President Kenyatta warned yesterday that the Government might introduce legislation aimed at imposing speed limits on Kenya's main roads if reckless drivers continued to cause deaths.

Mr. Kenyatta was speaking at Mito Andei when he broke the Nairobi-Mombasa road which has now been completely bimiminated at its estimated cost of KSh 200 million.

The work has taken four years to complete and now all 302 miles of the road are bimiminated. Part of the money was raised through loans received from British aid agencies and the rest was carried out by the African construction unit of Kenya's Ministry of Works.

Mr. Kenyatta was met at Mito Andei by the Vice-President, Mr. Mos, and the Minister for Economic Planning and Development, Mr. Mboya, who both drove from Mombasa. Also at the ceremony was the Acting British High Commissioner to Kenya, Mr. Greatbatch.

The President described the ceremony as marking a turning point in Kenya's history, because it was the first time that Mombasa and Nairobi had been linked by a modern road.

In the past a journey to Mombasa had been a difficult and dangerous task, taking hours and causing damage to vehicles.

The project will use in which all Kenyans should take pride in and for the improvement of their country.

Referring to the importance of retaining the independence of Kenya and the importance of the country's roads and more roads, Mr. Kenyatta said that links with Uganda and Tanzania would be maintained.

Saying that the whole project was a national effort, he said that the Government would be working to improve the roads and to ensure that the roads were safe and comfortable for all.

The President thanked the team for its achievement and said that the work soon began on bimiminating the road from Mombasa to the coast.

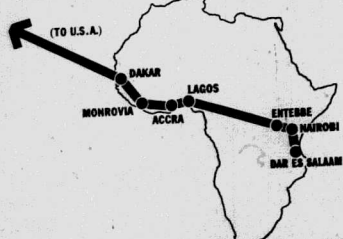

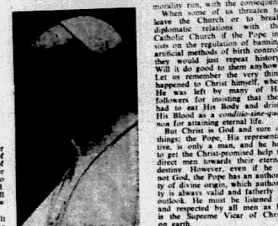

£93,500 development plan for Kakamega

Kakamega Urban Council has launched a three-point development project which will cost about £93,500. The money, which has been obtained from the Ministry of Local Government and the Kenya National Housing Corporation, will be used to erect street lights, 100 new self-contained rental houses and a modern market consisting of six stalls.

The acting Clerk to the Council, Mr. Nehemiah Waweru, said that £75,000 would be spent on the erection of a new market and £18,500 on the erection of 100 self-contained rental houses. The remaining £10,000 is to be spent on street lighting and the construction of a new market had been looked by the Ministry of Local Government.

When complete, the housing scheme above will have a population of about 132,740. The total scheme consisting of 30 small street-purchase houses, 100 self-contained rental houses, and 100 stalls. This was followed by a

middle-class project of 40 rental houses which cost £22,400. The site for the new market has already been selected. It will be situated on the Kakamega main road near the Kakamega bus station and Kambi School. 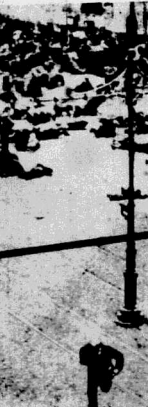

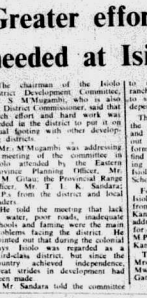

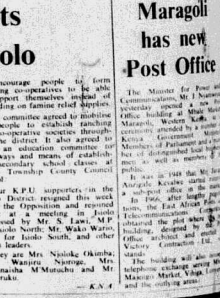

With Russian-inspired censorship at work, just how great has been the war of nerves on the Czech frontier will probably never be known. But apart from the threats made by the awe-inspiring delegation of top Soviet leaders two weeks ago, the role of the military manoeuvres in areas surrounding the Czechoslovakian missile base and blatant intimidation. The manoeuvres were said to be designed to perfect support and supply troops operations but they involved all types of arms, including rockets, aircraft and tanks. It is said that moderate elements in the Soviet leadership are planning to launch a "plan" at the eleventh hour. It is probable that the support shown by the Czech people for their legitimate Government has so far deterred the Russians from such a move. The world could not have been misled into thinking that the Russian tanks would move in at the request of the Prague Government.

Rhodesian illegality

To very many people, and especially Africans, the irony of the judicial crisis in Rhodesia is that Mr. Justice Dendy Young, who presided from the High Court earlier this year, was a South African born and bred. He is a member of the High Court of the Republic of South Africa.

Not only has he repudiated the unilateral nature of the independence, but he has given cogent reasons to support his conclusion that Mr. Smith's Administration is illegal. The other High Court Judges have stated their acceptance of the Government's position by saying they believe the 1961 Constitution, which was the legal basis of U.D.I. of November 1965, is no longer valid in Rhodesia.

Mr. Justice Dendy's statement shows he refuses to support the Government's position which is what is called the new independence Commission's position. He issued when Rhodesia seized the High Court and he decided to continue, awaiting the Privy Council's ruling which he understood was the rebel regime's constitutional position. He made preparations in expectation of a long wait, and it is understood he has been given a special passport to the Becho in Botswana, which is a neutral independence zone.

Admittedly, he explained to the Becho that he would resign "as a matter of judicial conscience". In his opinion, the judgment of the Privy Council, as the supreme appellate tribunal of the Rhodesian High Court under the terms of the 1961 Constitution, is not acknowledged. He held, as most of the nine High Court Judges have done, that the Rhodesian Government has achieved de facto status, i.e. having lawful authority, but not de jure, as the accused. However, he said there was a "strong opinion" and agreed to the defence request to refer the question to the Rhodesian Appeal Court "because of its considerable complexity and utmost importance".

But in Russia, Poland, Hungary and East Germany no one has the right to travel to the West. The Czechs have won freedom of travel in the context of the Czechoslovakia. In Prague a Czech woman told me: "Let me go to travel with my family to the West. I am a Communist Party member and I have survived the death-camp on my own. I am talking about when it came to the end of the war and the people of personal and political freedom." She said she had no doubts of this.

African women's advance spectacular, students told

Standard Staff Reporter

A five-day conference attended by students of teacher training colleges in Kenya and Uganda was opened at Kenyatta College, Nairobi, yesterday.

The opening address was given by the senior social welfare officer in the Ministry of Co-operatives and Social Services, Mrs. Maxine Kenyon.

The theme of the conference is "Women and Nation-Building", which Mrs. Kenyon said was very apt, as it coincided with the goals of the two countries represented at the conference of developing or building new communities on societies shaped by both their traditional and colonial past.

Almost the whole of Africa was considered to be at a development stage, she said, but nation-building implied that a change was being made, variously referred to as "evolution", "transformation" or "revolution".

This change related not only to the development of the natural resources of the continent, but also to the change in people.

The advancement of the African woman was as spectacular as any other aspect of this dynamic movement on the continent, Mrs. Kenyon said.

Recently a prominent woman leader of Kenya said the many problems hindering women's participation in social and economic development activities were education, conditions of world economy, habits for the home, large families and refusal of husbands to allow their wives to take part in social activities beyond the home.

Mrs. Kenyon agreed that these problems impeded women's participation, she felt there were answers to all of them, and there were conditions that actually facilitated the overcoming of social problems, such as the right to vote, the right to ownership of property, the opportunity for full education, and increasing status as citizens.

With all the opportunities and resources — human, social and economic — at their disposal, African women take full advantage of their gifts, she said. It must be realized that not all women wanted to be called equal. Many would be content with marriage, bearing children and going to work, but they must have a choice.

Being educated women were about to look more critically at the

society in which they lived, at its conflicts and contradictions. They were compelled to question of greater parity and to challenge right and wrong, and to cover the social values, behaviour and conduct which society expected them to comply.

During the conference several aspects of women in nation-building will be discussed. The main speakers will be the national general secretary of the Y.W.C.A. of Kenya, Mrs. Margaret Mugo, who will talk on "Our traditional customs: how do they fit with nation building?"

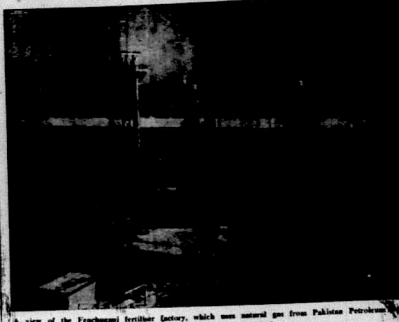

Pakistan, which today celebrates the 21st anniversary of its independence, has taken up the challenge of feeding its population of 120,000,000 and is marshalling resources to augment food production.

Progress eradication of schemes food output has increased appreciably during the last few years. The ultimate aim is not to reach the target of 100 per cent self-sufficiency in food by 1970.

Indications are that the target will be met in two years. Agriculture in Pakistan during the period 1965-66 has achieved a growth rate of 3.5 per cent per annum — one of the highest of any developing country.

Expansion of irrigation, improved seeds, additional fertilizers, water and flood protection systems, cheap and improved agricultural implements and machinery services and credit facilities were some of the contributory factors to this growth.

This performance shows that, given the proper policies and programmes, agriculture is capable of faster growth. That is why the third five-year plan projected an annual increase of 5 per cent in the new order crop during 1967-68 was 26,240,000 acres, as against 24,770,000 for the preceding year.

SYRIAN PILOTS RAN OUT OF FUEL — FARMERS

Two Syrian pilots landed their MIG-17 jet in Israel yesterday because they had lost their way after pursuing out of fuel farmers who were attacking Israeli aircraft.

The farmers said they had been told this by the pilots who landed at Kerem Shalom, north of Nablus, and were subsequently released.

An army spokesman named the pilots as Lieutenant Wafiq Adham and Second Lieutenant Raafiq Rifaat. He said both were well known.

After the MIG-17 jet fell over the border, Israeli soldiers were alerted and the aircraft was brought to the sea of Galilee, hurried to an airfield to see the aircraft.

The Israeli Cabinet met in urgent session in Jerusalem on Monday. It was presided over by Premier Levi Eshkol and attended by the Defense Minister Moshe Dayan, who said the pilots had been shot down by the village of Ushat, where he had attacked the Syrian forces.

He said Damascus gave the following account: "Two Syrian MIG-17 jets carrying out a training exercise in the area of the sea of Galilee, north of Nablus, were shot down by Israeli forces. The pilots were killed and the aircraft were destroyed."

From the point of view of the Israeli government, the pilots were shot down because they were in the area of the sea of Galilee, which is a sensitive area.

The Israeli government is now investigating the incident and is expected to issue a statement in the next few days.

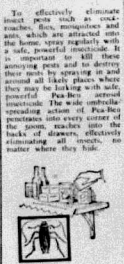

Wines warned that the combination of the accident rate will not only result in countless more people killed or maimed, but will damage the tourist industry if the country gets a reputation for dangerous driving and force insurance companies to raise their rates.

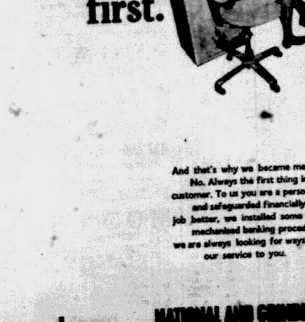



Rebel intrigues upset serenity in the Bahamas

Concern is growing among Bahama officials because Haitian and Cuban rebels, seeking to overthrow regimes in their homelands, are eyeing remote islands in this island chain as ideal bases for military attacks.

Led by opponents of the Caribbean rulers, Francois Duvalier and Fidel Castro, the Bahamas is a strategically ideal spot for plotting and launching guerrilla attacks aimed at overthrowing these regimes.

During recent months the Bahama Government has been embarrassed by a series of incidents and disclosures which prove Haitian and Cuban rebels have been at work in the colony.

Although the Government is openly against such intrigue in its territory — for a night, it is not conducive to good tourism — business, Bahamians (liberal) there seem little that can be done about it.

The Bahamas stretch from 50 miles off the Florida coast to within 60 miles of northern Haiti. Between the two points are more than 300 islands, many of which are uninhabited.

The major problem for the Government is to provide effective protection of its 100 islands. Seeking small groups of men, the army and coast guard are often at a disadvantage, as one of the islands is like trying to find a needle in a haystack.

Rebel activity in the Bahamas was postulated by the May 20 leaked invasion of Haiti by a handful of freedom fighters who were quickly routed by President Duvalier's army and militia.

Speaking out angrily against Britain and the U.S. accused Bahamians of harboring Haitian rebels wanting to topple him. He even claimed that planes which tried to destroy his special police in Great Inagua, an island in the Fort-Nassau group, were the clandestine part of the chain.

Although the Government has often condemned such disclosures, subsequent disclosures indicated that, even if the raid was not planned in the Bahamas, the colony had certain

He appointed three new consuls, each assigned to distinct areas: Nassau, Grand Inagua, and the colony — Grand Bahama, Abaco and Inagua. No longer had they been officially introduced to Bahama Government employees in Freeport — suspected headquarters of the anti-Duvalier movement — than one was shot in the back, allegedly by another Haitian.

Police who went to the apartment-complex, where the shooting took place, found the consul's body in the scrub a few yards away.

While Britain utilizes its diplomatic resources in Jamaica to secure his release, Bahama officials are working how he came to be on Haiti on the first flight. When he left Nassau on May 21, he was on his way to Haiti for a short flight.

Mr. Lyndon F. Lindor, head of the Bahama Negro Government, has stressed that his Government is completely uninvolved in the matter.

While rebel plots in the Bahamas have been largely confined to the Bahamas, a strong effort for Duvalier's 15-year regime, there have been signs of anti-state activity as well.

India's leading role in world education

India is probably next only to the Soviet Union and the United States in the number of engineering and technology graduates it produces.

At the time of independence in 1947 India produced only 950 graduates in engineering and 700 graduates in technology. Today the number of graduates in these two fields has increased to 1,00,000 and 1,50,000 respectively.

The last two decades have witnessed a rapid growth in the field of engineering and technology. The number of graduates in these two fields has increased to 1,00,000 and 1,50,000 respectively.

The number of students admitted to the first year courses has increased over 100 per cent during the past 10 years.

The number of institutions providing higher education in India was 18 in 1947. Today the number has increased to over 100, which four times their number in 1947. The average admission capacity of an institution has also increased from 250 in 1947 to over 220 today.

The admission capacity for all courses in engineering and technology has risen more than 10,000 during the 20 years of independence.

More than 1,000 institutions are now providing higher education in India.

The Union Government established a chain of 100 higher technological institutions known as the Indian Institutes of Technology, located at Delhi, Kanpur, Kharagpur, Bombay and Madras.

These institutions offer facilities for a wide range of subjects up to the highest standard. In addition, steps have been taken to improve facilities for post-graduate studies and research at the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore, and to open a number of Regional Engineering Colleges. There are today 400 institutions providing post-graduate courses in a wide range of engineering and technological subjects.

About 30 per cent of India's population is nearly 10 years of age. In 1947, when the country became independent, it could read and write today.

The number of children going to school has more than trebled to 72 million.

Eight out of ten children in the age group fall out at school today, as against four out of ten 10 years ago.

Or nine out of ten children there is a primary school within a 3 km radius, less than a third in 1947. Government spends Rs. 24 per child per year on primary education. Rs. 10 more per child than in 1947.

Fourth standard is free throughout the country. Education up to the eighth standard is free in all Union Territories and in most States.

The total number of schools is a little over 500,000 with nearly 2,00,000 teachers, employing about half a million women teachers. Enrolment in colleges has gone up by 1,00,000 in the past decade and stands at a little over 1 million.

The number of colleges, graduate and professional, has risen from 2,100 in 1947 and of universities from 45 to 70 since 1952.

Annual admissions to engineering colleges stand at less than 1,000 at the time of independence. Nowadays are nearly 20,000.

The number of engineering colleges has increased from 94 to 115.

There are institutions in the diploma level with an annual intake capacity of more than 100. An autonomous Scholarship Grants Commission provides grants to students in technical and management education.

Last year of industrial research, an amount Rs. 100 crore was spent. A vast number of students attending colleges post-graduates and research students. A large craftsman-training programme is being undertaken for allied trades. At present about 100,000 are being trained annually.



Their total annual value exceeds Rs. 100,00,000. These include precision instruments of various types such as recording and control instruments and transmission systems, electronic automatic industrial machinery and food processing, mechanical, hydraulic and pneumatic controlling devices.

The engineering industry is engaged in a wide range of modern diversifying its production so that more and more sophisticated items are produced every year. The output of the
