniversary celebrations.

The Russian leader indicated that the Soviet Union may be looking towards a new minister of pro-Soviet Communist Party.

He said Moscow had exchanged views with 12 Communist nations, and with Communist Party to other countries, in efforts towards unity.

In New York, five truckloads of some 2,000, long-barrelled rifles were sent to the UN, under a special permit, as a symbol of opposition to U.S. arms sales to South Africa.

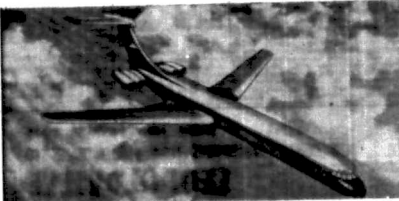
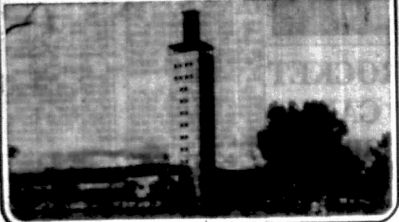

COTTON IN GOOD SHAPE

WITH cotton planting completed in all parts of Uganda the Department of Agriculture says the condition of the crop — especially the late planting — has been much improved by September's rains.

The end of September's plantings were estimated to cover 1,100,000 acres, against 1,112,000 acres at the same period in 1961.

The Eastern Region was the only region to exceed last year's plantings and it is estimated that 1,128,177 acres had been planted there, against 1,225,000 acres at the same period in 1961.

The Acting Commissioner of Agriculture, Mr. J. Laker, said that there was adequate rainfall in most areas, which enabled the crop to be completed satisfactorily to the satisfaction of the growers.

Picking of the newly planted crop had started in the Eastern Region and in Lango.

The incidence of pests and diseases had not been severe, and spraying had been satisfactory in Lango, Teso and Bushong.

Mr. Laker added: "Although it is not anticipated to achieve last year's production, nevertheless this season's crop prospects are fairly satisfactory, considering the weather conditions which have prevailed since the start of the crop."

Mr. Laker said that the Government would make the full down payment for the cotton crop to the growers by the end of the year.

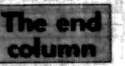

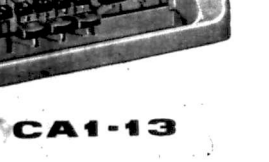

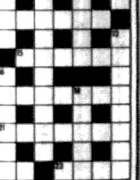

BRITAIN has rejected a second land transfer scheme in Kenya, as proposed by the Kenya National Front. This became clear after the first meeting on Monday between Ministers of the British and the Kenyan Governments, and it placed members of the K.N.F.U. delegation into gloom.

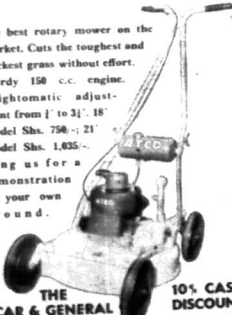

Mr. Ogunji also revealed that there were more people with valid licences who were not selling their produce because they were not getting their produce sold. He said that the government should take steps to ensure that the carriers and the farmers who were running around and drinking in towns were not getting their produce sold.

On what he called private carriers, Mr. Gategoti said they were not only the carriers but also the transporters but were also the carriers of the Government. Because they did not pay any revenue to the Government they were not being nationalised. Mr. Gategoti appealed to the public to help the police in arresting and prosecuting the carriers who were not getting their produce sold.

ELECTRIC POWER ACT

THE EAST AFRICAN POWER AND LIGHTING CORPORATION LIMITED (EAPL) has been established by the East African Powers and Lighting Corporation Act, 1965. The Act provides for the establishment of a Corporation to generate, transmit, distribute and supply electricity in the territories of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika.

The Corporation is to be a body corporate with perpetual succession and the power to sue and be sued. It is to be managed and controlled by a Board of Directors consisting of representatives of the Governments of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika.

The Corporation is to have the right to acquire, hold, dispose of, lease, let, mortgage, charge, take, grant, execute, and enforce any instrument in writing, and to do all such other things as may be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the Act.

The Corporation is to be financed by the issue of debentures, the sale of electricity, and other sources of income. It is to be liable to pay rates and taxes in the same manner as a body corporate.

The Corporation is to be subject to the supervision and control of the Government of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika. It is to be required to submit to the Government a statement of accounts and a report on its operations.

The Corporation is to be established at Nairobi, Kenya.

He has also been a member of the Commission on Trade and Monetary Relations and of the Commission on Co-operation, Taxation and Tax Relief on Savings. He holds a doctorate in economics.

Terms of reference

The Authority also appointed the members of the commission. They are:

- KEVATTA**, the Minister for Finance, Mr. Githuru; Mr. Mboya; and the Minister for Planning and Development, Mr. Mwangi.
- TANZANIA**, the Minister for Finance, Mr. Kikwete; the Minister for Planning and Development, Mr. Bwalya; and the Minister for Resources and Development, Mr. Bwalya.
- UGANDA**, the Minister for Finance, Mr. Kallabala; the Minister for Agriculture, Mr. Nyeki; and the Minister for Commerce and Industries, Mr. Nyeki.

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, Mr. Dag Hammarskjöld, will provide the secretariat.

The commission will also have access to the files of the East African Community, which were transferred to the United Nations in 1962.

The commission will report to the Authority in Nairobi in the next few weeks.
