### Halving Of Poland "Basis For Durable Peace"

#### ALLIES UNMOVED BY THREATS

WHAT IS DESCRIBED IN LONDON AS "A NEW OFFENSIVE IN THE WAR OF WORDS, AND ONE THAT HAS ALREADY FAILED" WAS LAUGHED YESTERDAY MORNING BY GERMANY AND RUSSIA.

They announced, after the end of the negotiations between Herr von Ribbentrop and M. Molotov in Moscow, that as the German agreement to divide Poland between them had provided a basis for "a durable peace in Eastern Europe," it would be in the real interests of all nations to end the war between Germany and Britain and France, Russia and Germany would make joint efforts to end the war, and that Britain and France were responsible for the continuation of the war-would be proved. Germany and Russia would then conduct an "necessary measure."

Semiofficial comment in London and Paris says that the pact does not indicate any real change in the situation, and it is not thought that Germany will get any more help from Russia now than she would have done before. The joint consultations on "necessary measures" are an attempt at putting up a bogey which will not frighten Britain and France.

# WAR PROBLEMS

## Steps To Safeguard Interests Of Those Serving With Forces

Defiant military calls there were very few absentees from the Kenya Coffee Conference held in the Memorial Hall, Nairobi, yesterday. Mr. R. S. Wollen, Chairman of the Coffee Board of Kenya, presided over the Conference, which was officially opened by Mr. C. R. Lockhart, the Financial Secretary.

Much of the discussion inevitably centred on conditions created by the war and one resolution instructed the Coffee Board to take all necessary steps to secure the proper maintenance of estates whose owners had joined the Colours.

After expressing appreciation for the invitation to open the Conference, Mr. Lockhart dealt with the question of coffee prices. Only a year ago, Conference had discussed prices of coffee which were so poor that coffee production seemed economically the most favourable situated plantations. Later, however, prices started to improve and the industry had enjoyed the most successful season it had had for many years. Not only that but this year planters had been encouraged to plant more coffee trees. The Kenya Structure

The Information Committee issued yesterday the detailed statement published today giving the personnel of the various war-time organisations now in Kenya and some indication of their functions. Most of these organisations were set up before the war broke out but during the first week of hostilities there was such a spate of special notices that the Office General announcing appointments that a somewhat dated public might well be expected to deal with many together and set them in a form which will not only permit the public to know where they are in relation to war-time authorities but will also give the members of the various Boards and Committees a much-needed opportunity of discovering who is functioning on organisations other than their own, and why.

The main part of the structure consists of (1) Man Power, (2) Supplies, (3) Shipping, (4) Information, (5) Settlement and Production. The other Boards and Committees are largely incidental in their operation and responsibilities to these principal organisations. The list also offers an opportunity for a study of the considerable extent to which senior officials have been diverted from their original tasks to undertake war-time responsibilities and how far members of well-known personalities in the ordinary life of the country, particularly members of the Legislative Council, have been absorbed in the official emergency machinery. We have already expressed our opinion that the Government and the people of the country must face the implications of some of these appointments, and will content ourselves with saying again that we consider it undesirable, for political reasons as well as others, that in the conditions of today the Chief Native Commissioner should be known also to the African peoples as the Director of Man Power. Nor are we satisfied that the requirements of the public in respect of Government's responsibility for control over finance and the operation of a war-time financial policy, with the civil duties of stewardship to the people which the Government cannot escape merely by the aid of war-time conditions, can always be adequately met by making the Financial Secretary simultaneously the Chairman of a war-time operating body such as the Supplies Board when he may well have to defend the public interest in the future, as Financial Secretary, against the actions or the policy of the Board he is also directing.

In any event we should have thought that the abnormal difficulties of colonial finance, particularly during the period of protracted hostilities, and the close personal supervision which must be exercised in the future on every aspect of civil expenditure, and the financial policy, would have been at least sufficient to require the full attention of the country's Financial Secretary. ## BRITISH REPLY TO "PEACE IN FRANCE"

### "Hitler Began: We Shall End"

#### MR. CHURCHILL'S SPEECH

##### "THE WAR BEGAN WHEN HITLER WANTED IT TO BEGIN, BUT IT WILL END ONLY WHEN WE ARE CONVINCED THAT HE HAS HAD ENOUGH."

This was the keynote of a striking speech by Mr. Churchill, broadcast last to the world on Sunday night. One American commentator said that such a speech was worth a battery of heavy artillery.

Mr. Churchill declared that the time of the coming of victory would depend on how long Hitler and a group of wretched men, whose hands were stained with blood and sticky with corruption, could keep their grip on the doleful, unhappy German people.

**Premier's Appeal**

General Sikorski, the new Polish Prime Minister, said last night in Paris that he would confer with M. Daladier regarding the situation in France and would refer to the Government. General Sikorski said it was his duty to raise from six to eight divisions in France and he was making arrangements to send the 5,000,000 Poles living in the British Isles, who had escaped from Poland, to man five of six divisions and they were at present on their way to France.

The Polish Government are seeking the help of M. Paderewski, the Polish statesman who was Premier of Poland in 1918.

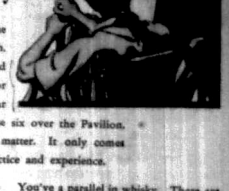

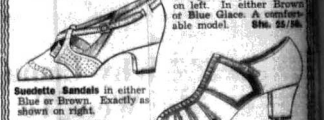

MOMBASA CUSTOMS CASE

Continued last: Some cases of infringing the Customs Ordinances brought against Mr. E. E. James have been completed in the Court of the Acting Resident, Mombasa. Mr. J. 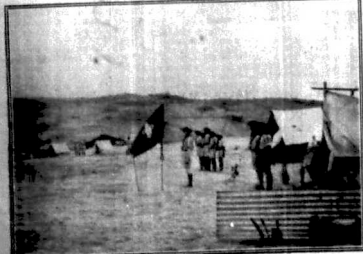
