TURKEY DECIDES
Another Aid to Stability
A cordial welcome has been given in Britain, France and Turkey to the Mutual Assistance Pact between the three countries signed in the Turkish capital on Thursday afternoon. In Italy it is regarded as a helpful development because it strengthens the possibilities of creating a peace bloc in the Balkans which, by bringing Turkey to southern Europe, stability is in line with the often expressed Italian principles of foreign policy. So far as can be judged through the official press behind the Turkish-Soviet talks in Moscow are not yet clear, the decision of Turkey to keep the Danubian and the Bosphorus open to Allied warships is not likely to make any difference to the friendship between Ankara and the Soviet Union. No doubt it is a disappointment to Mr. Stalin and M. Molotov that their own method of assuring the security of the Balkans and peace in the Black Sea area has been rejected in favour of dependence on the strength and democratic principles of Britain and France combined with Turkey, but the Balkan countries themselves, and Italy too, obviously prefer an open alliance between Turkey and the Western Powers to a Pact which would have suggested, in fact, if not in exact terms, an expansion of Russian influence in South-East Europe simultaneous in its diplomatic timing with Soviet domination of the Baltic. The Balkan countries and Italy are well aware that from their point of view the new Pact has no aggressive meaning; they would have been less easy in mind if Turkey had entered into an agreement with the agents of Bolshevism. Particulary would they have been uneasy if that agreement had followed so closely on the Berlin-Moscow Pact. The terms of the understanding with Turkey were actually laid down in London and Paris as long ago as last May. They were related then, though the agreement is now more comprehensive, to possible acts of aggression in the Mediterranean. The talks followed naturally on the guarantees given by Britain and France to Greece and Rumania and were a prelude to the attempt to reach an understanding with Russia which, had the move succeeded, would have

completed the circle of the Peace Front round Hitler and might have avoided the present war. The Russian talks broke down but the consequences for France and Britain have not been serious, and there is as yet nothing to suggest that Russia intends to offer Germany military help. The Pact with Turkey, which that eventually made likely because of facts of geography show that freedom of the Straits means that the Allies can use the belligerent Black Sea power and can also carry out their pledge to protect Rumania should Hitler get dispersed, in desperation, to overrun that country. The Ankara Pact has the further importance of giving protection to the Near East, and to the great interests of Britain and France there, against any aggression and also adds mobility to the present system of defence. It is a big stride forward in attack in the Mediterranean area. Under the late Karim Ataturk, who has since died, Turkey has followed a realist and pacific policy in foreign affairs. Turkey, by this agreement have not only safeguarded their security and made a contribution to the peace of a wide area; they have harnessed the economic, financial and naval resources of the British and French Empires to their service and have had the wisdom, in 1939, of being on the side which will win this war. Britain and France have no claims or ambitions which can possibly threaten Turkey, but the same could not be said either of Russia or of Germany. Stability in the Balkans is of the greatest importance at the present time, not only because it will tend to limit the scope of conflict but because it effectively bars the way to the East which Germany has long cherished ambitions and where ever Russia sustains a hope is being given to the Balkans. Turkey, in alliance with Greece, Yugoslavia and Rumania is a member of the Balkan Pact, and relations between Bulgaria and Turkey have recently been improving while Italy has regarded the whole situation with interest and concern. It is to be hoped that Turkey will have its beneficent repercussions on the Near East as well as on the Balkans and should lead to a steadily improving relationship between all the Balkan Powers. The fact that Turkey is also in friendly relations with the British and French Empires, the fact that Turkey is also an ally of the Soviet Union, and the fact that Turkey is in alliance with the Near East, are of great importance. It is also not unlikely that Turkey's good neighbour relations with Russia will react to the ultimate advantage of the Allies in so far as Russia's foreign policy is concerned and her attitude to the present conflict. And as Turkey's friendship, as keeper of the Straits, is of importance to every Mediterranean power, the new Pact may help Signor Mussolini to strengthen his already wobbly position and to take any military initiative. From the angle of Allied diplomacy, Turkey will be a useful neutral friend so far as Europe is concerned, and from every point of view the Ankara Pact is a sound and businesslike diplomatic move carrying a step further the isolation of Hitlerism.

MR. HORE BELISHA'S REVIEW OF THE WAR

No Peace Until Nazi Peril Is Removed

In a speech broadcast in Britain last night Mr. Hore Belisha, the Secretary for War reviewed the progress of the war after seven weeks.

He again made it clear that the Allies had no intention of sacrificing men in wasteful offensives on the West a front and that peace would only be restored when the total defeat of Nazism had been ensured.

The official communiqué on the Western Front issued in Paris on Friday night says that the war was quiet and reconnoitring activity being the order of the day. The French made a few prisoners. There was local artillery activity in the same region. All was quiet generally on the front east of the line.

The distinguishing feature of yesterday was artillery activity by both sides though this was not heavy. The evening communiqué had nothing further to report. Earlier reports spoke of harassing enemy activity.

World Gone Back To Savagery

A POLICY FOR PEACE: FEDERATED NATIONS
 To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
 Sir,—A letter in your correspondence column headed "A Policy for Peace" is a good lead for the discussion of World Federation. I don't agree with his approval of the League of Nations. The League of Nations has proved a farce and was bound to prove a failure. May I mention a few of its achievements:— 1914—Dispute between Sweden and Finland settled. 1921—War between Greece and Italy prevented. 1922—War which had broken out between Greece and Turkey stopped after a few days. 1924—Dispute between Hungary and Yugoslavia settled. The League of Nations is a failure. The League of Nations is a failure. The League of Nations is a failure.

The present objective is to discuss some other way to deal with international problems and the proposal of R.B. supported by Clarence. Sir's book "United World" is well worth careful consideration. All will agree that there are definite conditions in the organization of the world which make it likely and one of these is a supposed or real condition of peace and stability in access to the necessities and amenities of life. Each nation is concerned to do as well as it can, as far as possible, for its own requirements and to find markets for as many of its surplus goods as possible outside its own borders. The fact is that it is impossible in the modern world for any nation to become completely self-sufficient, while there are other reasons. War is undoubtedly provoked by the lack of resources conceived to be required.

Will sanity and wisdom with the new against pity and catastrophe? Modern war and human folly cannot be stopped by the League of Nations, it can only destroy and battle and produce confusion. Will not be wise for men of knowledge and understanding to examine these new while the war is proceeding all or any machinery and system which would enable them to apply the necessary wisdom in world home-making in the interests of the common folk? Cannot we, at this stage, consider what was in America? When George Washington pronounced the Union of the various States there were only 13 ready to federate. The rest were not. Each one self-contained and with its own government, but tied to the Union. The only break there has been was the Civil War, during the presidency of Andrew Jackson. Abraham Lincoln, about slavery, is not the time to rise for Europe to follow that splendid example? The solution would be to consider it as great as in the case of the American States.

On this question, we the population of East and South Africa occupy a very peculiar position. Italy, France, Britain, Portugal, Belgium and South Africa, all would gain by such a Union. The title suggested by Lord Alton in 1913 (I believe) was "United Nations"—as it would allow for the inclusion of the British Dominions. The object of the war as at present stated is to destroy Hitlerism—not Herr Hitler or Germany—but a constructive policy can be stated. It is to be noted that the restoration of Poland, an unclaimed conference in 1918, the restoration of Germany by the Corridor, the restoration of Czech-Slovakia, equal rights and privileges of all federated states in all the Colonies at present governed by the respective nations, but which would now be governed and controlled by the Federation, in which case the terms of the Dornier White Paper should prevail in regard to African Union.

In this connection, one cannot forget the immense service rendered to Germany and Italy in the reconstruction of their respective countries by

In Futile Raids On Britain

Last week was a bad one for German aircraft engaged in raids against Britain. Sixteen aircraft are known to have been brought down while others were so crippled that it is unlikely they were able to return to Germany.

Despite the fact that there were air raid warnings on all but one day of last week, not a single enemy bomb has yet fallen on Britain.

On October 23, with the shooting down of the south-east coast of Scotland, the British defence forces have received those machines which were known to be crippled that they could not have the return sea passage after their raids.

Raiders' success by the British fighters was the destruction of one of two enemy machines which approached the south-east coast of Scotland early in the afternoon. Apparently the first British air raid since September 1 when a few German aircraft declared war and was a plane which fell into the sea and a collapsible boat was seen to leave the water.

Parts of the North-east coast of Scotland and an air raid occurred in the day when lighter aircraft went up to strategic positions.

Women, aged 16 to 45, have taken over much of the work of the Women's Auxiliary Territorial Service or A.T.S., as it is known. They are post-office clerks, clerks, or some of them wait at tables in the officers' or men's messes.
The Women's Auxiliary Territorial Service or A.T.S., as it is known, has ranks corresponding to those of the Regular Army. Privates are called "volunteers" and sergeant-major is the highest rank. The A.T.S. officers are addressed as "Miss" in distinction to those of the Army, who are addressed as "Colonel" or "Major".
Their uniform is khaki, with a pink peaked cap, and the Commandant of an A.T.S. group admits that there is no talk against make-up so long as it is reasonable. Editors of women's feature pages, who are interested in the A.T.S. girls on the correct method of harmonizing their faces with their khaki uniforms.
The large number of women who are volunteering for this service is a valuable quota of men for active fighting service.

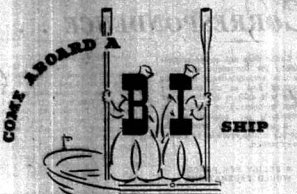

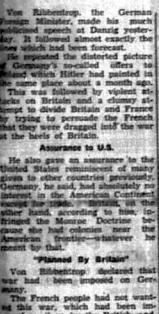

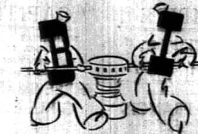

Customs Fraud

An echo of the far-off life of Kenya before the war was provided in our column yesterday by the report of a question asked by a Member of Parliament regarding what he called "smuggling" prosecutions in East Africa. The query elicited a lengthy reply from the Secretary of State for the Colonies. The question, which relates to a report made by the Governor of Kenya, related mainly to one case—the first, if we remember correctly, in a long series which does not yet appear to be ended. The peculiar circumstances of that initial case were dealt with editorially at the time, the point at issue being the questionable practice of conducting prosecution with such privacy that even the name of the accused did not appear in the public Press. After the point had been raised, and an official explanation made, it was agreed that in future the Press would be invited to attend the hearing of all cases which were considered advisable to deal with departmentally. Since then there have been many cases before the Courts and large sums have accrued to the Treasury from the heavy fines imposed.

But it cannot be assumed that prosecution at once and fines however severe, are in themselves sufficient to deal with the position which the extraordinary period of fraud revealed. They can be no doubt at all that a system of evading the payment of the proper amount of duty by the presentation of false invoices (some of which are believed to have been supplied as a regular practice by foreign merchants) has deprived the public revenue over a period of years of a very large amount of money and though the accidental discovery which led to the action has had the immediate effect of discouraging illegal practices, there is no assurance so far as the public are concerned that all cases have been discovered and that the result of the experience gained in the investigation, no more can occur without prompt detection.

The character of the frauds perpetrated on the most important source of public revenue proved to be so extensive that the position cannot well be allowed to rest where it is. In the interests of commercial confidence and morality, and to assure the public that the revenue is subject to adequate supervision, further action is called for than resort to the courts in each instance. No part of the punishment which is deserved should prevent fraudulent firms from carrying on business and if the Government of Kenya has any powers to withdraw trading licences from unscrupulous firms to renew them, it was not considered necessary to use those powers. Nor did the Courts in any case suggest an alternative form of punishment as an alternative to fines paid out of illegitimate profits of unknown amount. It should also be re-

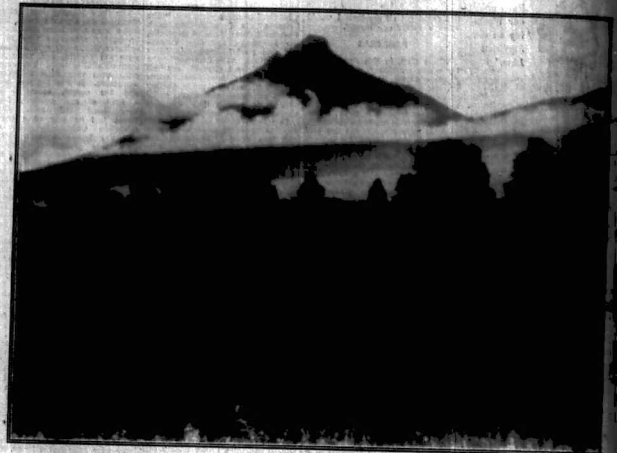

Customs Frauds

An echo of the far-off life of Kenya before the war was provided in our columns yesterday by a report of a question asked by a Member of Parliament regarding what he called "smuggling" prosecutions in East Africa. The query elicited a lengthy reply from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in which, among other things, it was stated that the Government, which relates to a report made by the Governor of Kenya, referred mainly to one case first, if we remained correctly, in a long series which does not yet appear to be ended. The initial circumstances of that case were described editorially at the time, the point at issue being the questionable practice of conducting a prosecution with such privacy that even the name of the accused did not appear in the public Press. After the point had been raised, and after explanation had been given, it was agreed that in future the Press would be invited to attend the hearing of all cases which it was considered advisable to deal with departmentally. Since then there have been many cases before the Courts and large sums have been levied in the heavy fines imposed.

But it cannot be assumed that protection alone, and fines, however heavy, are in themselves sufficient to deal with the position which the extraordinary series of frauds revealed. There is no doubt at all that a system of evading the payment of the proper amount of duty by the presentation of false invoices (some of which are believed to have been supplied to the practice by foreign merchants) have deprived the public revenue of a period of years of a very large amount of money. It is through the accidental discovery which led to action has had the immediate effect of discouraging further frauds, and has secured, so far as the public are concerned, that all cases have been discovered and that, as a result of the investigation, no more can occur without prompt detection.

THE WESTERN FRONT
Operations Held Up By Bad Weather

REPORTS OF GERMAN TROOPS MASSING BEHIND THE LINES

Rally weather continues to hamper activities on the Western Front. Patrols have, however, been busy on both sides on many parts of the front, and observers speak of German reinforcements massing behind their lines.

There was local artillery activity in the same region. All was quiet Saturday. The evening communique had nothing to say about the front. Earlier reports spoke of harassing enemy artillery fire. The German side reported increased activity. Reports from Luxembourg state that the German tanks were compelled to retreat from the Forest of Warfusse with the exception of two hills, on Friday night. The morning's communique said: "Night movements of German troops were not observed."

Planned Withdrawal
This movement was successfully effected on the whole from a depth in some places amounting to almost six miles. The units involved were withdrawn in accordance with a plan for an organized, but not a hasty, retreat. The system of permanent fortifications and trench lines, although not entirely destroyed, suffered significant damage. After some fluctuations the battle front was generally quiet. We took prisoners at different points.

All Quiet
This morning's French communique reports: "All quiet during the night. Patrols and small-scale activity on both sides on many parts of the front." British observers still speak of German reinforcements massing behind their lines. An official review of the German situation stated that sixty enemy supplies, including two motor vehicles, were brought down on the Western front since the war began.

Exaggerated

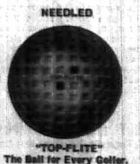

GERMAN AIRPLANES CAPTURED IN SCOTLAND

City of Flint Released After Exciting Chase By British Machines

U. S. CRITICISM OF SOVIET

U.S. criticism of Soviet actions is being expressed in the United States Government that the City of Flint has been released from German custody. The German plane was captured in Scotland on Saturday after an exciting chase by British fighters.

The German pilot showed great pluck and although two of his companions had been killed and another wounded when he was compelled to land, he made a determined effort to get into the air again.

London, Oct. 29. U.S. SENATE AGREES TO REMOVAL OF ARMS EMBARGO

Other War Expected To Approve Bill

By a majority of 335 votes the United States Senate has agreed to the removal of the arms embargo. The revised Neutrality Bill of which this is a part will now be considered by the House of Representatives where the Administration believes it will be passed by a small but safe majority.

October 29. The United States Senate has passed the Neutrality Revision Bill by vote of 83. The vote was taken on Friday. The bill, however, is not yet law as it must now go to the House of Representatives. As the bill now stands after various amendments during the Senate debate its main provisions are:

(1) The Arms Embargo is repealed so that arms may now be sold to belligerents for cash.

(2) American ships are forbidden to carry arms to any part of the world so long as belligerents who want arms must buy them themselves and pay before taking them away. This is what is known as the "cash-and-carry" provision of the bill.

(3) United States ships are permitted to trade with belligerents in the war areas such as Australia, South Africa and the West Indies.

(4) No belligerent may transport a ton in the United States.

Final Phase
The vote was clear for the Senate to reject by 73 votes to 17 an amendment requiring a referendum before the United States can go to war against any nation.

The Senate also rejected a proposal by Senator Rye for a substitute bill which included the Arms Embargo Clause.

GOVERNORS IN CONFERENCE
War-Time Tasks

Because the Imperial Govern-
ment did not appoint a supreme
Civil Authority in East Africa
when it was broke out, and the
peoples of the Territories,
taken unaware, had not pre-
pared the ground for considera-
tion of such a change, we are
compelled to fall back upon the
least drastic and much less sat-
isfactory alternative of the
machinery for consultation pro-
vided by the East African
Governors Conference. The
Conference will meet on
Wednesday in Nairobi. As
is unfortunately the usual prac-
tice, no details of the agree-
ments which have been published in advance
and no attempt has been made
by any of the Governors to
involve the public in the
Territories to suggest additions
to the official agenda though
there are many questions today
which ought to be included and
indeed, can hardly be over-
looked if the Conference is to
approach East Africa's war-
time tasks with reality.

As we see it, the most important of these tasks is to ensure coordination of the common effort. There has been in existence since war broke out a cumbersome system of political liaison officers whose duty it has been to keep contact between the various Governments and the headquarters of the military command. No doubt it has been made to work as successfully and smoothly as such a system can be expected to operate but it cannot compare in efficiency with the alternative of centralising authority in a single appointment. The question of a system should be examined by the Conference, and if it requires to be improved or altered the public will hope that the Governors will have the courage and wisdom to make proposals. The one fact which dominates every other consideration is that unity here is the fullest coordination in every direction there must assuredly and inevitably be not only overlapping but a serious waste of public money and of official man-power. What is far more important today than preserving the full use of the powers and resources of Eastern Africa for the twin purposes of securing the peace and of meeting the emergency and enabling them simultaneously to make their adequate contribution to the Imperial cause, all these aims must be achieved without trenching on the constitutional rights of the people or the responsibilities of the Civil Governments. There may be a temptation to forget that the Governors Conference is still only an advisory body under the guidance of the Secretary of State and the local Legislatures. We believe we are expressing an opinion which is not only true but that whatever may appear to be the advantages of turning the Governors Conference into an executive body of its own development must be resisted.

The problems which the Conference can usefully discuss are those which affect their number. The Governors must be well aware that though the process of building up an adequate military establishment must go forward, the public are still worried about the expenditure of money for the purpose and must not abate one jot their contentment that the Civil Government should not abandon a single responsibility to their public, particularly in matters of the public conscience. To the general question is also related the maintenance of the financial structure for local purposes. It is important that the general thoroughgoing policy of progressive development, based on the provision of an adequate primary production, these young countries cannot hope to maintain financial stability of any kind unless they have a not inexpensive social services, particularly for Africans, and it will be useless to fall back on increased taxation for these purposes, either in order to make a gesture of East Africa's willingness to make sacrifices or to represent revenues, unless at the same time there is a realistic appreciation of the need for stringent economy and the willingness to do so vigorously with costs which in altered conditions cannot be justified.

There are, too, the allied questions of proper distribution of man-power and the need of an agricultural production and commercial rehabilitation policy. These things should be discussed on an East African basis. The whole man-power of the Territories, official and unofficial, should be pooled together to defend the common purposes, so that the burden is fairly distributed and if there are Departments of Government which are engaged in activities which can save money and men by coordinating their work and their staffs, the public has a right to expect that the Governors will regard the war effort in that light. Nor is it impossible to deal with control of shipping and the need for shipping needs and the planning of agricultural production except on an East African basis unless we are willing to pay for

the results of uncoordinated plans. The same argument applies, of course, to currency policy and price fixation and restrictions and it is particularly applicable to the task of entering into businesslike relations with the Government regarding the purchase of the surplus products of these countries. In this connection we would raise the question of the future of the London Office, dealt with by a correspondent a few days ago. ALLIED FORCES FULLY PREPARED Ready to Resist Any Intensification of Aerial Warfare

According to reports from the Western Front Allied air forces are fully prepared to resist any intensification of war in the air, as threatened by Field Marshal Goering.

British planes are more suited to the strain of war conditions than those of the enemy, and the determination and skill of British pilots in pressing home attacks indicate superior morale as well as better equipment.

The present attitude of the Royal Air Force is that there are many targets which could quite legally be regarded as military ones, but which should be bombed without causing death or injury to some civilians and, for that reason, they have held their hands.

Bitter Performance
The observer says that so far as it is possible to draw conclusions British planes still put up a much better performance than those of the Germans and are more suited to the strain of war conditions. He adds that pilots he said, "so much more modern and more confident than those of the enemy."

Hazardous Conditions
The Royal Air Force crews who take part in reconnaissance flights over Germany now have to face bitterly cold weather.
