LIKELIHOOD OF A CLOSE FINISH TO THE BY-ELECTION.

The campaign in connection with the Parliamentary by-election at Altrincham, occasioned by the appointment of Mr. Cyril Atkinson, K.C. to the High Court is now in full swing.

In the course of his election address, Sir Edward Grigg said that he believed the Conservative Party's organization was the country's greatest safeguard against a return to the type of party politics which led to the verge of catastrophe in 1918.

London, June 8.—An editorial in the Times states that Mr. Edward Grigg has been accepted as the Conservative candidate for the Altrincham constituency, and has named Mr. P. M. Cleave as his opponent for the Liberal Division of Manchester and Mr. J. J. Rains, who formerly represented Blackburn. There are rumours that the Liberal candidate will decline to run forward but this is unlikely.

The Liberal press has trumpeted several days beforehand, but the result, which is a close one, does not seem to be such a great surprise. Mr. Grigg has a record of electioneering which is a credit to him, and although this is not his main strength, it is a factor which should not be overlooked. He is a man of ability and has been successful in his career as a Member of Parliament and as a Minister.

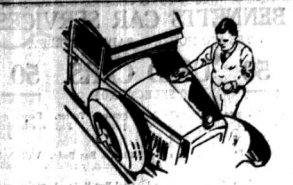

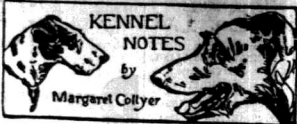

KENNEL NOTES

By **Margaret Collyer**

Miss Collyer, O.G.B., to whom all correspondence in connection with "Kennel Notes" should be addressed, does not hold herself responsible for accuracy of statements made by her which are, in the main, based on information supplied by her correspondents.

I got news of some very well bred Springer Spaniel puppies some of which will be advertised here very soon. I had no idea there were so many good specimens in the country. The owner of these puppies tells me that he had a wonderful sport shooting party and found these where, without these dogs he never found any birds at all. Springer will both point and retrieve, and an excellent water dog - very useful for duck shooting on the lake.

They are much stronger than pointers and more fitted for rough work and long days. I advise those who are considering birds to keep an eye on the advertisement column in the East African Standard and try a trial of these pedigree specimens.

With regard to the dog who has had his eye out, it is about 90 to 100 that it was a pup. I never found anything else so may call it all as the stitches across the irritation and cause the animal continually to shake his head and also use his claws to scratch the irritation.

On the occasions that I have had any success in getting torn pups out I have treated them at once in the following manner. Washed thoroughly in disinfectant, painted the torn edges with Eucalyptus balsam to stop all bleeding. Thoroughly dried the ear and wrapped the whole in a piece of white strapping (2 inch strapping) if possible over fitting the pieces of the ear exactly, together I heat the strapping well and lay the ear out it and when the torn parts are properly fitted fold the rest of the strapping over it, enclosing the whole. If the wound has been thoroughly cleaned and disinfected there should be no suppuration and the strapping should be left on till it has fallen off by its own accord. If healing has taken place I recommend a further strapping till the second has quite hardened. The dog should not be allowed to go into water as Mr. Pinsky, continues: "In this country there are classes for most bull-terriers along with excellent studs and it is a pity that this is not the case in Kenya as I believe the coloured breed is very common quite complete with the white. To obtain the best results when making a custard, add a teaspoonful of salt to the milk.

Frying Pan.

When using a double boiler, you may heat by adding salt to the water. This is especially important to eat.

Frying Bacon.
The frying pan should be well heated before the bacon slices are put in. They will crisp much more easily.

The Pasty.
When you have removed a cooked pastry from the oven, do not place it in a cold situation, as the sudden contraction of the steam in it makes it heavy. When making a pasty, a little salt should be put in the water. It will make the pie lighter. When making a pie, a very cold rolling pin is required. A bottle filled with cold water and used as a mulligan makes the lightest pastry.

Fish for Tart.
Do not put hot cooked fish into a tart, as the steam given off will make the pastry soggy before it has started to bake.

Lumps.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard." Sir—The report in your issue dated the 1st June, under the heading "The City," gives the impression that my Company was asked to submit a submission in the somewhat protracted negotiations with the Municipal Council in respect of the renewal of the Street Lighting Agreement which expires on 31st September, 1939, and we therefore feel that the following facts should be set before the readers.

Under the terms of this agreement the total cost of street lighting was increased from 18 to 22 million shillings, additional cost being met by electricity, thus reducing the unit charge to 90 per cent. Due to delay in completing a new agreement and in order to meet the Council, a further reduction of 10 per cent. under the old rate was offered and accepted on condition that the Council would pay the balance of the unit charge of 20 cents. In a letter dated 17th October, 1938, the Town Clerk suggested certain alterations to the agreement to supply and maintain on all street lights based on a unit charge of 20 cents, but the allowance for maintenance was not sufficient to cover actual cost. The Council had already offered to supply electricity at the 20 per cent rate, but was not prepared to undertake the maintenance of the street lighting system as a whole.

In 1938, March 1939, we had prepared to supply electricity for street lighting, a tentative agreement being made at a reduced rate of 20 cents per unit, this being the Council's suggestion. We were notified by the Town Clerk's letter dated 17th October, 1938, and referred to above, that we must not accept any maintenance in our contract. We had some at actual cost. 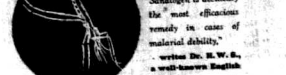

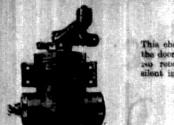

[MEMORANDUM - CORRECTION.] London, May 20. (By Mr. May).

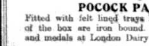

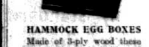

The memorandum also opposes country produce and distribution rates. It states that the railway should be run as a business concern, and that its rating policy should not be mainly fixed for the development of other country.
