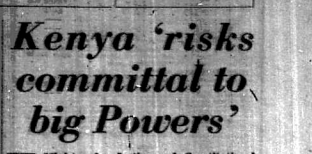

CONGO TALKS FOR NAIROBI Premier may meet Tshombe today

Meeting of the Reconciliation Committee on the Congo set up by the Organisation for African Unity will be held today (September 18), Kenya's Minister for State in the Premier's Office, Mr. Murrumbi, said yesterday on his return to Nairobi from the Ababa conference, where the Reconciliation Committee was set up.

But Mr. Kenyatta, who is to head the conciliation committee, may have an earlier chance to get to close grips with the problem.

A Kenya News Agency report quoting Tan yesterday said that the Congolese Prime Minister, Mr. Tshombe, was expected to leave Addis Ababa today for Nairobi for talks with Mr. Kenyatta.

No confirmation that Mr. Tshombe would be arriving on the flight from the Kenya Government, however, Mr. Tshombe is understood to be waiting in Addis Ababa for a Congo Government aircraft to pick him up.

The Algerian Assistant Secretary-General of the O.A.U., Mr. Mohamed Sabounou, said in Addis Ababa that Mr. Kenyatta would broadcast a message after a few days' time.

Conference 'went off well'

Mr. Murrumbi, who headed Kenya's delegation at the Addis Ababa conference, and his colleagues returned to Nairobi yesterday. Mr. Murrumbi said he hoped that Mr. Tshombe and the Foreign Ministers of the Congo, the Congo and Burundi would attend the meeting. "Somehow, there would be another meeting to which representatives of all the States would be invited," he said.

The meeting in Addis Ababa had "gone off well" and the main questions discussed included the need for representatives from entering the Congo and the expansion of the membership of the Organisation for African Unity to all the States in the area.

The three Ugandan athletes, Joseph Oculu, Yvern Oculu and James Oculu, who arrived in Nairobi to compete in the 25-mile race at 2.15 p.m. today, will also be taking part because the Ugandans officials will not be able to finish their training routine.

anthrax-free meat from K.M.C.

Consumers can be absolutely certain that meat from the Kenya Meat Commission bearing the K.M.C. stamp is perfectly safe to eat. The meat is inspected by the Kenya Meat Commission and the carcasses of cows which have died of anthrax are destroyed.

Inspection of meat in the K.M.C.'s abattoirs and factories was carried out by Government inspectors in accordance with international standards and had a reputation equal to any in the world. The K.M.C. had the sole power to sell meat in Kenya, outside the old reserve areas, and was at present operating in Nairobi, Mombasa, Kisumu and Nairobi.

NO POWERS OF ARREST

However, by special request of the Government, a quantity of meat slaughtered in abattoirs not controlled by the Commission was sold in Nairobi. It was alleged that the Government had no power to arrest such meat.

To enable provision to be made for the sale of un-inspected meat, K.M.C. officials petitioned the Government to allow them to sell meat from abattoirs under their control.

600 POWER WORKERS ON STRIKE

MORE than 600 East African power and lighting workers in the Nairobi area are on strike because of a dispute over wages.

The company issued a statement yesterday saying the dispute was being investigated and an outside arbitration board had been formed. However, the workers' union said the company had refused to accept the arbitration board's findings.
