DEADLOCK REMAINS ON RAILWAYMEN'S CLAIM

THE New Year opened in Britain with a bleak industrial outlook. There was no sign of a solution to disputes which threaten a national railway strike and a stoppage at airports. Construction engineers engaged in lightning 'gorilla' strikes throughout the country, boycotted the opening of a Government arbitration tribunal appointed to consider their request for a pay increase. More than 100,000 workers engaged in a wage increase and changed working conditions. There was no indication of a break in the deadlock over a wage claim dispute which threatens a national rail strike next Sunday. A Government court of inquiry into the dispute was unable to reconcile the conflicting viewpoints of the 100,000-strong National Union of Railwaymen and a British Transport Commission. The union has called a strike in protest at the rejection of a claim for the balance of a 15 per cent rise in wage levels. At London Airport, union members are continuing to support for a strike called by the Transport Workers' Union. Always next Thursday, they have received qualified backing from official unions on the trade union side of the dispute. The only bright spot on the industrial scene was at Coventry, where leaders of the 11,000 men on strike at the Standard Motor Company accepted proposals agreed between the company and the trade unions. 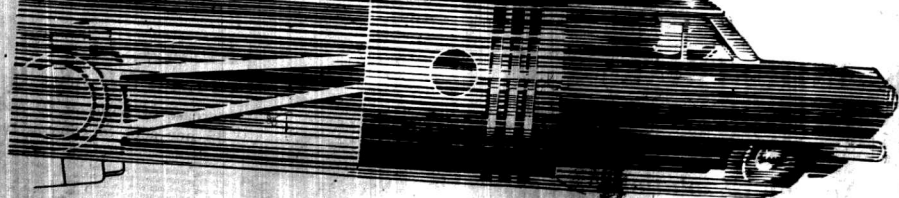

CLEARED TO resume traffic

Shipping expected

TANKER FREED FROM COLLAPSED BRIDGE

THE Suez Canal—blocked since Friday when the Ferdinand Bridge collapsed after being struck by the Liberator tanker World Peace—was cleared yesterday. Navigation through the entire length of the canal was expected to be resumed on a full scale late last night or early this morning.

After hundreds of engineers and technicians had struggled for days to clear the obstruction caused by the tanker's bridge, the ship was finally refloated on Sunday night and proceeded towards Port Said.

By midnight congestion in Suez Bay, 22 ships beagulating up towards the Great Bitter Lakes, where they could wait for the remainder of the journey northwards.

More than 200 ships were immobilized by the blockade and, to prevent further pilings up at Port Said and Suez, signals were sent out to vessels heading for the canal to hold their fire for the moment until the bottleneck had been cleared.

The big operation of clearing the canal was divided into three stages. The first consisted of pulling out of two large barges which had slipped between the bank and the 10,000-ton World Peace, an attempt to float out a 173-ton section of the bridge which had crashed down on the tanker's bow.

This was carried out successfully and enabled the ailing tanker to drift further.

The second—and most crucial—operation was to cut the bridge into sections which could be lifted away by a 130-ton crane.

The third stage was to clear the canal of the wreckage of the bridge.

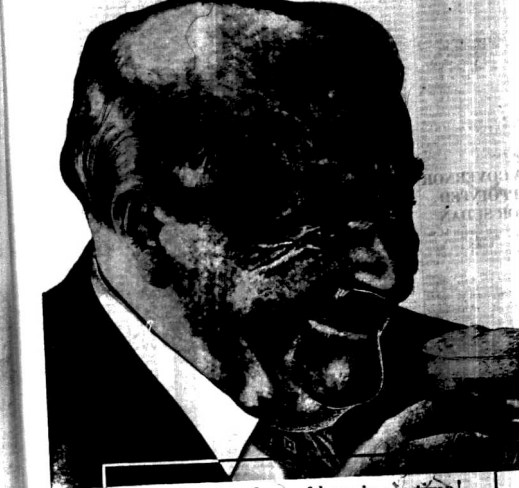

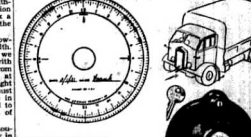

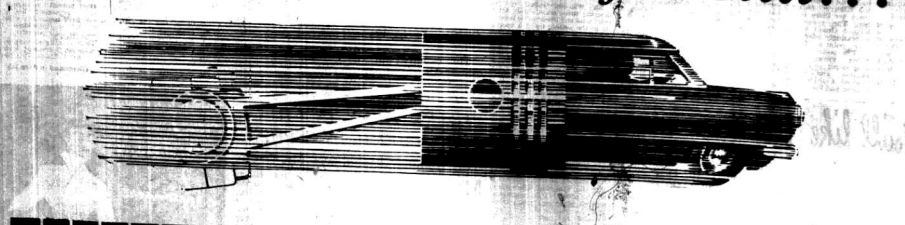

Report by Mr. E. A. Vasey

In a detailed report, Mr. E. A. Vasey, Kenya's Minister of Finance, has recommended to the Zanzibar Government that Zanzibar Railway Council should submit a report by July 1 and take over a much wider degree of responsibility for services in the town. Mr. Vasey underlines a survey of the positions about a year ago at the request of the Zanzibar Government, and found there was a strong desire for advancement in the sphere of local government.

In his report he said: "Believing that what is desired for responsibility should be given to people it is better that that which should be met by the creation of a department of public works can be transferred to an authority which is a local government, and that a sense of responsibility will be allowed to grow to his and assist in the development of the town and the central Government." He suggested that the Council should be empowered to grant the Zanzibar Railway Council increased responsibility in the control of matters of revenue and local interest in the industrial Zanzibar town.

He continued: "I recommend also that the local government authority to be created, if their recommendation is accepted, should be re-named as the Municipal Council and should be formed on July 1."

Mr. Vasey pointed that the new Municipal Council should consist of 15 elected members, three Government nominated representatives, three members of the public, and one member of the public, to be the president.

Responsible voters
Giving his reasons for recommending the transfer of public works to a local authority, Mr. Vasey said he believed that, in a situation such as that existing in Zanzibar, the expansion of services should be directed to the benefit of the town, and the creation in the district representative of a sense of common responsibility to all citizens rather than that of a particular class.
