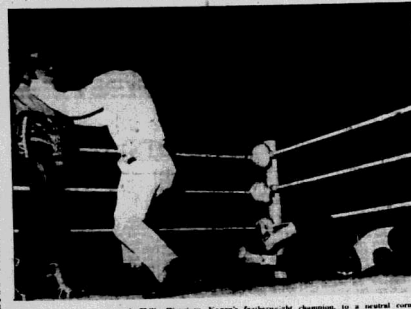
Robert Theriaq, the Kenya light middleweight champion, was never really in the fight against Uganda's team after Mabwa was

# Secession question Early stumbling block

no precedent for a people being voted of such respect and being at present threatened by abandonment to its aggressor. Also there has never been an example of any Government proceeding to the systematic extermination of a people by a barbarian means in violation of the most solemn promises made to all the nations of the earth — it is so today. It will be your tomorrow.

In his unanimous speech, delivered in a session developed at Oxford University and chaired during his training of a South-Eastern military training, Col. Ojukwu lambasted the Nigerian, accusing their leader, General Gowon, of being the "Hitler of Africa." Most of his words were aimed at the people who were taken up by recollections of the 1954-55 period in the north and present-day Biafran tragedy.

He claimed that Nigeria was bent on genocide against the Biafrans, that women and children were being tortured, raped and killed by thousands of Nigerian troops and that Nigeria was deliberately stopping Biafran supplies, getting through to the starving people.

It is a view often broken with caution, Col. Ojukwu added. "Yet I am sure people remain loyal and would die for what they know is their right."

Earlier, Chief Emekoro had told the conference that Nigeria was likely to negotiate a settlement of the Biafran crisis, adding that even well known had chosen for peace through a negotiated settlement.

But he was obviously surprised and angry by Col. Ojukwu's unanimous verdict. He spent the whole of his day morning studying the implications and planning a counter attack against the vehement leader before meeting with the Biafrans in the closely guarded conference hall.

He refused to meet at 9:30 a.m. yesterday as suggested by Emekoro because he would have time to confer with members of his delegation.

There is increasing speculation here as to whether the Nigerian leader, Gen. Gowon, will fit into a Biafran role in the future. A copy of the Biafran leader's speech was shown to the

day and Chief Emekoro is awaiting further instructions.

On Monday, Emperor Selassie met the delegations leaders separately at his palace here and said afterwards, "I cannot say I am hopeful about evolving a solution. We must find ways to bring both parties to harmonious accommodation. I say now in a time to look forward to achieving a permanent and viable peace in Nigeria and alleviate the human suffering that we have heard about."

But with both sides already showing that they have changed their views little since the abortive peace talks in Kampala last May, it is unlikely that they will reach any mutual agreement.

The talks are rejected to disintegrate inasmuch as Biafra is the one in Kampala — and if this happens Nigeria is likely to step up its attack against breakaway Biafra to force it back into the federation.

## More help promised

In Lucerne, two Swiss relief organizations have announced they now would send several thousand of relief to Biafra in the near future, apparently without waiting for Nigerian Federal approval.

The two bodies, Terre Des Hommes and the Swiss branch of Caritas, said it was possible to save many starving children in Biafra on condition that risk is preferred to diplomacy.

Nigeria has already threatened to shoot down any plane flying into Biafra without Federal clearance.

## BIAFRA ACCUSED OF ATROCITIES

The Government of Nigeria's South-Eastern State has claimed in an strongly dossier that 10,000 of its civilian population had been taken to Biafran concentration camps, and thousands more murdered.

The dossier of alleged atrocities in Biafra was submitted to the United Nations in the State said that the murdered people were shot, drowned or buried alive.

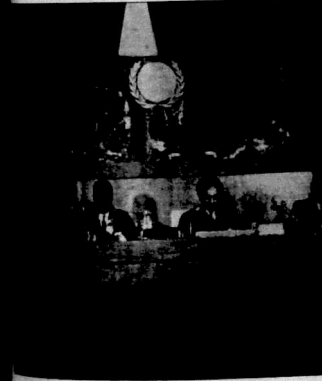

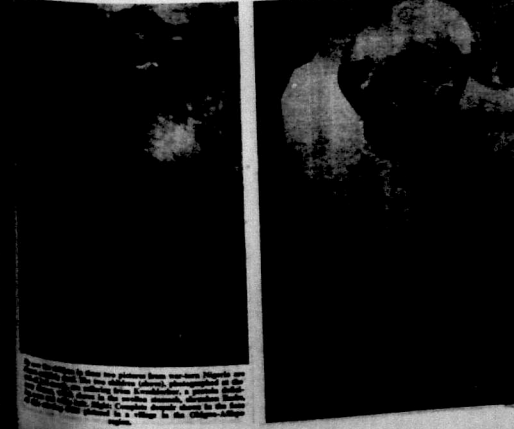

## RED CROSS MERCY FLIGHTS RESUMED

The International Red Cross has resumed its mercy flights to Biafra, which were suspended over a week ago because of difficulties over official of the International Red Cross committee confirmed in Geneva that flights had resumed.

The committee's relief coordinator in Nigeria, Mr. August Lindt, said in Biafra last week, but until Monday it was not clear whether other flights had been resumed.

Mr. Lindt, succeeded from his job as the Swiss Ambassador in Moscow, is due to return to Geneva shortly.

The American cargo ship Orizaba will shortly cross the Atlantic with 5,000 tons of American food products on board, destined for victims of the war, the Agency for International Development (A.I.D.) said in Washington yesterday.

The boat, currently being loaded at Houston, Texas, will also take on cargo at New Orleans, from where it will leave on Friday for Nigeria, where it is expected to arrive towards August 25.

The cargo will be surplus foodstuffs, valued at about \$200,000. The operation is taking place under the auspices of the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF), and the food (chiefly flour, powdered milk and baby protein), powdered milk and baby protein, powdered milk and baby protein, will be distributed to Biafrans and Nigerians by the International Red Cross.

The U.N. Secretary-General, U Thant, has conferred with Mr. Nkrumah, Ghana, whom he has appointed as special representative to help in getting relief supplies to people threatened with starvation in Biafra.

He also called in the Nigerian Ambassador, Mr. Ojo, to discuss the situation.

Genings who arrived in New York on Sunday night, will leave for Lagos in a few days, according to U.N. officials.

The International Prot. Christian movement has called on the United Nations, the Organisation for African Unity, churches and governments throughout the world to prevent starvation in Nigeria and Biafra.

The Roman Catholic movement, headed by Cardinal Aifric of Umechi, in a statement said that solidarity demands speech and sufficient action to ensure that medical and food supplies find their destination in the emergency areas.

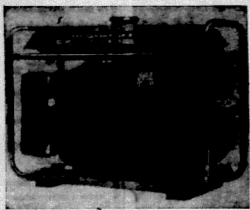

The Republican Presidential "swaps" at Miami officially became a three-way race on the first day of the convention as California's Conservative Governor, Mr. Ronald Reagan, declared himself a fully-fledged candidate for the party's nomination.

Dropping "honorary" status Governor Reagan began an open hunt for support outside his own

66-state state delegation, the convention's biggest. This marked a new phase in his tactful Liberal Conservative alliance to "step Nixon" with New York's Governor, Mr. Nelson Rockefeller.

But supporters of the former Vice-President took heart as another favorite son, Governor Agnew, of Maryland, released his bid for the party's nomination. Agnew was not only endorsed for Mr. Nixon, but also named as Mr. Rockefeller.

Mr. Nixon arrived in Miami from his weekend retreat on the Florida coast, and was well known to him as if he were virtually on the scene of the White House.

Marking back to his 1960 Presidential loss, the "Conservative" Mr. Nixon told them: "This time I'm going to win. He doesn't desire that an end to crime in the streets, but to inflation and heightened respect for America throughout the world would be the hallmark of a Nixon Administration."

Reporters accompanying him on the flight to Miami said Mr. Nixon spent the entire trip polishing up his Rockefeller force. His first speech was a far more realistic forecast. Other Tuesday afternoon highlights included a speech by the Democratic nominee, Sen. Barry Goldwater, and the reading of a message from a former President, Dwight Eisenhower.

Mr. Goldwater, who was recently elected President and Mr. Edgar for Vice-President. Such a team "would have experience at the top level

and a knowledgeable man at the number two spot."

Dr. Philip Hershberg, the world's longest surviving heart transplant patient, was continuing to improve. Dr. Bernard Shaw in a Press conference said:

He could not say whether when Hershberg would be discharged. "It depends on the progress he makes with walking, but we think it will be soon," he said.

If the course has been "good," he said, "it will be possible to discharge him in a few days. He will be strong enough to go home in a few days. I do not know, but I hope it will be soon."

In Montreal, Canada's only surviving heart transplant patient, Mr. Gaston Paris, took a brief trip home for the first time since his operation. He had a copy of coffee with his wife and returned to the hospital.

Mr. Paris, 40, was Canada's second heart transplant patient. He received the heart of a motorcycle accident victim on June 28 at the Montreal Institute of Cardiology. — Agency

## Soaring tea sales

One of the reports expressed at the time of the signing of the agreement linking the East African Community with that of "The Six" of mainland Europe was that Britain, as Africa's traditional and leading market, was excluded. This was, of course, due to the determination of Geneva to keep Britain out of Europe.

Judging from figures released yesterday, there is little reason to fear adverse effects on trade with Britain. Kenya tea trade figures published by the Board of Trade in London for the first half of this year show a remarkable increase in the volume and value of Kenya exports to Britain. The total value rose by nearly £3,800,000 to £13,440,000.

More than half this increase, £2,214,000, was accounted for by the fact that the value of Kenya tea sold in Britain doubled, reaching a total of £1,838,000 for January-June this year. This price was paid for 22,714,000 lb. tea compared with £2,174,000 for 12,678,000 lb. in the equivalent period of last year.

These figures reflect the sharp rise in tea production as a result of the good rains and the hard work of the growers, many of them small-holders, and also the fact that Kenya's tea is in heavy demand in the world's leading tea-drinking country.

Britain takes about two-thirds of Kenya's production.
