British agents in Shanghai, of whom there are nearly 5,000 including 2,500 Indians, are to be evacuated and immediate steps are being taken by the Consular authorities on the instructions of the British Foreign Office.

While the fighting continues unabated and Japanese air raiders have dropped bombs on the Chinese Capital and on other points including railways.

The timely arrival of reinforcements, held up by a typhoon, has eased the difficult position of the Japanese around Shanghai and no offensive against the Chinese position has begun. On their part the Chinese are reported to be preparing to "liquidate" the Japanese before further reinforcements arrive.

The death toll in the Shanghai attack is steadily increasing. It is explained by the Chinese authorities that the dropping of bombs on the International Settlement was an unavoidable accident.

Britain and other Powers are continuing their efforts to reduce the Japanese and it is not yet clear in London whether Britain will remain strictly neutral or not. Reports are being received to the effect and it is believed that Britain will at least take steps to protect her interests and subjects in China.

RESIDENT NATIVE LABORERS To the Editor, "E. A. Standard." Sir—Mr. John Boyce, stock farming in coffee district, appears to forget that he is one of a minority and that minorities always have to suffer for the benefit of majorities. I know this by bitter experience when the butter levy was introduced, when I and two or three others, staying in coffee districts, lost ten far from creamery to make one of them. I was doing profits converted into annual losses and received no consideration either from Government or from the stock-brokers in spite of our protests. Mr. Boyce is to be pitied the times still talking about "kaffir farming". I think if such a thing exists to-day in Kenya, it is only there in another quarter—Kisumu. Many coffee planters, the majority, bought farms consisting of only a very small percentage of arable land, some because they could not afford the better lands, and others in order to be certain, through squatters, of having the necessary amount of labor for their coffee. In my own case for instance only 10 per cent. of my land is fit for coffee, the remaining 90 per cent. being suitable for native cattle and small isolated patches of native shambas.

GAME BIRDS IN KENYA GEESE To the Editor, "E. A. Standard." Sir—May I through the courtesy of your columns refer to the resolution passed and forwarded (sent) at the Njoro Association meeting last November regarding the game birds that were being deleted from the schedule of Game Birds protected under the Game Birds Ordinance in this district.

There was every legal justification for the Acting Game Warden proceeding as he did for the deletion of game birds in the class reserve as of the same date that two months ago no one person in the district of Njoro was aware that a former could not shoot game during his term of office. K. F. A. MARKET REPORT

Quiet Conditions in the Maize Market

The following is the Kenya Farmers' Association Market report for the week ending August 17.—

Maize

There has been a fair amount of buying of Plate maize on the part of Germany, but the market for African maize has been quieter. With the falling of the demand for S. A. maize, prices have come at the close of the week a definitely quiet tone prevailed. The recent large purchase on the part of Continental countries for European countries have filled their requirements for the time being, and although African maize is obtainable at a discount of very nearly 1/- per quarter, below the price of Plate maize, there is bound to be a reasonably good demand the moment any further buying takes place.

The freight market continues steady, and rail rates are being paid by South African shippers to Europe and Canada. The demand for white maize to Canada has been disappointing so far, but a fair trade continues to be done in maize.

There has been a further all round decline in prices with more favourable weather conditions in Canada, and heavy selling pressure from India and the Danube. Today's prices are:

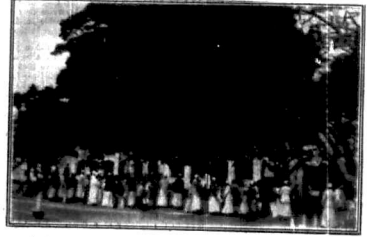

THE SITUATION IN SHANGHAI

CHINESE CLAIM VICTORY AT NANKOW

Shanghai, August 12.—Destroying the newly-built, five-story building and gradually retreating to the railway station and the railway between Shanghai and Wusung.

Shanghai, August 14.—The silence of Friday night was broken suddenly by the boom of guns heralding the resumption of fighting. Sporadic firing occurred and the Chinese claimed that they had advanced at one point a mile to the northwest of the Japanese headquarters.

Down on Saturday was signaled by the sound of light and heavy artillery. With decreasing rain it became clear that the time taken by aircraft had up to that date takes any part in the fight.

Meanwhile the British Consular officials unsuccessfully attempted to persuade the Japanese and Chinese forces to agree to a truce. According to one report, it was suggested that the Chinese should withdraw from the zone demilitarized after the hostilities in 1925, while the Japanese should simultaneously withdraw their reinforcements and armaments.

Drainage Development at Shanghai.

The possibilities of hostilities spreading to the International Settlement is suggested by the drainage developments at today's meeting of the International Trust Commission. The Chinese representative said that he could not guarantee the inviolability of the settlement and requested that the Japanese had used their tanks to charge on for their operations.

Powers' Joint Notes

Nanking, August 12.—China and Japan have issued identical and joint notes from France, Britain, America, Prussia, Germany, and Italy commending both Governments to avoid hostilities. It is understood that the Chinese reply will reiterate the desire for a peaceful settlement, and that the Japanese will emphasize the aggressive action of Japan in China, which has compelled them to take a firm attitude. It is stated officially that the Military Affairs Commission of the Japanese Government has completed a draft general mediation law which will be submitted to the Japanese Diet in plenary session in the adoption of the law.

Brief and Isolated Fights

Shanghai, August 12.—Alleging that the Japanese first fired, the Chinese attacked the Japanese and the fighting was broken out in the northern districts of Shanghai.

RE-ALIGNMENT OF KENYA AND UGANDA RAILWAY

BIG PLANS FOR NAIROBI-NAKURU SECTION

The scheme is, of course, a technical one at the moment and the operational and other details are in the hands of the various specialists in the railway administration. Round the latter end of the year, however, an economic one will really be laid out, and it will be possible to take advantage of the existing lines, and it will be possible to lay out a new line, to be known as the Nairobi-Cape Town line.
