## Reorganisation of the Executive Council

**PLANCED NUMBERS OF AND UNOFFICIALS**

TWO ELECTED MEMBERS: ONE MEMBER FOR INDIAN AND ONE FOR NATIVE VIEWPOINT

The Executive of the Governor of Kenya made an announcement to the Legislative Council yesterday respecting the reorganisation of the Executive Council—a task with which he was charged on his appointment.

He said a Member of the Executive Council must not be regarded as representing any particular section or interest but rather as envisaging the whole of the interests of Kenya.  
But each would view these interests from a different aspect, it would be possible to get a complete picture, he has recommended certain changes, and these have been approved in principle.

The eight official members of Council will be reduced to four—the Colonial Secretary, the Treasurer, the Attorney General and the Chief Native Commissioner. There will also be four in the unofficial side—two appointed to represent the European point of view and normally chosen from the District Members; one who will represent the Indian point of view; and the fourth appointed to represent the Native affairs, knowledge if possible not confined to Kenya.

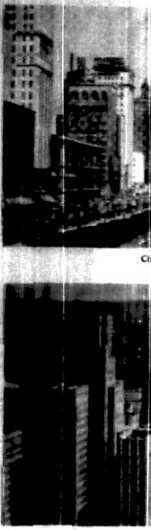

### MOTORING SECTION

#### Home Production of Oil

In another column will be found some speculations regarding the possibility of striking oil in the "wildcat" oil fields of England itself. While there may be many who who have an optimistic point of view, before the possibility, though not others before the home and overseas will welcome the prospect. The discovery of oil in Britain will, we should have a material effect upon the motor industry. The likelihood of oil being existing in the south of England is by no means a far-fetched one. The shale deposits of the south of Scotland have produced an oil suitable for use, extensively used by Naval craft and if good strikes are made in Shetland, in the Hebrides, the prospect of Britain becoming self-sufficing in oil is not distant. The motor spirit and lubricating oil is promising. To the overseas countries, however, possible fields have a more important implication. Such an eventuality would mean that they will be able to obtain a sufficient supply of oil for all overseas conditions, at a price not so very much in excess of the present cost of oil for medium-sized vehicles. The limitation of the kind of British oil to be used is also a result of the oil per horse power tax. This development of high taxation (compared to that current in America, for example) together with the high price of motor spirit resulted in the development of a small but efficient car that, however, left and, in some cases, has been made much to the regret of extreme Colonial conditions. In the United States a small car was not necessary. The price of gasoline (ranging from one penny to 2½ pence per gallon on the Pacific coast) per gallon on the Atlantic coast) was so low that an owner runs a car almost cheaply as paying for shoe leather. The United States, with its vast territory and population and absence of adverse customs barriers, enjoys an advantage that not even the British Empire could equal. Therefore, the trans-Atlantic product industry to remain cheaper at all times. ### OIL UNDER ENGLAND

#### During Course of German Grand Prix Race

A fortnight ago some details regarding drilling for oil in the colonies and the prospect of home produced oil for British cars furnished.

Below is published a letter from "The Motor" which subject dealing with past prospects and future possibilities. The great interest in the colonies and the prospect of home produced motor fuel may lead to the production of a large-type car suitable for overseas use.

In the article in question the writer says: "I have just returned from a visit of inspection of the plant that has been erected near Laven, in Shetland, for oil that will be appropriate, and certainly interesting, to come across an extract from a report—normal named soon after the 1,000 miles trial in 1936.

From such early beginnings the journal took an optimistic view of motor fuel. Stating that there were 2,000 motors in use averaging, at that time, between 4 h.p. and 5 h.p., it estimated that their consumption of petrol was about 150 tons per hour, in a year the consumption of these 2,000 cars would call for a supply of 4,000,000 gallons of petrol per year.

### "DICK" SEAMAN INJURED

#### During Course of German Grand Prix Race

When both cars, superchargers screaming, were stuck side-on, Delius's Auto Union touched Seaman's Mercedes and then shot off full speed over the embankment. E. von Delius was picked up by a broken leg, contusion, and facial injuries. Seaman's car struck on the road where his injuries would have been more serious.

#### Result of the Race

The race was won by Rudolf Caracciolo, (Mercedes) the crack German driver, in 3 hours, 46 minutes, 1 second after a close tussle with Manfred von Brauchitsch and Berndt Rosemeyer. Caracciolo drove the race for the fifth time. His average speed of 132.2 kilometres an hour (about 82 miles per hour) is a new record.

Von Brauchitsch (Mercedes) was second and Rosemeyer (Auto Union), third. Nordberg, the famous Italian driver, finished fourth in his Alfa Romeo.

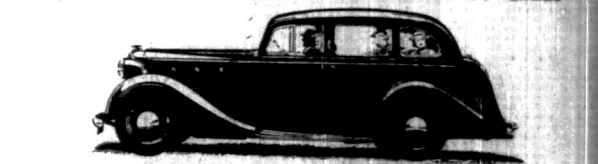

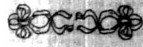

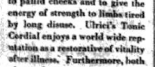

NEW SCHEME TO COST ABOUT £52,000 A YEAR

Enquiries in the Colonies

The British Government has decided to constitute a Colonial Empire Marketing Board, to fulfil its part of British Colonial Territories some of the functions formerly discharged for the whole Empire by the Empire Marketing Board, which was abolished in 1935.

It is anticipated the new Board will consist of about fifteen members, including representative members of Parliament and business men with experience of marketing Colonial produce. The Colonial Secretary will preside over the Board.

The House of Commons has already voted £10,000 for the expenditure of the Board, which, when in full operation is likely to require about £52,000 annually.

It is expected the Board will carry out a number of systematic investigations into Colonial marketing methods. —British Official Wireless Service.

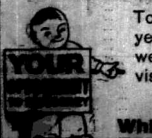
