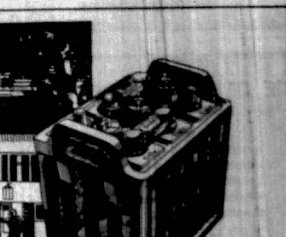

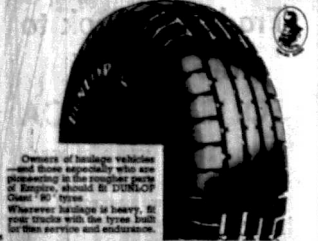

## GERMAN "PEACE OFFENSIVE" FAILING

### Russia Only Country To Offer Support

GERMANY'S "PEACE OFFENSIVE" IS MAKING LITTLE PROGRESS. MOSCOW HAS SUPPORTED IT, IN AN ARTICLE IN A COMMUNIST NEWSPAPER, AND ITALY IS READY TO OFFER "MORAL SUPPORT" TO ANY MOVEMENTS FOR PEACE. THAT IS ALL.

France and Britain are not at all impressed—French soldiers laughed when extracts from Herr Hitler's speech, translated into French, were broadcast through giant loudspeakers in the streets in the Western Front and the neutral countries give the Reichstag speech a chilly reception.

Germany has been trying without success to get a neutral backing for the proposals put forward by Hitler. A Danish comment is that the task of mediating against Denmark's powers, and a Japanese newspaper says Hitler did not try to bring about the materialisation of his peace ideals before the up-spring.

October 10. For the first time the German on Sunday night used powerful loudspeakers on the western front and broadcast a speech from Hitler's headquarters. The German selected passages from Hitler's speech. The speech, which also is reported to have been highly admired by those broadcast.

Meanwhile the opinion in Britain and France and in the Dominion as well as in the United States is that the Government will not be able to win the support of the United States for its peace proposals. 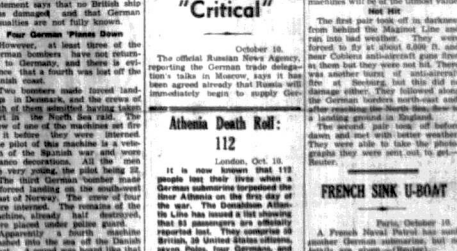
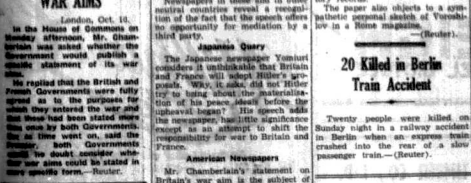
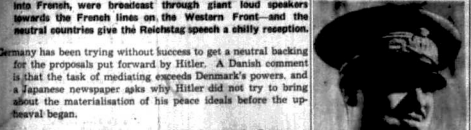

The day before there was a session at Nairobi, where there were 41 applications for exemption, of which only 14 were granted.


The Tribunal is very sympathetic towards the farming community, finding that prohibition should be lifted in many instances on the ground of a considerable loss.

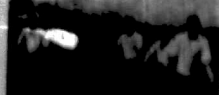

Finland is making hurried preparations against air attack, and over the most important towns, including the capital, have been partially evacuated.

Reported concentrations of Russian troops against Finland are being met by the evacuation of civilians to the Finnish frontier.

The official Russian news Agency announces that the new Treaty with Lithuania has been signed.

It is in Vilna that Lithuanians remained their republic in 1918. Lithuania was a satellite shortly afterwards by the Poles. Nevertheless the Lithuanians have been able to retain their independence for 19 years they maintained a neutral attitude in the present diplomatic relations with Warsaw and Berlin.

The Lithuanians are said to have given to Russia as part of the pact a right of transit through Lithuania to the Baltic States.

It is stated in London that the British Government has been written to other States and the Lithuanian Government has been told that Britain cannot recognize the treaty of Vilna by Russia with Lithuania.

It is pointed out however that Lithuania is a very different State from the German and Russian partition of the Baltic States.

Lithuania was compelled to sign the treaty with Russia and was to be compensated in exchange for the virtual loss of her independence.

The inhabitants of Vilna, it is believed, are likely to be better off under the Lithuanian Government than under Russia or Germany.

The Lithuanian pact with Russia is referred to in Moscow as a military alliance and it is expected that it will be followed by the ratification of the frontier pact between Lithuania and Germany. The Pact with Latvia has been signed in Moscow today there were public demonstrations in the Lithuanian capital of Vilna to Lithuania.

A Latvian train detachment left for Moscow to negotiate a new commercial treaty with the Soviet.


