Bill to abolish existing passes

changes in the present system of issuing entry passes to the new proposals for the Kenya Government to a new bill introduced in today's Kenya Gazette. The Bill repeals all existing passes, including residents' certificates of 19 new types of pass.

To avoid difficulty, the Bill proposes that existing permits and entry permits should remain in force until the holders are required to apply for one of the new permits.

Provisions for exemption

There are, however, provisions for certain classes of non-citizen to be exempted at the discretion of the Minister responsible for administering the Immigration laws.

The new classes of permit include those covering various types of employment — with private employers, the Government, the Common Services Organisation, or voluntary for dependants.

Professional immigrants may be exempted from the provisions of the Bill, but such exemption may be subject to such conditions as the Government may think fit to impose.

Other categories cover missionaries, teachers (subject to a limit on being able to acquire independent status), professional men, people under contract to work in agriculture, fisheries or stock raising, and persons who have secured the services of the Government.

As part of this Bill, the Government has also introduced a new Bill to amend the provisions of the Immigration Act, 1952, which relate to the country's benefit.

The new Bill will require every non-citizen, unless exempted, to have a valid entry permit.

It also sets out in detail 12 categories of non-citizen, including those persons who are holders of certain types of permits, and those who are holders of certain types of permits.

ARMOURD CARS CORDON OFF ADEN MOSQUE

TWELVE British armoured cars were met by bursts of machine-gun and rifle fire when they moved into the Sheikh Othman — nicknamed 'Little Vietnam' — area of Aden yesterday and cordoned off a mosque.

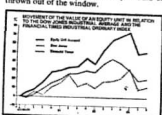

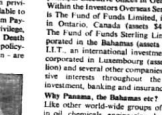

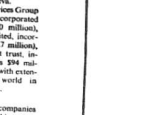
Graph showing the performance of the Dover Equity Plan Policy compared to the Financial Times Industrial Average from 1946 to 1966.

Kenya Factory's new pig price structure will mean profits of up to 45/- a carcass

The new pig price structure will mean profits of up to 45/- a carcass for Kenya producers when it takes effect on May 1.

Details of the increased prices — designed to boost farmers' incomes and eliminate the bacon deficit — were released yesterday, 21 days after the decision was first made at an Up-lander' block meeting in Nairobi.

At the same time producers were urged not to hold back pig from delivery over the next two weeks in order to obtain higher prices. In a letter to farmers, the managing director, Mr. Paul McAnroy said: "May 1 therefore is the spirit in which it is offered."

Prices have been increased throughout the grading and weight range. They include a rise of 15c a pound for top-quality carcasses, from 1/60 to 1/65 — meaning on average a profit boost of about 25/- per producer.

The European Economic Community has insisted that the European Commission should seek a new negotiation mandate for an agreement of association between "The Six" and Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania for a better agricultural deal.

This was stated from Brussels yesterday by Mr. A. Banangya, the officer in charge of the Common Services office established last year as a permanent link with the European Community.

The East African countries are seeking a better deal for their agricultural products in the negotiations. Mr. Banangya said it was a matter of greater flexibility on one side being matched on the other. "We have accepted the E.E.C.'s interpretation of the reciprocity principle on tariffs and we have insisted that the Commission seek a new mandate from its Council of Ministers."

He pointed out that the existing mandate did not include "certain provisions" covering East Africa's tropical agricultural products — "in fact, all our trade which is competition with those of the 12 associated States is affected."

British Market move

Mr. Banangya added: "Coffee, of course, is one of the sensitive products, but there is also the more annual cash crops of the Six. It is not major importers, but they have to protect the interests of Malagasy, which is an associated State."

The East African States were willing to resume negotiations in the future. The matter was now up to the E.E.C. African diplomatic sources in London emphasized that the British move under the Commission's mandate was bearing on East Africa's negotiations.

As the matter did not point out that the Commission is granting conditional tariff reductions to the Community which will be a very different situation for more than 10 per cent of British trade with East Africa is not covered by the existing arrangements. 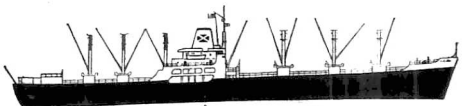

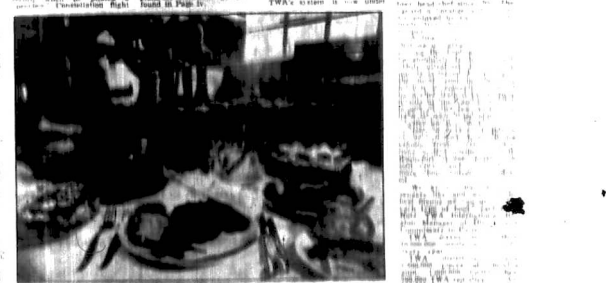

Automation will speed delivery of air cargo

TRANS World Airlines has announced plans for the construction of four more fully automated air cargo terminals in Europe so advanced they can load or unload a 100-ton capacity cargo jet within half an hour.

Designed to give shippers the fastest most efficient service in the air transport industry, the new "Cape" terminals will be constructed between 1964 and 1970 at Frankfurt, Paris, Milan and Rome—conveniently spaced around the world.

Earlier construction of a similar terminal at London was announced as well as terminals in the U.S. at Philadelphia, Detroit and Dayton.

The boom in cargo and air freight is forcing airlines to build extensive cargo terminals construction programs. TWA's vice-president, Francis J. Tomblin, said: "The Boeing 747 is the delivery giant of the air industry. It will carry 100 tons of cargo three times as much

as a present-day Boeing 707 freighter.

Between 1960 and 1963, TWA's transatlantic cargo tonnage and revenue tripled. "Our forecasts predict another 2-3 fold increase in transatlantic cargo volume," said Mr. Tomblin. "Obviously, today's ground facilities just won't be adequate for this volume."

TWA is the first airline to construct cargo terminals specifically designed to handle Boeing 747s which will be the backbone of the air-cargo industry during the 1970s," Mr. Tomblin said.

Here is how a typical shipment might flow through one of the new TWA terminals when a shipper's cargo arrives at the terminal. The cargo is unloaded into a freight car and the paperwork is prepared in the spot. An electronic sorting device on the front of the cart is programmed as to flight and destination, and the cart starts its journey through the terminal on a conveyor system. It under-the-floor chain drive moves the cart along at 125 feet a minute.

The low cart is directed to either an automated storage rack, from which it can be called back on a trolley crane called back on a trolley crane at the proper time. The automated storage rack system consists of a series of multi-level bins in which the low carts are stored, much like an automatic car garage.

In the build-up area, the cargo is taken from the low cart and placed in a container, marked by the flight number. A three-dimensional scanner should fit snugly in a 707.

Once fitted, the container proceeds over a conveyor system into storage racks—similar in operation to the automated low cart storage racks. Before loading, Boeing 747 containers are arranged in support airplanes on a second-level conveyor system having the same weight as the floor of the air rack. This permits TWA to load the 747 rapidly by taking advantage of its unique new loading characteristics.

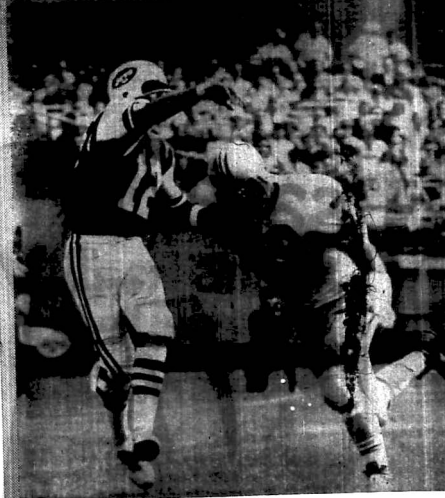
