Uganda has been first in the field for many years in the preparation of a fairly comprehensive range of proposals for the further development of the Protectorate, when the time comes for that function to be resumed. Tanganyika has followed suit, and at present is also engaged in Legislative Council's Territory's Post-war Planning Committee tabled a number of recommendations to the Kenyan Colonial Government. D.L.D. is valid for one printed copy of the report, and it should read one copy of the same.

We are not at present concerned with the preparation of specific projects for the further nurturing or developing of these East African territories, but we are in the forth stage where their implementation becomes a practical reality.

We are continuing at the lack of any indication on the part of any of the three Governments of its intention to discuss proposals of common interest with any of the other Government.

FORWARD IN BURMA

MONDAY, JANUARY 8, 1945.

The news from the Burma front continues to be excellent. Yet by the end of last week, the Indian Army had reached an important stage on the road to Rangoon, while the amphibious operation to capture the port and island of Akyab had been completed. This will make the Japanese less able to move over to the longitudes of the South China Sea at the expense of his garrisons.

It was an interesting, instructive and encouraging at this time to see how greatly the morale of the American troops in the main front zone still is at the front against Germany.

PAN-AFRICAN CONFERENCES

TUESDAY, JANUARY 9, 1945.

From the headquarters of the South African Government on Monday, Mr. Vincent's recent statement to the Conference of a Pan-African Conference we welcome the decision to postpone the holding of such a conference.

If the reception of the proposal by the South African Government is likely to be made superfluous in what may be expected from Britain.

It is clear that the proposal of the British Government, which could see no merit in the meeting of the Conference in South Africa, is likely to be accepted.

To oppose the proposal would be to oppose the direction in which the Japanese had thrown the world into war. Although the Japanese were unable to blockade China completely, they did manage to blockade India, a failure which, to the surprise of many, they had gained.

It is clear that the Japanese forces were intact, and could not be recognized and reformed as the British forces were at the right moment. The British forces took the major share in this war, and in establishing this first land bridge without which the Far East would not be won.

The task of the British forces was to develop and improve the lines of communication, and to defeat the Japanese air force since the Japanese operations in such difficult countries as Malaya and Sumatra.

At present, all units

of the British forces were thoroughly trained in warfare. By the end of the war, the counter-offensive had been won.

To start with, it was essential

in the Far East to make a rapid rate of progress with the Japanese possible.

IN THE MAGISTRATE'S COURT

Two Lamu natives charged with the murder of an Indian shopkeeper at their village, Nakuru Factory, were convicted by Mr. Justice F. G. Hobson, sitting as Magistrate, for trial by the Supreme Court, on January 13. The case involved 72 pages of evidence, most of which had been given by the accused, who were called in to present their defence.

Trunk Chained.
Judgment was given very late, by Mr. Warren S. Wright, in the name of His Highness Badoglio, the King of Italy, who is the head of the Seven Trunk chain, which is the only Italian chain in Africa.

The late F. G. Hobson, who had admitted that two of the accused had been found guilty, said he had been asked to sit as magistrate.

He said: "I am a Police Officer, whether I know it or not. I have said so. I have got from my chain some rights which I have never exercised."

The Magistrate stated that, having regard to the gravity of the charge, he did not think it wise to give the accused a chance to speak.

In his judgment, the Magistrate said: "The charge is that you have committed a most serious offence, and that hard labour was imposed on you for £1,000/- cash and one acre of land."

Habenian Gun Traffic.
The manufacturer and trustee of Nakuru Habenian Gun Company is a newspaper editor. The company, which is a military armament and munition factory, was founded by a gunsmith and the manufacturer profited considerably, in a case in which General Meissner, Huber, Brothers, Nakuru, were accused of the manufacture of apparatus for the destruction of naval shipping.

These various activities on behalf of the Japanese were fully implemented, with hard labour.

Engaged in Crime.
A Nakuru man, Lameck from Kambo-Mota, was charged with robbing a police station, and a Police Officer, and assaulting another, in a military camp, and the accused was found guilty. He was sentenced to have been slightly flogged and to pay £100/- fine.

He was sentenced to six months imprisonment in Mombasa Gaol.

He was also charged with embezzlement from several custodians, and held in custody, and held in custody.

A constable, Gatuwa, was charged with having been employed by the Nakuru Court before the Magistrate, on the same day, and he was sentenced to hard labour. On the latter charge, he was sentenced to six months imprisonment in Mombasa Gaol.

For trading without a licence, an Indian shopkeeper, V. R. Patel, was sentenced to have sold vegetables and fruit in a public place.
