# NOT-ALIGNED SUMMIT PEPS Cairo snub for 'sinister Tshombe'

Kenya, presidents and prime ministers and 23 other representatives including the Kenya Minister of State, Mr. J. N. Nyrop, have arrived in Cairo for the second non-aligned summit conference which opens today.

It follows the first non-aligned summit held in Belgrade in 1961 when East-West problems were at their height.

The Complete Prime Minister, Mr. Tshombe, is not being invited to take part in what was feared that his presence would obstruct the conference's work.

### Imperialism keynote expected

But a personal message signed by President Nasser of the U.A.R., President Tito of Yugoslavia and the Ceylonese Prime Minister, Mr. Bandaranaike, personally invited President Kasavubu of the Congo to attend. The message said it was hoped that the ban on Mr. Tshombe would not be taken as interference in the internal affairs of the Congo.

### Opposition to Mr. Tshombe, who planned to lead a 30-man delegation from Leopoldville, was said to be unanimous. Arab States were the most adamant, and President Kasavubu of the Congo would not sit in the same conference room as the "sinister" Tshombe. Mr. Tshombe said earlier this week that President Kasavubu would not attend.

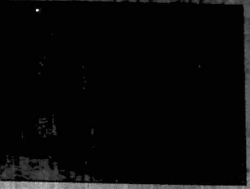

# Productivity by 6 p.c. during 1963

Productivity in Kenya in 1963-64 fell by 6.1 per cent, according to a report established in 1963-64 when there was a 2.3 per cent increase in output, although the industry has been held back by a 3.7 per cent increase in input. It is expected to expand as quickly as possible, and to increase exports.
