"STAR IS ON EARNEST" German Reaction To Premier's Speech BERLIN CONFERENCE

Hitler is reported to have called a conference of his advisers on Thursday night to study Mr. Chamberlain's speech. As a result of this examination the German Chancellor is stated to have decided to take all measures to prosecute the war.

A hint at intervention by Washington was made by the Nazi Press chief who said that the United States was the only power which could yet intervene to prevent a major war in Europe.

The British Prime Minister's speech is widely praised for its lucidity and firmness and is generally regarded as a complete answer to Hitler's so-called peace proposals.

PRICE CONTROL IN BRITAIN

London, October 13.
Severe penalties for profiteering are contained in a Bill, by control price. The Bill, which was published in Britain yesterday, was introduced into the House of Commons on Monday and then received its first reading.

The main object of this measure is to prevent the sale of certain goods at prices which cannot be justified in a state of increased cost. These costs are specified in the Bill, the provisions will be enforced by a Central Price Regulation Bureau and a number of local Committees.

The maximum penalty for a breach of the regulations is three months' imprisonment, or £100 fine, or a combination of these two, and two years, or a maximum fine of £500, or both in default.

It affects goods entering into the cost of living and does not apply to foodstuffs otherwise controlled. (Reuter.)

GERMAN ATTACKS INCREASING ON WESTERN FRONT

French Said To Have
Blown Up Rhine
Bridges

German raids along the Western Front are developing into real attacks, and reports reaching Holland suggest that Germany is preparing for intensive action.

ENCOURAGING NEWS COMES FROM THE HOME FRONT

Too Many Volunteers Want To Join Up!

Latest news from what has been described as the Home Front is given below by the East African Standard's London Correspondent. Chief features of an encouraging review are—

The problem of feeding thousands of people who want to join up and cannot yet be accepted.

A hint that ordinary business is more normal.

[*STANDARD'S CORRESPONDENCE]

London, Oct. 5.

This is a quiet war—quiet by any name. Indeed some folk need a boost to explain to them that this war is being fought. They expected "knock-out" and a quick ending to the bombing. Hell let loose from on high. That was their idea of war. Now they are puzzled. Don't worry. This war is all right. There is no doubt about it. The great wrestling match called economic war or blockade is being bitterly fought. Germany is fighting back, trying to turn Europe into a vast hoard of Britain.

In the last six weeks the fact that he will be the victor in the war.

But what is happening on land, though? Not much! Five million British mobilised. A great British Army in France. And a complete equipment of German kit, which, by heaven, we mean to sell back to Hitler! As for the air, maybe we will reach stalemate. The risk of losing it. Bombers may be worth more as threat than as a weapon. So it may be a bit before some people admit that the war has started. Anyway, it does not look likely that either side will use gas.

General Rationing

Rationing, when it starts shortly, will be found to work smoothly, efficiently—and generally. People take weekly allocation of rationed food for each adult person is expected to be 11 lb. meat; 3 lb. butter; 3 oz. fat; and 10 lb. sugar. Extra meat rations will be granted to heavy workers and soldiers and boys. There will be extra, too, for invalids. Postal, gas, aviation and most post will not be rationed.

The main complaint with regard to rationing is that the Government is not doing it. It is still suggested they are doing a little proffering themselves.

To ensure that every woman and child in Britain shall get a fair and equal share of butcher's meat, the Minister of Food, Mr. W. M. Morrison, has decided to ration it on value, not by weight. The workers "a very good meat ration" and this will allow for them as much as their money can buy. With the other foods rationing will be by weight, and the final allocations will depend on stocks. The bacon allowance is likely to be small—probably between a half and two-

thirds of a pound—because our supplies from Denmark and other Baltic states are not so large as before the war, and our new sources of supply have not yet begun to operate. Fat, eggs, tomatoes, oranges and vegetables will be added to rationing. There will be ample quantities of good-quality margarine, and a little extra of the best as was at first rationed, owing to ample stocks. The likelihood of a good beer harvest and big cotton harvest has allowed for it. An average household is allowed one and a half pounds of lard and cooking fat each week.

Overseas Number of Volunteers

The Foreign Department are worried because too many people want to join up and are not accepted—yet Mr. Winston Churchill, First Lord of the Admiralty, stated in the House of Commons on Navy recruitment that the Admiralty would rely on the voluntary recruiting that the Government is doing for entering officer-cadet and reserve positions. The permanent post-war needs of the Navy would be continued.

As regards the Army, it would appear that very shortly volunteers will be accepted for service—scores of thousands are anxiously awaiting their call. The force is equally well equipped; splendid units are coming from overseas.

Our trouble at the present time is that the Government is not doing enough to train them for the future. The war was probably their first right, but they are ill-trained and there is certainly not sufficient equipment. Every day and the papers there are columns of graduates from people who want to be called up, but against this view

the Government places slowly opposite it, not because it does not appreciate their patriotism, but because it does not want them.

The King has signed a Proclamation calling on the first group above the Militia age to register for future call-up. They are the men between the ages of 21 and 22. This means now below the age of 22 at the outbreak of September 30. Men who were 22 on September 30 will wait until the next group is called up. It is estimated that 250,000 men are affected by the King's Proclamation for the orders under which the Government will be called out. It will state that age group included are those from twenty to twenty-nine. The men who have included these young men who have reached the age of twenty since June 1st, when the Militiamen were registered.

All subsequent Proclamations will include the term "from the age of" in the order of the group covered by the Proclamation. There is no present intention of registering men of 18 and 19. No mention is made in the order of the date of registration of the new classes, nor is any estimate given of the date when they will be actually called to the colours.

Understand, however, that Mr. Ernest Brown, who is Minister of Labour and National Service is responsible for an arrangement under the registered men actually enter the fighting services, has arranged for registration to take place on or about October 21.

Actual calling up for service will take place until early November, after all Militiamen below twenty-two have been absorbed for training. It is estimated that the 250,000 covered by the newest class nearly 200,000 will serve. The 50,000 who will not serve include the medically unfit, conscientious objectors, and most important of all those men who are in the colonies.

Special Census

Last Friday night the nation was numbered, and as a result, you have not a card of identity, you are registered, you are counted. The information obtained on this occasion will serve the Government as a complete exhibition of the nation's manpower both for military and civil purposes, and it will serve the citizen as the basis of his title to local rationing. It will facilitate, when necessary, the application of the old Socialist motto: "From each according to his ability, to each according to his needs." We do not yet know how stringent the demand on our permanent resources will be, but we know with what exactness our material resources will be counted.

London, October 5.

A question was asked in Parliament yesterday regarding the possibility of amending the constitution of Seychelles, in accordance with the wishes of the Seychelles Territory Association.

Mr. David Adams asked the Secretary of State for the Colonies whether he has now considered the resolutions from the Seychelles Territory Association requesting an amendment to the Seychelles constitution whereby adequate popular representation of the inhabitants and a reduction in the excessive costs of the administration may be secured; and what action he proposes in the matter.

Mr. M. MacDonald: Yes, Sir, I have considered the resolutions in consultation with the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and I am satisfied that the method of selecting official members of the Legislative Council is adequate in principle, but I do not think any amendment of the constitution is required. As regards the cost of administration, it is estimated that, excluding considerable grants from the Colonial Development Fund, Government expenditure in the Colonies has in fact been reduced during the past three years by about 18 per cent. It is not possible to regard it as excessive.

As an alternative, it is put by Mr. Harvey to the Secretary of State for the Colonies, enquires how far Crown Colonies offered to take shares in the permanent war debt charges of the Government arising from the war of 1914-18; how much such contributions would be paid by annual quotas; and how many such quotas remain to be paid.



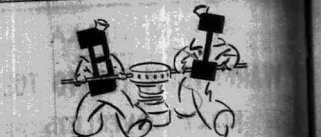

"L.G." AND NEUTRAL POWERS

"May Decide Fate Of War"

There are echoes of the peace campaign everywhere. The I.L.P. are peace people at all costs, though they are all anti-German. The C.P. is undoubtedly pro-peace. His weekly article on October 2 in the Sunday Dispatch was, I think, wonderfully unfortunate with respect to the Hitler-Stalin peace movement, and yesterday his speech in the House of Commons provided the drama of the debate, which followed the Prime Minister's declaration of Britain's policy.

Examining what Hitler's peace proposals might be, Mr. Lloyd George referred to Colombia and Italy's claim on France. "I could give many reasons for treating the partition of Poland in so far as the Russian part is concerned in a totally different spirit from that part which appertains to Italy, Italy and the German Government. Whether the part of Poland they have annexed is truly Russian is a matter for discussion. It certainly is not Polish." There have been suggestions at the invitation of Herr Hitler by the Italian Government who, I do not think have shown any hostility to this country during the last few days, and on the whole have shown a friendly disposition. "I ask the House and the Government to pause and not to be in a hurry in coming to a conclusion. If this document comes from the Italian Government, so far as we are concerned, are both neutral, I hope the Government will treat them both as neutrals. It is vital that we should do. We do not want to multiply our enemies. We have got as much as we can do to conquer one without adding one of two more. A mere peace pact is not the slightest use. You have to settle all the problems that are menacing the peace of the world, including the claims of Italy, and my reason is this—the fate of this was may depend, not on Britain and France and Germany, but upon the neutral powers. Italy has proclaimed herself neutral in Russia has proclaimed herself neutral. The United States is neutral. The fate of this war may depend on the attitude of these three Powers. There are three things which they can do. One is to take sides. It would be a real test if you had to face two great Powers instead of one, but without taking sides they can be either friendly or unfriendly neutrals."

Mr. Duff Cooper said—"I deeply deplore and regret that speech,

will go out to the world with this name at the head of it as a justification of surrender."

Lloyd George simply shook his head and looked to his feet. "I hope," he declared, "that Duff Cooper is not suggesting that I propose to accept terms of that character. The last but not the only way that we should surrender. This is a totally different proposition. I think the House should consider whether there should be a conference of some kind. I think we should include the United States of America to consider all these proposals. I have been changed with surrender. It is the first time a charge of that kind has been made against me. There is no talk of surrender. I think Duff Cooper may live to regret his words."

Mr. D. R. Grenfell (Lab. Gov.) said the situation today was less unambiguous than what was given way to Macdonald in the past. Mr. Lloyd George had written articles denouncing and condemning the victims and not the aggressors. When the Czechs were again masters of their own country, and the Germans and the Italians were going back to their own country, that would be the time to talk about peace.

Mr. Henry Page Croft thought it was deplorable that such a speech as that of Mr. Lloyd George should have been uttered. "When Mr. Lloyd George was Prime Minister during those eventful years of the last war" he said, "if any Member at the juncture like the present had been made such a suggestion I am certain that Mr. Lloyd George would have been his opponent to pieces."

Question of neutrals.

U.S.A.—More than friendly and helpful to such a speech as that of Mr. Lloyd George is certainly to be called on the "cash and carry" basis.

B. American Republics.

The South American Republics are viewed to a policy of strict and collective neutrality. This is partly because, broadly speaking, none of them, in spite of frontier disputes, has any territorial ambitions which might be achieved with the help of a non-American nation, but chiefly because none is strong enough to attempt to reach a general agreement. Even if the United States should be prepared to reach into the sea it is possible that no South American country would abandon its neutrality. Foreign proposals are even more strongly in favour of Great Britain and France than in 1914. Improved communications have made good sense of the matter more important. There was less demand from overworked countries for liberalism, and war materials were not such a vital issue. Today

for the Nazi system aimed at a German victory would involve danger—eventual or immediate—to South America, while the defeat of an expansionist Power would not just favour the continued independence of lands under-populated and rich in primary products. Italy—unless Mussolini or not, we all believe she will remain neutral. You will remember Mr. Churchill's allusion to her last Saturday. "In days of 1914 she was neutral, but we did not know the reason for her neutrality. It was only later on that we learned that by a secret clause in the original treaty of the Triple Alliance Italy had expressly reserved to herself the right to stand by on any conflict which might have broken out with Great Britain. Much has happened since then; our understandings and dispositions have altered, but all the more do we appreciate in England the reason why this great and friendly nation of Italy, with whom we have never been at war, has not seen fit to enter the struggle." Italy did not remain neutral. She should face the outcome with cheerfulness and confidence.

Small Powers of Europe.—All of them are friendly to the Democratic Front. Sweden, is though in a situation that gives more and more difficulty. German-Russian policy in Northern and North-eastern Europe and the recent activities of German submarines and armed trawlers off the Scandinavian coast clearly show that Germany is, with Russia help, trying to create a Continental system such as Napoleon created against this country as a counter-balance against the British Fleet. What Germany is attempting to organize now is a sort of counter-blockade, she will doubtfully pressure in other central areas before long—Holland and Belgium for example—and so will try to cut the Western Allies off from most of their European sources of supply.

Switzerland is as friendly to us as the others and is armed to the teeth. Turkey—We have no doubt of Turkey's loyalty to the Allies and we should probably not object to a Black Sea deal between Turkey and Turkey. But Romania might.

Spain.—Russia's invasion into Europe is a matter of the deepest gravity; nobody can hide that fact. The General Franco in an interview published in two of Madrid's papers, said that he had never already happened. "It is necessary to agree quickly on a way to avoid greater damage. The evil must be minimized so that no ally should not come from Eastern Europe newer and stronger than the mass diaspora of Belgium. This will not be attained without peace in Western Europe. Germany should be a sufficiently strong and solid barrier to oppose the domination of Europe—especially the policy

AMENDED K.D.F. ORDINANCE

An Explanation

The proposed introduction into the Kenya Defence Force Ordinance of a clause creating a committee of service of the K.D.F. beyond the limits of the Colony appears to have given rise to some misunderstanding. The Information Committee is authorized to make the following explanation:—

At the time of the making of the Ordinance (Amendment of Laws Regulations, 1939) which were published on September 4, it seemed probable that conditions might require the Kenya Defence Force Ordinance actually outside the boundaries of the Colony, although the immediate interests of the Colony and its Government, as well as the Regulations No. 21 reading: "Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Kenya Defence Force Ordinance, 1937, members of Class I and II of the Defence Force may, when on active service, be required to serve outside the limits of the Colony."

It was also held down that every member of the Defence Force shall be deemed to be on active service when he is attached to or forms part of a force engaged in operations against the enemy. Subsequently it was considered that the powers already conferred by the Regulations should be incorporated into an Amendment to the Kenya Defence Force Ordinance itself. This was done, and the Amendment was promulgated on October 12, 1939.

It is, however, one essential difference between the amendment by Regulation and the amendment by the Ordinance, that the latter is given effect by the Kenya Defence Force Ordinance if and when necessary, outside the limits of Kenya, in defence of the Colony.

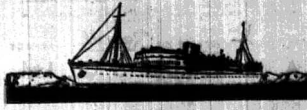

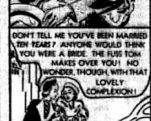

London, October 4.

Some industrial employers are already giving support to Sir Samuel Hoare's "no sucking" appeal. The Journal of the National Union of Manufacturers says that wholesale strikes which threaten firms are causing a good deal of talk among employers, and may give rise to very serious trouble.

It is recognized that small employers will attractively themselves and that other employers will discharge their staffs doing everything possible to soften the blow.

"There are, however," it says, "few firms, some of which are well-to-do, who have not acted in this public-spirited way, but have discharged large numbers of their employees with no more than legal notice."

Many of these men are in the territories, and of forty-four men in one particular unit fourteen were receiving some form of allowance from their former employer and forty were laid off.

One man whose former pay was more than £200 a year was receiving from the Army 75s. weekly for himself and 25s. separation allowance for his wife and family. At the same time labourers employed in digging the trenches beside his unit were earning pay amounting to 4s. and 5s. a week.

ALLIES SIGN MUTUAL AID PACT WITH TURKEY

Triumph For British And French Diplomacy STAFF TALKS BEGUN

London, October 19. A TREATY OF MUTUAL ASSISTANCE BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN, FRANCE AND TURKEY WAS SIGNED THIS EVENING IN ANKARA.

The Commander of the British forces in the Middle East, General Wevell, and the former French Chief of Staff, General Moyrand, arrived at Ankara, by air, yesterday for Staff conversations with the Turkish General Staff which began today.

Some after their arrival the two Generals exchanged visits with the Chief of the Turkish General Staff and the Turkish Minister of Defence.

Official staff conversations began this morning. They were followed by Paris diplomatic circles say that Turkey has agreed to sign, formally, the mutual assistance agreement with Britain and France and that these will be signed in Ankara.

The agreement will provide all-weather mutual assistance in the Eastern and Mediterranean theatres. It will also provide for diplomatic consultations over any question which may arise.

The Turkish Press today is generally approving the Turkish Government's policy of the Soviet's proposal which was considered in London only with Turkey's own views.

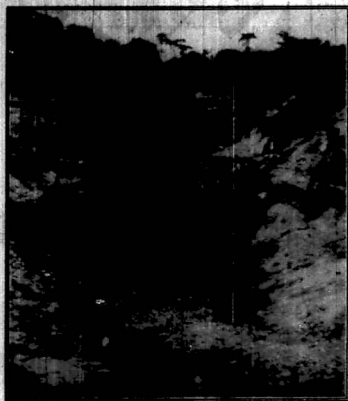
