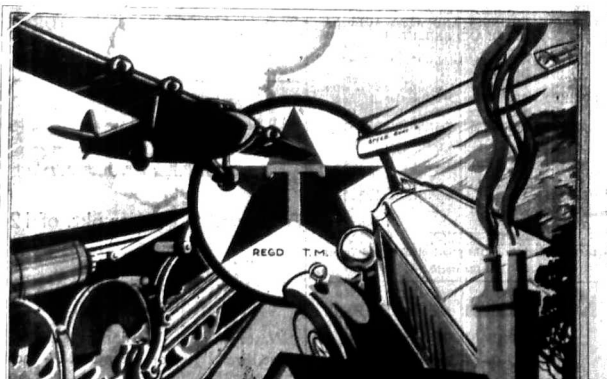

The most interesting speeches at the World Economic Conference on Wednesday were those which expressed the views of the British, United States and Russian Delegates.

In the course of the statement on behalf of the United Kingdom, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, Mr. Neville Chamberlain said that a fundamental condition of the recovery of prices was that credit should be made available by a policy of cheap money. At the same time steps must be taken to ensure that credit made available was actively employed.

The ultimate aim of monetary policy should be the restoration of a satisfactory international standard. A revival of world trade, declared Mr. Neville Chamberlain, depends largely upon the removal of an international wall of capital.

The leader of the United States Delegation stressed the need for Governments to ease existing trade barriers and urged that the Conference should proclaim that economic nationalism was a discredited policy.

M. Litvinoff drew a comparison between conditions in Russia and those obtaining in other countries, in favour of the Soviet system.

FIGURES FOR MAY

[By WIRELESS.]
Shipping, June 14. The Board of Trade returns for May show that imports were valued at £27,264,288, an increase of £5,143,444 on the previous month. 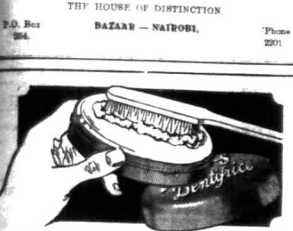

INCOME TAX FOR KENYA.

Secretary of State Accepts Alternatives.

THINKS IT RIGHT FULL AND FAIR TRIAL SHOULD BE GIVEN.

Official Despatch.

DECLARES THAT METHOD TO BE PREFERRED IS THAT MORE ACCEPTABLE TO THE TAXPAYER.

The Secretary of State for the Colonies, Sir Philip Caultley-Lester has decided against the introduction of Income Tax in Kenya.

This decision is announced in a special Despatch issued simultaneously in Nairobi and London yesterday.

The Secretary of State points out that when the Moyne Report was prepared and the Income Tax Bill published, no practical alternative method had been suggested. A wholly new situation arose when the alternative proposals were put forward.

The Secretary of State remarks that while it might be claimed for Income Tax that it was the most scientific and equitable form of direct taxation, the operation of any system of taxation can in fact only be tested by experience. In the present instance the test of experience was denied and a decision had to be taken between two fresh systems. In such circumstances the practical course was to try to find a system most likely to conform to the following practical tests:

1. The system must yield an adequate revenue.
2. That revenue must become available at the earliest possible moment.
3. Where the choice lies between alternative means of raising particular sections of the community that method is to be preferred which is the more acceptable to those upon whom the tax is to be levied.

In all the circumstances the Secretary of State thinks it right that a full and fair trial should be given to the alternative measures.

In considering the Despatch, Sir Philip Caultley-Lester emphasises the fact that the adoption of the alternative proposals is an experiment which will have to stand the test of time. He hopes sincerely they will succeed and is convinced Government can count on the fullest co-operation of the unofficial community.

The World Conference: A Great Opportunity.

While the speeches of His Majesty the King and the Prime Minister at the opening of the World Economic Conference in London on the 12th inst. have introduced no new legislative proposals, the important programme upon which the representatives of many nations are now embarked, they did serve one purpose to stress the seriousness of the problems at issue. The greatest help of His Majesty the King and the Prime Minister is the health of nations lent additional solemnity to the appeal to the world to cooperate for world peace. The Prime Minister, recognizing that it is a changing time which will be discussed from every possible angle during the next few weeks, wisely emphasized the goodness of the opportunity before the Conference. The world is leading with desperate

help to London for something more than routine results. The problems facing civilization are too real and too grave to permit of any serious discussion for any expenditure of thought of failure to agree on the measures which are necessary.

At the present time world markets are sagging. Business is quiet and will remain so until the lunatic action becomes clear. If the public adopted other and more vigorous there is every reason to believe that the present conditions will meet, immediately to the spirit of confidence and cooperation, and rise can then be an real basis of confidence for the future.

The same need for stability is apparent in the world's financial and industrial conditions. Trade has been reduced to stagnation on the continent. Interference with national economies is disrupting the world's production.

It is the hope we expressed in our last issue that the representatives of the world's nations should attempt to agree on a programme of cooperation, not behind prohibitive tariff walls, but on a basis of mutual respect and the exchange of goods and services. The Conference has an immense task. Civilization as we know it is in a state of peril. But without co-operation together the nations cannot prosper. The world's health and desperate necessities have compelled them to agree in a clear way that the world's nations should co-operate in a way which will benefit the world as a whole.
