# DETENTION CAMPS

## Anti-Communist moves in North-East

REGULATION permitting the detention of any person in the North-Eastern Region, if it is necessary for the preservation of public order, has been published in a Kenya Gazette Supplement. The Public Order (North-Eastern Region) (Detention Camps) Regulations, 1964 were issued by the Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyatta.

Power to issue detention orders rests with the Minister for Internal Security and the administration and inspection of detention camps will be the responsibility of the Minister for Home Affairs.

Under the regulations, the right of appeal against a detention order is allowed to the Appellate Tribunal appointed by the Minister for Internal Security and a Detention Officer.

### Statement of grounds necessary

Whenever a detention order is issued it must be accompanied by a statement in writing of the grounds on which the order has been made and of the fact that right of appeal is available.

The case of any detained person will be reviewed by the Appellate Tribunal at least once during every successive period of six months, and that review will be directed at ascertaining the removal or retention of the detention.




