## STOPPAGE CALLED OFF Wage increase for lowest grades

**NEGOTIATIONS CONTINUE ON OTHER SCALES**

**THE nation-wide strike by British railway workers, due to have started tomorrow night, has been called off. Telegrams to this effect have been sent to all branches of the National Union of Railways.**

The decision was taken by the executive of the union during a three-hour meeting in London, after a meeting with Sir Brian Robertson, chairman of the British Transport Commission—which operates the State-owned railways—to reopen talks on the wage dispute.

The immediate result of the new negotiations was an increase in rates of pay for men in the lowest grades. Discussion on the other scales are continuing.

As both sides sat down for the talks, held at the Ministry of Labour, bargainers poured into the N.U.R. headquarters from branches all over the country. It was clear that there must be "no compromise." At the same time the N.U.R. secretary, Mr. Jim Campbell, warned that if the negotiations were not satisfactory the union would resume the strike and still maintain its demand for a 10 per cent increase.

Mr. Campbell said the union had reached its decision in the light of assurances given by the commission. These included promises to do business quietly and without haggling; that basic pay rates would be re-examined; and that the wage rates would be adjusted in the light of past years.





## FRANCE PROPOSES NEW ARMS POOL PLAN Output agency for European Union

**Weapons restrictions  
extended to Britain**

FRANCE has submitted new proposals for a European armaments production pool to Britain, West Germany, Italy, Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg.

The proposal contained in a memorandum intended to be a working document and a basis of discussion at the Paris agreement for the production pool to be independent of the Paris agreement on the armaments control agency, the Organisation for European Co-operation.

The control agency's function is to see that the pool does not exceed the armaments ceilings agreed, and that in bacteriological and chemical. The strategic area is West Germany.

Three or more of the seven nations could get together for a standardisation of specifications and a working stage would start on January 1, 1971, with the setting up of a central agency with a strong degree of independence from that of the existing production pool.
