## Split in Rhodesia

When the Rhodesian National Front was formed in March by ultra-radicals defecting from the ruling Rhodesian Front led by the rebel Prime Minister, Mr. Ian Smith, it seemed little more than a far Right wing splinter group. Its leader, Mr. Hendriksz, is a hitherto insignificant figure notable only for his inmoderate views on the integration of the coloured population. He complained of "classism" and "discrimination" under Mr. Smith's regime. No such integration had been detected by the outside world.

The new party openly proposed apartheid in its policy and called for a tougher attitude against Zambia and against guerrilla incursions. It also urged a treaty to negotiate with Britain on a national and the immediate declaration of a republic.

That this wildly unrealistic programme could be taken seriously did not appear a likely proposition, even among the ultra-radicals. The irrationality of Rhodesia's racist minorities, the fanaticism of the margin by which Mr. Smith's weekend party on his constitutional policy was the direct cause of the N.F.'s appearance, and its highly limited.

Mr. Smith had only an 11-vote margin in gaining acceptance for his constitutional plans and nearly half of the Rhodesian Front delegates eligible to vote opposed him. Why? Because they wanted much quicker achievement of political separation of the races.

WILLIAM FORREST contrasts the reaction to the Russian suppression of the Hungarian uprising with that in its satellites of Czechoslovakia.

Never since the death of Stalin 15 years ago has the Communist camp been so active as now. But it is united against Moscow, not for it.

In 1956 the Soviet intervention in Hungary and the Soviet attack on the Czechoslovakian Communist Party were the main reasons why the Communist camp was divided. Communists and the many races, particularly in Western Europe, were divided by these events.

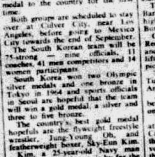

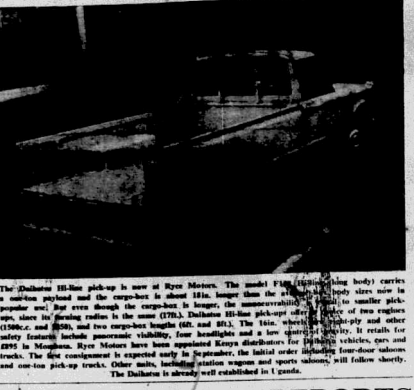

Ten years ago today the Aga Khan Platinum Jubilee Hospital in Nairobi was opened. And the very first case of the hospital dealt with was the birth of a baby.

Although no one and so at the time the hospital was the first real example of "self-help" the country had ever seen. But this was a self-help project with a difference. Inspired and financed almost entirely by the local community of East Africa it was not to be just for Kenyans. It was for everyone — black, white and brown.

When the Aga Khan opened the hospital ten years ago today he said: "This hospital must serve much more than the local community in Kenya, or even in East Africa."

"It is intended for all communities and for all races, of all religions and of all creeds, of all nationalities and of all languages."

His words came at a time in Kenya when the seeds of racial partition were still a dream. But from the very first day the hospital made history by opening its doors to people of all races.

Inspiration for the hospital came from the late Aga Khan, III, Sir Sultan Mohamed Shah III, whose followers in East Africa wanted to commemorate the 20th anniversary of his installation as the Imam of the Shia Imamati Ismaili Sect.

Doctors of ideas were put forward on ways and means of marking the event — not just for its heightened approach and first-class medical facilities, but also for its architecture.

The Royal Institute of British Architects awarded their highest honour, the RIBA Medal, to the designer of the hospital, Mr. Armas Comelli, whose sweeping approach and graceful lines make the hospital an outstanding example of modern architecture.

The hospital has its own staff of qualified doctors and consultants. From two hospital doctors in 1953 the staff has grown to 14, in addition to 22 consultants.

With the exception of patients in the private wing, who have their own doctors attending them, all other patients come under the hospital staff.

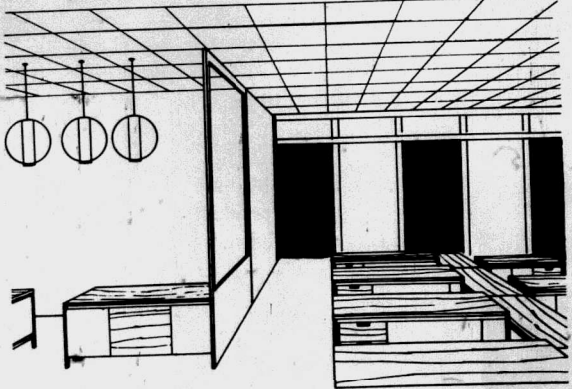

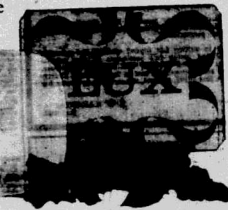

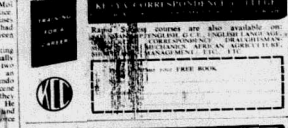

# Salvation Army projects £10,000 Kenya plans

## Police efficiency

An eminently reasonable speech about crime in Kenya was made to the Press Club yesterday by the Commissioner of Police Mr. Hinga explained and gave leads for constructive thinking.

One of his chief points was to stress the necessity for co-operation between the police and the public, a two-way operation of mutual trust and it follows, between the police and the Press. His views are endorsed by this newspaper, especially with regard to the discretion required in the publication of details which might prejudice investigations. It is always a delicate point to decide where the line falls between the public's right to know and the public's interest and prejudicial police activities. In the main, a workable system has been evolved.

Mr. Hinga denied Kenya is undergoing a crime wave. While there have been many robberies with victims killed, a still more a better "crime record" than many of the established countries.
