

COAST GAY FOR PRESIDENT

Navy inauguration at Mombasa

HERALDED by a crowd of several thousand, heralded by the band of the Kenya Army, and entertained by tribal dances, the Kenya President, Mr. Kenyatta, last night left Nairobi by train for today's inauguration of Mombasa of the Kenya Navy. It is the President's first official duty outside the capital since the January.

He was accompanied by Minister for Security and Defence, Mr. Pinaroo, Mr. Gichuru, the Minister for Internal Affairs, Mr. Mungai, the Attorney-General, Mr. Charles Wanjohi, and the Assistant Minister for Internal Security and Defence, Mr. C. M. O. Araprop-Koche.

On his arrival at the Nairobi railway station, the President, who had played the National Anthem, was escorted by the 3rd Battalion, Kenya Rifles, supported by a command of Maj. H. K. Metz.

Big crowd at station

Present to see the President off were the Vice-President, Mr. Odingo, the Minister for Foreign Affairs, Mr. P. J. Nget; the Minister for Home Affairs, Mr. D. Anap Mtui, and the Minister for Works, Communications and Power, Mr. D. Mwangi, senior Civil Servants and a crowd of several thousand. The President Kenyatta arrives this morning on his first day of his tour of the coast. He will arrive on his second day at the Coast by train from Nairobi due in Mombasa at 10.30 a.m. A special Presidential train had been scheduled to travel on the coast but the plans were changed yesterday morning.

Waiting to greet the President and his party will be the Mayor of Mombasa, Mr. J. M. Mwangi, and other members of the Council and administrative officers and members of the Government.

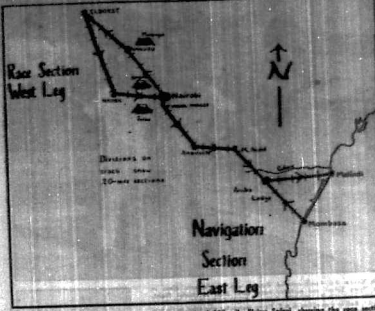

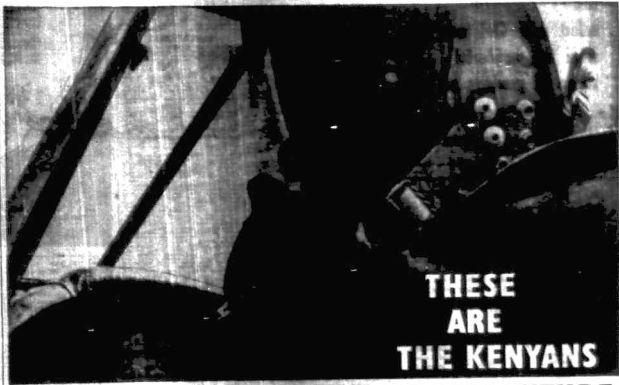

SEVERAL African and Communist delegates walked out of the General Assembly yesterday when South Africa's Foreign Minister, Dr. Hilgard Mulder, went to the podium to address the world forum during the resumed debate on world affairs.

The morning meeting had opened 40 minutes behind schedule, contrasting with the punctuality which had been maintained so far at this session.

The Spanish delegate had been due to speak first but the President, Mr. Alex Quisquon-Sanchez, of Ghana, said that his name had been taken of the list and Dr. Mulder would go to the podium instead.

Disruption of plane confirmed

AN Official United Arab Republic spokesman confirmed yesterday that U.A.R. officials shot down an unidentified plane on Saturday.

The spokesman said a Soviet plane, by letting that "wholly untrue" and by firing with a "friendly" intent, "was shot down" after it did not heed orders to "leave the area".

The spokesman said the aircraft was shot down on the eastern coast of the Red Sea and that the plane was carrying a "large quantity of arms and ammunition" and that it was "shot down" by "friendly" forces.

Asian States follow

The walkout followed immediately with Asian States including Japan, Thailand and Ceylon, following the African and Communist delegations.

Reports say that observers at the United Nations do not accurately identify all the delegates who walked out, but a rough count established that only 40 of the 105 nations remained represented in the Great Hall, some of them only a few delegates.

The only African who remained throughout the South African statement, during which Dr. Mulder made a strong defence of his country's policies and affirmed its capability of maintaining its economic and military capacity despite boycotts, was the Assembly President.

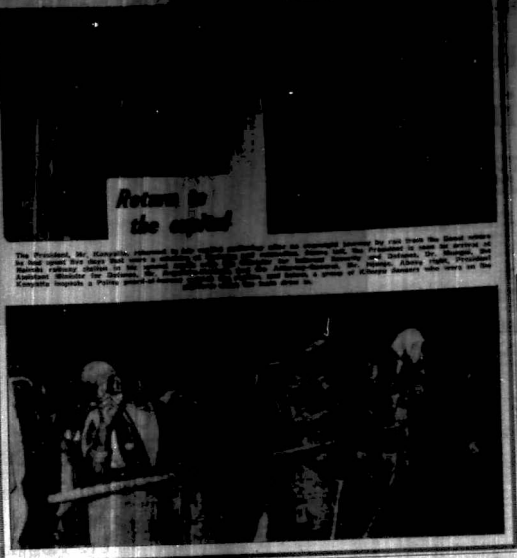
