Talks offer open says Mr. Mboya

Kanu's secretary-general, Mr. Mboya, yesterday renewed his offer which would lead to the return of K.P.U. leaders to Kanu.

To continue to support K.P.U. was merely an act of loyalty for one person, but such blind support could not survive for long, Mr. Mboya said in a statement.

He claimed that there was an overwhelming rejection of K.P.U. and a demand by Kanu leaders and people for an end to "these sterile existences." He urged people who gave their support to K.P.U. to announce their resignation.

Sincerity doubted

Mr. Mboya was commenting on a statement by the K.P.U. president, Mr. Odinga, in which he declined to accept an offer of a face-to-face encounter to start with political discussions. Mr. Odinga had said the meeting would be a private one.

Declining to accept the offer, Mr. Odinga said on Thursday that he doubted its sincerity. Yesterday, Mr. Mboya said it was (a) to question other people's sincerity, but how was one's sincerity "to be tested if you refuse even to meet?"

Mr. Mboya said he was not refusing to meet, but was not in a position to meet. There were many important things, involving the interests of the Law and the personal stability of Kanu, which could be considered more important than the personal whims of Mr. Odinga as a human.

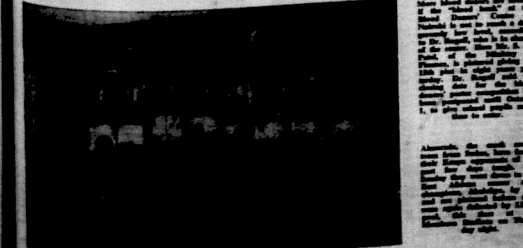

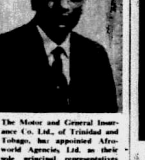

Two crying scandals

If you are shocked by the display of bus crash pictures in the front page today, that is exactly what is intended. Whenever shocking pictures are published, giving readers a jolt at breakfast, some dramatic word-writer will complain.

Save yourself the trouble. There will be no apology, not even an explanation of the horror scenes. It is the nature of the beast. Kenya is the abominable toll of death and injury on the roads.

Nations like U.N. get worked up over battle casualties. There is a perpetual stream of day after day, every week of the year. On the roads, casualties insist. People sigh and say they are ever getting much happier. Why not?

After reports of serious road accidents are published with equal regularity there are official expressions of sorrow and statements about plans to legislate for speed and safety. To drive death off the roads. But death still stalks and Kenya's plans do not materialize, even after warnings by the highest authorities.

One serious crash after another, against speeding, drunken and negligent driving.

Some quarters even appear to be resistant. By what right do the police stop vehicles and impose those considered to be in faulty mechanical condition? asks one commentator who shows genuine pity for anybody who then has to walk home.

Then some might think it would be good to ask for regard for the safety of those who supply kerosene to a month ago this newspaper depicted the delinquent behaviour of Kenya's Blood Bank. What would happen if a road accident or plane crash caused as many casualties that blood supplies were loaded, endangering the lives of those who were critically injured?

What happened yesterday? A bus crash in which five people were killed and 25 passengers gravely injured. The bus was carrying ambulances, after several had been extracted from the torn and twisted wreckage by the Fire Brigade.

Most of the injured were taken to the Kenyatta National Hospital, the remainder to Machakos. Surgeons were summoned to conduct emergency operations. Then came the news of a crash of blood.

This one crash almost entirely drained the blood stocks of Kenya's Blood Bank. The crash also caused a number of serious road accidents, as well as a number of deaths.

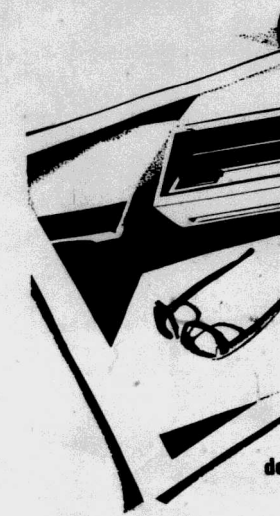

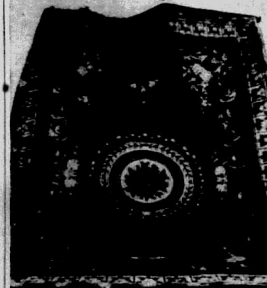
Living in Kenya, one soon learns some very practical things. One is that self-colours, whether for women's dresses or for carpeting a house, are definitely impractical.

Yet there are many problems facing the industry for some years demand has been declining in Europe, which is the main source for Persian carpets.

One of the problems listed by Tehran officials and foreign dealers and experts is that the industry is not run on a sound, modern basis.

Most carpet weaving has been handed down from father to son and original designs restricted to certain families. Over a long period, the weavers had lost originality and initiative and have been producing the carpets in an economic way, the experts say.

Carpets, like any piece of art, carry the personal touch of the maker, and signs of stagnation become evident if a carpet is produced by a weaver without imagination or initiative.

Luxurious among the weavers is attributed to low wages in the areas where most of the Persian carpets are produced.



Malaysian quarrel with Philippines

As Malaysia prepares to celebrate its Independence Day on August 31, clashes are building up between it and a country may be involved in a confrontation with the Philippines.

Like other world quarrels, South East Asia had been divided into several countries with overlapping claims, irrespective of whether the claims were legitimate. The common factor was the convenience of the Colonial Powers.

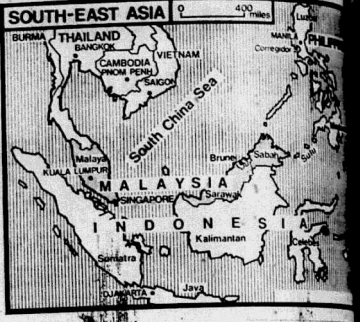
Before the Second World War, Malaya consisted of what were then known as British Settlements—Singapore, Penang and Malacca—and the British protected States, four of them independent. After the Japanese surrendered in 1945, Malaya, including Singapore, was governed by the British military administration as a single unit. When civil government was restored, a Malayan Union was formed, comprising the Malay States and settlements of Penang and Malacca. Singapore remaining a British colony.

By a Federation of Malaya was proposed for a short time so that a U.N. delegation could find out the wishes of the Sarawak and Sabah peoples. The delegation reported that the people favoured the new Federation and Malaya was formally proclaimed.

West Indians find a 'promised land'

At least 12 per cent of all West Indians now away from home—during the years their promised land has shifted from Latin America, to Britain and now back to North America.

Unlike the early 1960s, when seasonal farm work lured them to the southern U.S., it is tourism policy—that migrant West Indians are now turning.

Thousands of West Indians escaped poverty and unemployment during World War II by harvesting and applying technical skills in U.S. civil service, army and navy contracts while labour was sorely needed in the war effort. But when the war ended, their post-war demobilisation labour work quickly ended.

The reconverted men of the Caribbean, having sought an outlet from the restrictive area of their island, encouraged by reports of capitalists returning from war in Europe, by advertisement, invited in their seafaring British employers and by cheap passage, met lured to the "Mother Country", which needed labour for reconstruction.

A few thousand immigrants who decided to stay in Britain were joined by tens of thousands of other West Indians, most of them semi-skilled or unskilled workers.

The migratory was reached its peak in 1961, when thousands stepped in to beat the threatened ban which came with the Commonwealth Immigrants Act 1962.

The flood was reduced to a trickle. As against 32,960 in 1960 and 39,203 in 1961 admitted from Jamaica alone, only 9,107 West Indians entered Britain in 1962.

SOVIET BLOC - RUNS CZECHS

Prague taken after invasion on five fronts

Russia and four of her Communist allies invaded Czechoslovakia early this morning. By dawn they had reached Prague without resistance. Yet later Russian troops opened fire with machine-guns on demonstrators protesting against the invasion. Figures of killed and injured were not available.

Tanks and troops of the Soviet Union, Poland, Hungary, East Germany and Bulgaria rolled across the frontier at 1 a.m. (E.A. time) and Russian warplanes roared over the Czech capital.

Prague over Radio dropped leaflets saying the legal President of Czechoslovakia was in Moscow. The old-line Socialist was Mr. Dubcek ousted in January to begin the liberalising drive. Russian troops began shooting at Czechoslovak demonstrators outside Radio Prague building. People in the street drove into the Radio building for shelter.

At 2 a.m. Radio Prague broadcast a Government statement denouncing the move as a violation of international law, but adding that the Czech armed forces had been ordered to offer no resistance. By 6 a.m. Russian troops were ringing the capital.

Despite the radio's call to the Czech people to remain calm and not to resist, reports from Prague later said shots were being ringing out from the windows of the Communist Party Central Committee building. Soon after dawn a crowd of several hundred young Czechs marched on the building shouting: "Out with the Russians!"

These youths crawling through the capital in a truck draped with the Czechoslovak flag said the crowd was shouting anti-Soviet slogans and using the Czechoslovak national anthem. They said there were three casualties, but no more details were available.

The Soviet bloc action followed what Khrushchev's diplomatic attempts to end the democratic reforms brought to its former satellite country in the past eight months by the Czech Communist Party's First Secretary, Mr. Alexander Dubcek, and his fellow reformers.

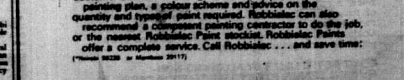
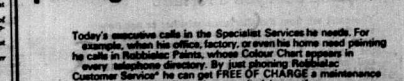
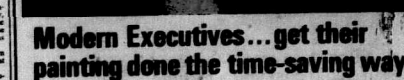
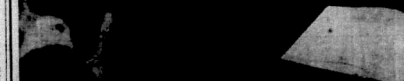
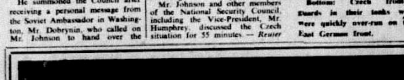

A message from Moscow said the Russian and allied troops had crossed into Czechoslovakia "at the request of its leaders". Radio Prague denied this, saying the invasion was launched "without the knowledge of the President Mr. Dubcek or the Members of the National Assembly."

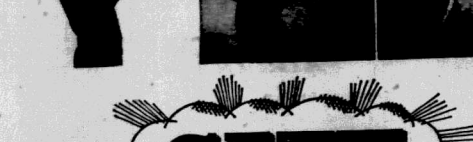

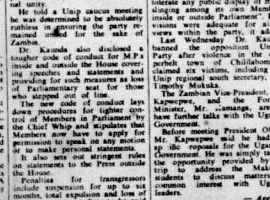

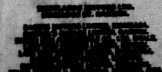

As before the Japanese surrendered in 1945, Malaya, including Sarawak, was governed by the British military administration, as a single unit. When civil government was restored, a Malayan Union was formed, comprising the Malay States and settlement areas. Sarawak and Sabah were to remain a British colony.
