# Trade licences news dispels buying interest

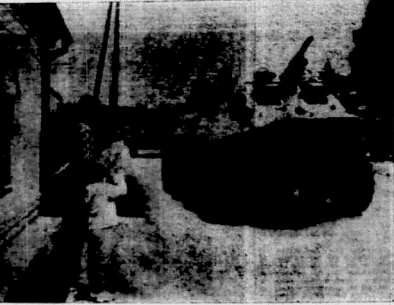

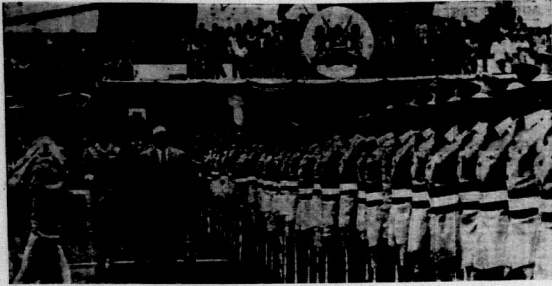

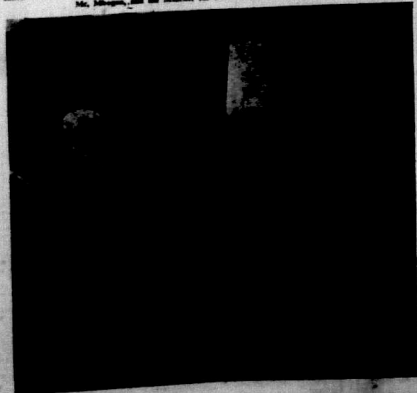
