TANGANYIKA CONCESSIONS TO HAVE FIRST PICK IN OTHER AREAS.

The Secretary of State for the Colonies and the Government of Kenya issued simultaneously in London and Nairobi on Saturday, for release to-day, a statement outlining the policy which has been decided to adopt in regard to the closed areas of the Kavirondo goldfield.

The recommendations made by Sir Albert Kilian have all been accepted. Three areas of which Tanganyika Concessions Ltd. will have first choice are now being retained for exclusive prospecting by companies, syndicates or individuals granted an exclusive licence. The remaining two areas will be opened for general prospecting.

At the present moment the Government only proposes to open for general prospecting the Gori River field. This will take place on June 1 next. The date for the opening of the other restricted areas has not been decided.

After Tanganyika Concessions have exercised their option, the remaining areas for exclusive prospecting will be divided into units and applications invited.

write full the promise of the full rehearsal in the previous day. One felt that here was an experienced amateur player with the dignity and poise which only experience can give, who was not for the moment doing himself justice. The lines, spoken with excellent rhythm and feeling, were not only audible but clear. For all this, Mr. Higgins made simply adequate in inadequate scenes, notably the scene with the players, which wrongly handled became muddled; the double scenes which the King shares with Hamlet, the Queen and Polonius, and the scene with the Ghost. The last act, the rain, pouring on the roof of the theatre, was a fortunate stroke in respect of audibility.

The Ghost. Mr. Deane made an impressive ghost. Walk and gesture were both excellent. There was in his slow utterances, a certain clerical quality of speech which was rather unfortunate. Mrs. M. Deane Jones' performance carried weight and bore its due significance in the development of the play. There remains one more of the older players, Mr. J. McMenamin. Mr. McMenamin played the part of the first gentleman who enters the apartment of his daughter. His representation of a comely young man of the necessary relief to the otherwise unrelieved gloom of the last act.

The Prison. Now as to Hamlet himself. In Mr. J. A. Malloy, Mr. Biemer found a sensitive and delicate interpretation which to work. Fine voice, and bearing were alike suitable to this role of the melancholy Dane and which Mr. Malloy's performance from his first entrance in the second scene to the treatment which joins his death in the last act, and right. One of many good points was the perfectly intimated way in which Mr. Malloy's speech should be said here that this applied equally to all the players; eloquence itself was carefully stimulated throughout the play. It may be that Mr. Malloy had pre-occupied ideas as to the manner in which the part of Hamlet should be played, but it was explained that producer and player had worked out scenes with the result that the character of the Prince of Denmark's weakness and inhibition - his brooding melancholy, lightened by touches of delicate humor - were in an open book which the audience read with genuine and well-earned appreciation.

Mr. Malloy was inclined necessarily to use his hands a little too much. An unquiet speech does not necessarily mean a unquiet body. But for the most part, his gestures were graceful and appropriate to the moment, and his movement marked his work in the player's scene and the subsequent scenes with his mother. While in this part, Mr. Malloy lived in fact, and his interpretation of it was in the utmost of every young actor's ambition, was swift, beautiful and convincing.

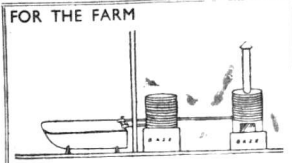
