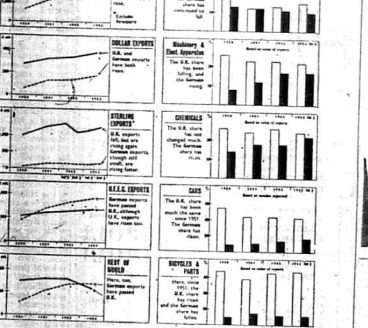

TRADE DEFICIT OF S. AFRICA REDUCED

SOUTH Africa's balance of payments deficit for the first half of the year 1935-36 was £2,300,000, compared with £6,900,000 in 1934 and £10,000,000 in 1933, according to a trade review by the Southern African Revenue Authority.

The actual trade deficit, without taking into account the country's gold output, was £1,140,000,000 in 1935 and £1,050,000,000 in 1934, according to the same authority. It was £1,400,000,000 in 1933, when the gold output was £2,300,000,000.

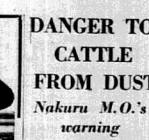
