Death of Mrs. R. F. Mayer

CO-FOUNDER OF THE "EAST AFRICAN STANDARD"

Life Devoted to Good Causes

A VIGOROUS CHAMPION OF THE CAUSE OF WHITE SETTLEMENT

Through the death of Mrs. R. F. Mayer, which occurred yesterday, Kenya has lost a vigorous champion of white settlement and a tireless worker in good causes.

With her late husband she founded the "East African Standard" in 1903 and carried the responsibility of a growing business during the war years, when she also founded the "Mombasa Times".

Thirty-six Years in Kenya

The East African Standard and her keen personal interest was shown in the rapid growth of the paper. Mrs. Mayer never wavered in her determination to maintain the paper and even in the early days of its publication she found outlets for that characteristic enthusiasm in the behalf of the small white community.

A Life of Service

Mrs. Mayer was born of French parents in Paris (now Douai), in 1890. About a year after marriage, she went to South Africa where she spent many years and where three of her children were born.

Mrs. Mayer in her early life was a member of the French Red Cross and, subsequently, during the South African War she served as a volunteer nurse in the Friends Red Cross Hospital at Johannesburg.

She was also appointed Supervisor of the Women's Employment Bureau and was attached to the British Relief Organisation.

For reasons of health Mrs. Mayer was later advised to leave Johannesburg and to live at a lower altitude, as at the Coast for a considerable time. She decided to visit East Africa and arrived in Mombasa in December 1903 with the intention of going to Uganda, for a holiday as she had letters to Sir Harry Johnston. She was in Mombasa when travelling through the country.

It was in Mombasa that she met the late Mr. R. F. Mayer, who was then a young and energetic man. They were married in 1904 and she was his partner until his death in 1948.

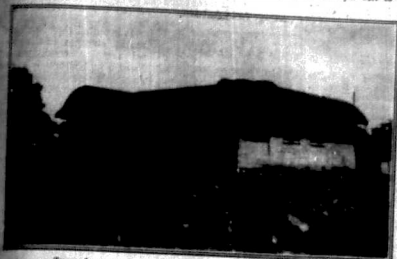
