Count Pöschke said last night that his visit reflects the German people's concern about the suffering in Nigeria. "It is essential that we should be able to do something to help them," he said.



At the same time, U. Thant announced the U.N. presence of Ivory Coast, Gabon, Tanzania and Zambia — the four African countries who have recognised the breakaway State — to a meeting later yesterday.

He is to ask the four to intervene with Biafran officials so that they cooperate fully with others undertaken to help the Biafran population.

Transfer tax fails to give balance in textiles

Textile exporters have been disappointed to find that the transfer tax introduced by the Government has not given the industry the balance it had hoped for. The Government had expected that the tax would result in a net gain of 10% for the industry, but the actual result has been a net loss of 5%.

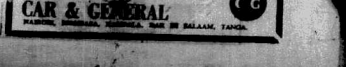

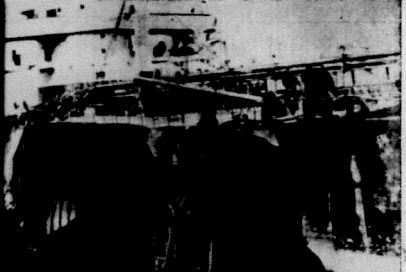

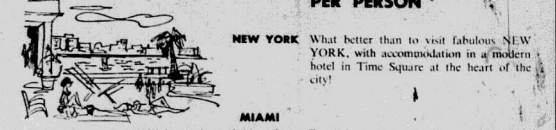
HELP PROMISED FOR NEWSPAPERS

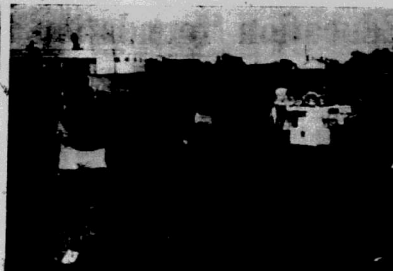

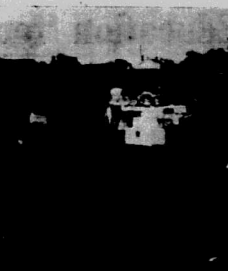

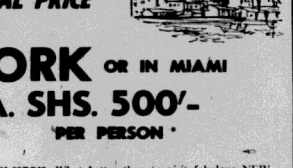

Crisis in wool threatens knitting industry

Women are on the warpath. Knitting wool that has been tried and trusted for years in Kenya will have to give way to a locally produced substitute, the quality and prices of which are very much in doubt.

Restrictions on the importation of lower and medium priced wools were introduced early this year to protect an industry at Eldoret that intends to fill all Kenya's knitting wool needs.

The Indian company which introduced the wool had intended to start production of wool by April this year, and machinery was to have been installed five months before this.

As yet the machinery has not arrived in the country from India and though company representatives claim that production should start in about two months, it seems clear that it will not be later another five months after the arrival of machinery, when local wool is put on the market.

Meanwhile, shops in Nairobi are running short of the more costly, and heavier, wools which will be depended upon for local wool. It is expected to reach the shops.

This has already led to complications. There are at least 30 women in the area who are small knitting contractors at Nairobi, and each of these has a number of other women working for her. These women are earning about 10/- a week.

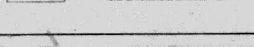

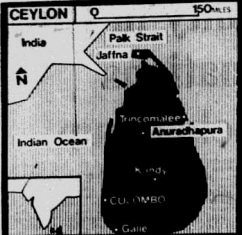

WORLD-WIDE OPERATIONS SHOW EXCELLENT RESULTS

SALES increased 16.2% to \$1,779.4 million, including excise taxes.

EXPORTS accounted for \$353.4 million of sales, up 27.5%.

INVESTMENTS were \$317.6 million, 32% more than in 1966.

AMORTIZATION and depreciation for the year amounted to \$208.5 million, an increase of 12%.

The sales of property, plant and equipment totaled only a fraction under \$1 billion, an accumulated depreciation and amortization coverage of 42%.

Despite a rise of 16% in costs, expenses and taxes (lease tax amounted to 27% of sales, net income before income tax rose 40.5% to \$482 million, with a final accrual basis net of \$316 million, up 50% from 1966).

Employment increased to a total of 59,051 persons (12,491 working abroad) and the average employment cost per person also increased to \$4,623 from \$4,350 in 1966. At year's end the ENI group of companies numbered 115.

PRODUCTION AND REFINING: Despite a very sharp increase in Russian crude oil production, the occupation of Siat, the Nigerian fighting and diminished production in Italy, occurred in lighting overall average production to about 1,000 barrels per calendar day.

Natural gas production in Italy registered a gain of 5.3% over 1966 for a total of 350 billion cubic feet.

Refinery crude runs increased 9.1% for the year, averaging for the 11 affiliated ENI refineries about 470,000 barrels per stream day. The quantity of refined products manufactured rose 3.4% above 1966.

PRODUCT SALES: Strong gains were registered in Italy for AGIP sales of gasoline, especially "Supercostomigliatore" premium grade, up 18.5%. Diesel sales increased 10.5% and fuel sales 10.9%. "Kerapp" kerosene sales rose 63% and "Tand Arco Extra" light heating oil deliveries up 9.3% above 1966. A new gasol type heating oil named "Epori" was put on the market for use in localities with air pollution problems. Diesel motor oil sales gained 10.7% respectively for road and marine use. "Appias" LPG sales were 2.8% higher while heavy fuel oils registered a 5.2% drop in sales.

RETAIL MARKETING FACILITIES AND SERVICES — New retail outlets for auto service in Italy and abroad during 1967 numbered 589. In Italy eight were super-station centres with complete rest and restaurant services for motorists, 52 were complete rest and restaurant services and 117 were regular fully equipped service stations.

The total number of service outlets in 22 foreign countries at the end of the year numbered 1,546.

Fully equipped AGIP motor hotels operating in Italy at year-end were 37.

CHEMICAL OPERATIONS — Capacities for production of ethane, polyethylene, hydrogen and vinyl acetate monomer were considerably increased during 1967 at the Gela and Rasenna plants of AGIP. A first phosphoric acid plant went on stream at the ISAI plant (Gela) and preliminary test runs were made on the new Gela acrylonitrile plant. A second project aimed for acrylic fiber production was activated at Val Bassotto and a new catalytic plant began operation at Costanzoguerra.

Chemical and petrochemical sales produced about 27% more revenue than in 1966. Showing marked gains in sales volume were other (4.9%), fertilizers (3.2%), cement (1.1%) and rubbers (0.7%) with plastics and carbon black engineering plastics increasing. New planning calls for construction of facilities for producing polyester fibres, for increasing production of separation of aromatics, and for the fabrication of plastic products from synthetic resins.

ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION SERVICES — Strong demand from abroad for SNAM Progetti services brought an increase of 55% in foreign revenues for a total of \$302 million including the value of relative construction materials supplied. Pipeline and plant construction contracts, carried on for some 100 companies in 20 different countries, were including Italy, on 42 different projects.

MECHANICAL MANUFACTURING — Nuovo Pignone and its subsidiaries registered well-continued production and sales activities. Sales for this sector totalled \$66 million with foreign sales accounting for about 64% of revenues. Pignone had sales were particularly satisfactory in spite of strong competition with a 1967 revenue of \$630 million from marketing the 1966 level following a general national trend, predominantly industrial control valves and automation equipment.

TEXTILES — The sale of textiles dropped slightly below the 1966 level following a general national trend, predominantly notable for woollens. Revenue from this sector totalled \$82 million. With this year's investments of \$11.5 million, Lanerossi has completed a four-year plant renewal and rationalization programme costing about \$38.4 million.

HIGHLIGHTS

Exploratory and development rights held by group companies in 12 countries at the end of 1967 covered 58,885,000 acres.

Saudi Arabia granted an exploration and exploitation concession to AGIP encompassing some 19 million acres. This agreement features novel contractual concepts comprising joint ventures between Petromin and ENI for future downstream operations including petrochemicals.

Permits were obtained, jointly with others, for exploration of about 32 million acres in Abu Dhabi territory.

Bids were also submitted for acreage in Madagascar, Tanzania and Argentina, and as part of a consortium (55% AGIP), for nine blocks of Dutch offshore area.

In Italy and on the Italian continental shelf AGIP and subsidiaries were granted 526,000 acres of which 368,000 were jointly held with Shell Italia.

New commercial reserves ascertained during the year totalled approximately 6.5 billion barrels of oil, and new gas field discoveries are estimated to hold five trillion cubic feet.

ENI's planned accentuation of petrochemical activities was strengthened by the decision to construct a 1,000 metric ton per day ammonia plant in Southern Italy.

For the first time since building Italy's first nuclear power plant at Latina ENI was back in the commercial nuclear energy field with supply of engineering for two experimental fuel processing plants for CNEN and the completion of a special fast re-processor fuel for CAMEX. New legislation has directed ENI to assume initiatives in the field of supplying and processing nuclear fuel.

150,000 POWER PROJECT

Lamu switches on

Lamu, the historic island of the northeast coast of Kenya which has remained almost unharmed for hundreds of years, will tonight be transformed into a blaze of lights.

What gives the distant empire a radiance of 150,000 watt lighting is the island by the East African Power and Lighting for an occasion which will mark another important milestone in its long-term development programme for extension of power supplies to isolated areas as well as the over-estimated district headquarters and other smaller centres including ILO have been supplied with electricity under the rural electrification scheme which has been in operation for just over three years.

Ilobo was the first to be lighted on in June, 1960, at an estimated cost of £160,000, then the Kakamega project which cost the company £200,000 and third was Meru District, one of Kenya's highest agricultural potential areas where the demand for electricity has grown tremendously over the past two years.

The fourth extension, which took place in 1962, was at Mwasini Township on the border

of the area with the Indian Ocean. The area with the island of Lamu, which has been supplied with electricity, was the last to be lighted. The project was completed during the last year of the Government's first five-year plan.

Lamu, the most on the list, was first switched on in 1962. Further connections were carried out during the following year and approval is expected next year.

During construction work, which started in March, the 150,000 watt project required more than 100 tons of electrical equipment to be transported to the site of the project.

In fact, without the actual cooperation from the National Electric Power Corporation, Lamu and Lamu Island, Ltd. the most remote island in Kenya, would have taken the company much longer to complete the operation.

The East African Power and Lighting Co. is particularly grateful to the District Commissioner of Lamu, Mr. N. S. Njirani, for his assistance in the project.

The actual construction work, which has taken three months, included the installation of two new diesel electric generating sets together with the connecting switchboard and connecting cables, installation of five transformers, the erection of five miles of overhead power lines, installation of an estimated 150,000 watt lighting, and the construction of a substation to accommodate the site. The work was completed during the last year of the Government's first five-year plan.

Lamu, famed for its historic attractions, has grown a thriving tourism, which has greatly helped to build up the island's economy. The electricity supply will be brought through the island to the main town of Lamu. This will be done during the next few years.

Another important project producing the district is timber in the form of mangrove pulp. The project is still expected in the traditional way to be done in the Middle East.

In providing the power supply, the company has tried not to disturb the historic character of Lamu, that has made it a tourist attraction. It has been avoided by not erecting unsightly overhead lines and wherever it was necessary to make use of overhead lines they were routed so as to be as unobtrusive as possible.

Considerable use is also expected to be made of the electricity supply for air conditioning and for deep-freeze units on the already established tourist centres in this remote island.

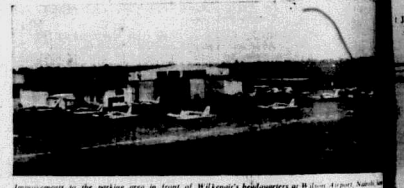

S. Africa's 'mercy men' beat apartheid barrier

Some of South Africa's leading doctors and surgeons want to establish a voluntary "Flying Hospital" service into Africa wherever it may be needed.

The basis for this plan is a medical shuttle service already in operation in South Africa. It ferries the small, under-equipped Independent African States which in an oval within South Africa.

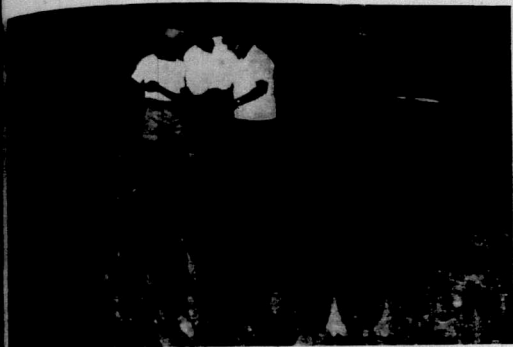

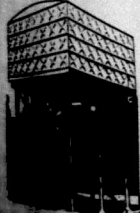

Honolulu talks shrouded in secrecy

Exceptional secrecy is being maintained about the coming confab in Honolulu between President Johnson and the South Vietnamese President, Gen. Van Thieu.

The conference which will be the two men's fifth meeting, seems likely to take place tomorrow and Saturday if it is thought in Washington that any official statement of the date might encourage Hanoi or the National Liberation Front to attack the conference with a spectacular military or psychological gesture.

The fact that the conference will take place on the fifth anniversary of the signing of the Geneva agreement, Washington military spokesmen, in view of the North Vietnamese attachment to ceremonial historical dates of this sort, is a source of speculation.

Moreover, despite recent relative

encouraging, announcements from Saigon the possibility of a major new offensive against Saigon cannot be ruled out. The Defense Secretary, Mr. Clifford, recently said that the United States would not intervene in the South Vietnamese civil war.

Washington officials were aware that the conference was "only a temporary substitute for the post-poned visit to the United States of Gen. Thieu. The postponement was said to have been decided on at the White House for internal political reasons.

Officials also said that the conference would certainly touch on three subjects. An assessment of the first ten weeks of the Paris talks, the South Vietnamese military situation and modernization of the South Vietnamese armed forces.

AMERICA TIGHTENS SMITH SANCTIONS

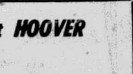
