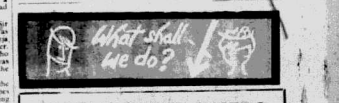

Big Vietcong raid expected tomorrow

The Vietcong's next general offensive in South Vietnam may be unleashed tomorrow, U.S. commanders forecast yesterday.

U.S. headquarters in Saigon said tomorrow was the anticipated date of the next assault. Officers said interrogated prisoners and captured documents indicated the attack would involve either a rocket bombardment of the capital or a series of co-ordinated ground attacks. The movement of the new offensive has been undisturbed for 175 hours in the last five days by the attack on Tay Ninh, located in the province of Kienhiep, Quang Ngai, An Hoa and Da Nang and the presence of North Vietnamese troop concentrations in the Demilitarized Zone.

Victory mortar and rocket units have been moved into strategic positions between the Mekong Delta and Da Nang in a series of bombardments. Heavy fighting was reported near Tay Ninh.

Attacks were expected against the Son Ha sub-sector Special Forces camp in the Central Highlands and the Loc Ninh base as well as the Hien Luong valley base near Saigon. Three were severely killed.

A heavy security guard was assigned to the 75th Yugoslav International Fair to protect President Tito from foreign infiltrators.

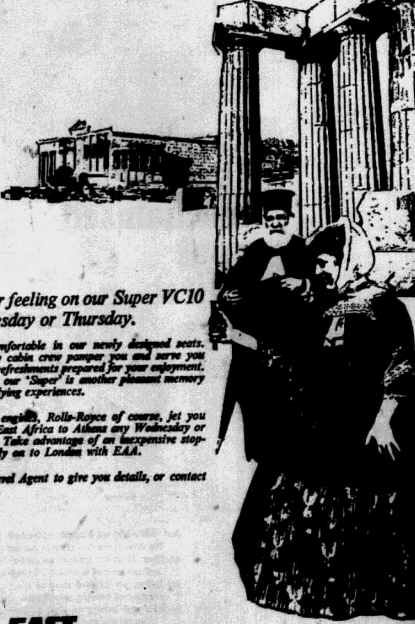

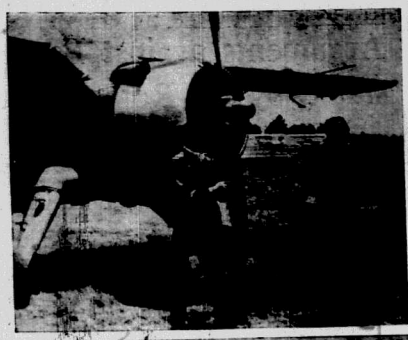

Liberalisation go on promises Czech leader

The Czech Communist Party leader, Mr. Alexander Dubcek, promised Czechs in a television broadcast that the country's liberalisation policies begin last January would be continued.

But he stressed that they would be reached within the framework of the Moscow Agreement which followed last month's Warsaw Pact summit in Czechoslovakia.

Mr. Dubcek's 40-minute speech, which also indicated the need for the withdrawal of occupying troops, was broadcast to the Czech countryside to ensure the retention of Party leadership.

The First Secretary did not dispute the return of Press censorship or that action would be taken to ensure exceptional forces.

Mr. Dubcek said the abandonment of last January's policy in favour of a more moderate and pragmatic approach would be a tragedy.

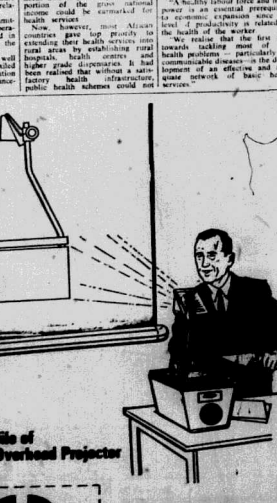

Two down as floods sweep S.E. England

Two women were feared drowned in a 5-hour storm which brought the worst floods for 15 years to South-East England over the weekend. The area presented a desolate scene of ruined homes and crops, impassable roads and washed-away bridges.

Hundreds were made homeless as the rain fell east across the counties around London from what the official described as a "paddy hole".

Real lives which carry hundreds of thousands of commuters into the cities were almost halted. Officials warned that it would take days to bring the situation back to normal.

At least 11 main roads and hundreds of minor roads in the southeast were flooded and impassable. Floodwaters were reported to be running so fast deep in some places.

Power lines and R.A.F. helicopters sounded the countryside, knocking up people stranded in isolated buildings and hillside.

South Police yesterday searched for a woman, who with her 15-year-old daughter was reported to have been swept away clinging to a tree.

In Sharnbrook an elderly woman disappeared in a car which was swept off the road into a swollen tributary of the River Mole. A young couple sought the floodwaters for an hour and a half in vain effort to save the woman. She was drowned and village were flooded.

The flood spread had overwhelmed the Floods Telephone in many areas were out of action.

About 200 families in Farnham, London, were marooned when the River Wandle broke its banks. The capital's main river, the Thames, showed no signs of overflowing.

The casualty of the deluge was London Transport's inquiries service. The special telephone number used by passengers to find out what trains are running was washed out. But tube and most bus services in London were reported normal.

Flights at London's Heathrow Airport were reported almost back to normal after heavy delays the previous day.

The Farnborough Air Show, England's first in two years, was flooded. Despite efforts by an Army unit to sandbag the adjacent canal, the show opened but was cancelled.

Rain at Goodwood one of England's showpiece courses, was cancelled.

The official weather forecast for South-East England yesterday predicted some rain, but a generally brighter and drier outlook.

In the London area of France rain began to fall again yesterday, adding to Sunday's exceptionally heavy storm damage in flooded cities.

The Mayor of Tokyo ordered an unshaded building and a block of ten divided buildings, to be demolished to avoid danger after one of the houses collapsed. His plans to requisition energy factories to supply power.

Engine and postal employees were recalled from leave to cope with the flood damage. Because of a broken cable 1,000 telephone subscribers found that their lines had gone dead.

MARITAL LAWS TO STAY IN GREECE

The new Greek Constitution, published yesterday in an official definitive form, will have the Greek Government with all the marital law powers which it has held since taking power in April, 1947.

The Constitution will take effect immediately after being approved by referendum on September 29, that article guaranteeing the liberties will be suspended pending application of the Government's direction.

Changes from the Constitution draft made public last July proved to be few. One of them was omission of the stipulation that any revision having acquired another nationality — a patent allowance to

Andreas Papandriou, who replaced yesterday the long-reigning Army chief citizenship of the right to run for Parliament every 10 years.

As in the July draft, the final version provides that Greece is to be a "royal democracy", the prerogatives of the King, "symbol of the unity of the nation", are to be jointly controlled by a council of the nation.

Government power is strengthened to include command of the Armed Forces, and stability is fostered by a ban on successive reelections of less than yearly intervals. Membership of Parliament is reduced from 300 to 150 — *AP*

The 15-year-old pact calls for U.S. financial aid to help produce the Spanish Armed Forces. Washington has provided about \$40,000,000 for this purpose in the past five years, but Spain is expected to be seeking more modern planes, submarines and anti-aircraft guns.

Negotiations between the U.S. and Spain have been proceeding in a friendly atmosphere, however, and U.S. officials appear favorably disposed that the pact will be renewed.

The Spanish Foreign Minister was meeting the Secretary of State, Mr. Dean Rusk, yesterday to open the talks.

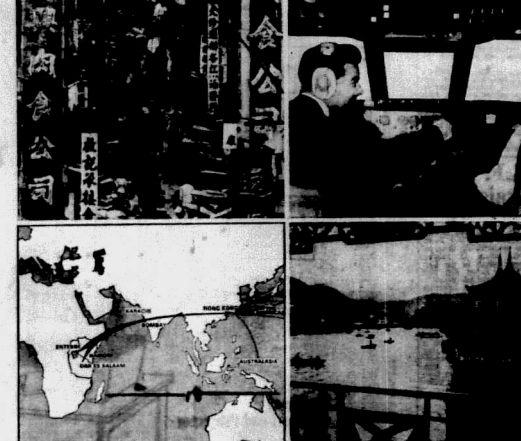
RECOVERED AFTER 40 YEARS

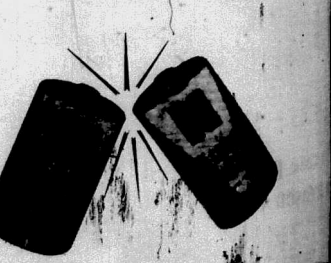

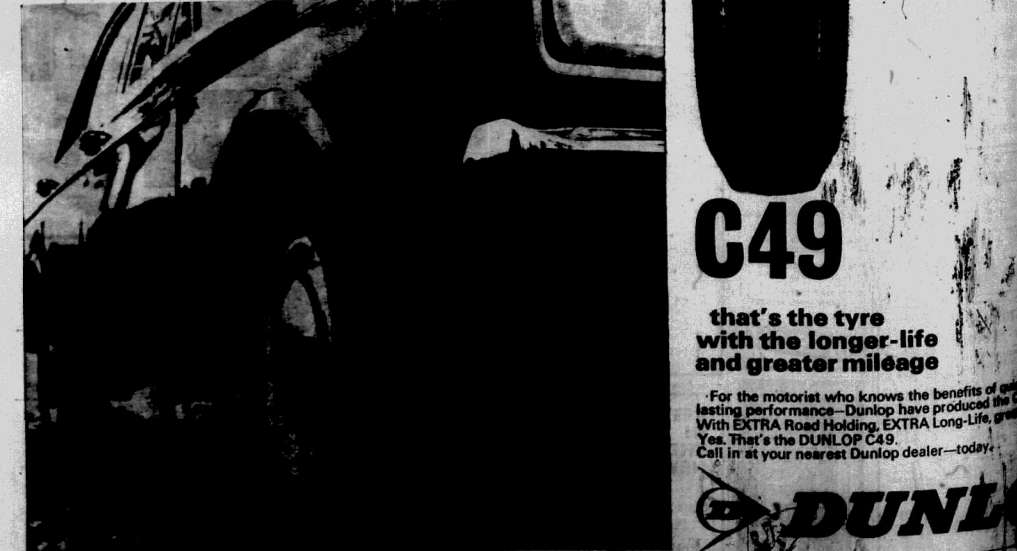

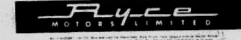

Inconclusive 'summit'

Apart from the re-election of Mr. Diello Telli to the lucrative post of Secretary-General, the O.A.U. 'summit' conference in Algiers appeared to have been more or less inconclusive. Repeatedly, it produced no display of the unity, expected of this organisation.

Mr. Diello Telli, who has been the incumbent of the post reported to be worth 30,000 dollars a year, plus the fringe benefits of house and car, was re-elected after considerable effort. He was successful in obtaining a clear mandate by one vote in the sixth ballot; and then only after the withdrawal of Mr. Nkundabonye of Rwanda.

In the opinion of many African observers, the post is grossly over-paid, especially in view of the fact that the emoluments given to his four Deputies, all contrasted with the drain on relatively poor countries to support the O.A.U.
