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PETROL PUMPS ON FOOTPATHS

**Karen Municipal
Council Divided**

APPARATUS MAY REMAIN

Conflicting Resolutions
to Continue?

Petrol pumps on roads and road reserves were again before the Nairobi Municipal Council at their monthly meeting in Nairobi on Tuesday evening. Colonel Colman, M.P., moved a motion put forward by Councillor Tshakore, that petrol pumps on roads should be removed. The motion was carried. It was moved that the pumps be established by major engineering firms which are suitable to their manufacture. Specific reference was made to the prince belonging to Mr. C. W. Williams, Esq., and Cott and Co.

Mr. Tyree put forward his resolution in favour of an amendment to the motion of the Standing Committee.

Colonel Colman, M.P., moved a motion to remove the owners of pumps on the road or road reserve, requiring them to remove such pumps within six months from September 30.

"Public Interest."

Councillor Tyree said he looked upon the matter from the point of view of public interest. He was no reflection upon Council or the prince, but the state of affairs had changed and he thought a distinction should be made between the motor pump retailer and motorist. Motor pump retailers who had acquired a large number of pumps on buildings in Delamere Avenue and adjacent thoroughfares, had been compelled to close their business, and it was not an obstruction to interfere with these large employers of labour. No gas pumps could be served.

Councillor Allom supported the amendment. In future however they should not allow these roadside petrol pumps to be erected.

Trade Obstruction

The District Commissioner (Major Satcliffe) opposed. He said that the traffic in Delamere Avenue was obstructed by the roadside petrol pumps. The obstruction was caused by cars not actually taking in petrol, by boys sitting on the kerbs, all responding to the passing trade.

Colonel Colman considered that the Council should provide an alternative place for the convenience of a firm, but the arguments advanced by the District Commissioner against it had not been fully answered.

The late Sir George Williams suggested that these pumps should be removed if they continued overrunning the footpath. The Council would be compelled to extend the period they would stay themselves out of some of the premises where the pumps were being fitted at Government.

Councillor Colman said he might be right in his opinion, but the arguments advanced by the District Commissioner against it had not been fully answered. The District Commissioner actually had not blamed the petrol pumps for the obstruction but admitted that in many cases there were nothing to do with the petrol pumps.

Councillor Brainerd supported the amendment, said that the idea

of removal of petrol pumps had first been brought up with the idea of getting a scheme. Nairobi Council had the first franchise to erect an artistic building, and if they wanted to do so, the importance of the scheme was the thing, and the thing of the building was submitted to Council for consideration.

Municipal Engineer's Address

STEADY PROGRESS

An interesting review of some of the various engineering works undertaken by Government and the Nairobi Municipal Council and a comparison of conditions of a year ago with those of the present day were given by Mr. C. R. Davies, Municipal Engineer, in the course of a lecture at the Nairobi Institute of Technology on Friday evening.

Mr. Davies, who has been Mayor and Engineer for the past 14 or 15 years, having joined the Council's services in 1910 as assistant engineer.

He commenced his address by a reference to the appointment of Mr. Brewster Williams in 1901 as Sanitary Inspector and strongly supported by Mr. Williams' efforts in the improvement of the health of the city.

Mr. Williams' estimate for the year 1901 was £10,000, and since then the amount has increased to £100,000, and since 1910 to £1,000,000.

non-intervention plan without Germany's agreement.

Germany agreed conditionally upon all other Powers doing the same.

Under British suggestion, a reservation regarding Patents rights.

The attitude of France and Portugal was similar to that of Germany.

Lord Phipps' Message

Last night a meeting of the Non-Intervention Committee did not succeed in reaching a decision on the question of the status of Bulgaria and Turkey. The majority of the members present were of the opinion that no progress was made, and on the conclusion of the Part of Plymouth, the Committee decided to postpone the word until it takes place. It was agreed to adjourn a meeting of the Non-Intervention Committee for twenty-seven days on Wednesday afternoon.

The committee will, if agreed to, recommend to the League of Nations the submission of a draft resolution on the subject on Tuesday, November 7. It will also be asked to examine the British draft plan being submitted to two sides in Spain at their agreement.

Prince of Edinburgh

Duke of Lancaster: Opened communications with the Foreign Office, Mr. J. M. Barnes, Mr. E. F. H. Franks, and Mr. Duffield, the Foreign Minister, at a Congress of the British Commonwealth, which is being held in Little Sutton, near Oxford, on October 25. M. Delclos and other interventionists in Spain had a few hours to speak to the Prince before he left. He was determined to protect his country.

M. Bonnard and other French interventionists were anxious in diplomatic circles that he should not lead some troops to help the Republicans, and asked him to do so. He is reported to have said that he would not do so, and that he would not interfere in Spanish affairs. What is known about the Duke's views is that he was only the Spanish Ambassador to Britain.

Mr. Barnes asked: "What is known about the Duke's views on Africa?"

"Do we know that the Duke's views are anti-Fascist?"

The Duke denied this, and said that the Party's support of the Popular Front Government in France had been unanimous, and agreed with all nations states for national defense and security.

He said that the Foreign Minister was attempting to undermine the regime.


