JAPAN IS INVITED TO COME IN

NINE-POWER MEETING AND THE FAR EAST

DELICATE QUESTIONS ENTER INTO CHOICE OF MEDIATORS

New invitation to Japan and a proposal for mediation—that is the outcome of the Nine Power Conference.

A Sub-Committee will be set up to ask Japan on what conditions it will be prepared to co-operate with the Conference. This was suggested by the United States chief delegate, Mr. Norman Davis. He was supported on behalf of Great Britain by Mr. Anthony Eden and by Mr. Debes of France.

Mr. Davis also suggested that the small sub-committee might also offer its services to the two parties as mediators.

Will Germany Be Asked?

The question of sending an invitation to Japan to make peace with the Nine Power conference with a view to securing Japan's assistance for the resolution of hostilities was discussed yesterday at an informal meeting of Conference members at the Hotel de Ville. It was fully recognized that the composition of the Sub-Committee will be a delicate question—particularly in view of the attitude of Italy.

The Italian delegate suggested that the Sub-Committee should be composed to enter into direct contacts.

Mr. Norman Davis asked whether Italy wished to be included in the Sub-Committee but was not interested.

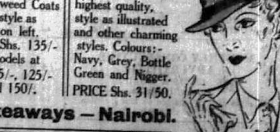
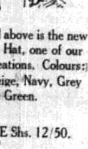

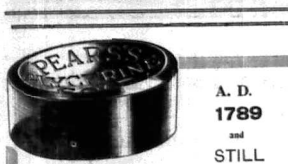

Three grants retained by Kenya from the Colonial Development Fund, under the 1st October fund, amounted to the sum of no less than £20,000 solely for developmental purposes, no more than £10,000 of which Government is expected to contribute.

"The expenditure increase for the 1948-49 financial year, as estimated by the House of Representatives, is £1,000,000. This is a considerable increase in expenditure.

"The explanation is a simple one. In the first place, the world economic revival, which following Kenya's better position for her products has inevitably resulted in an all-round increase in prices on articles which she has to buy. This increase is reflected in almost every head of expenditure.

"Secondly, the gross increase in expenditure under Head Military exceeds £400,000, and although this is a subject of some embarrassment by the territories of Uganda and Tanganyika, the net increase to Kenya is but £20,711.

"Honourable Members will agree that the expenditure is not available and that it represents the minimum provision which the Colony should make in the interests of security. At the same time, I feel sure by the view of the whole Council, that it is most unfortunate that at this stage of the war, the Government of Kenya's liability to devote so large a proportion of our revenue on unproductive expenditure due to causes wholly beyond our control.

Social Services

"The third reason for increased expenditure in 1948 is the need to consolidate the position of what, by the lack of a better word, may be called in the M.C.'s general report, social services. It is, I think, Your Excellency generally appreciated that very essential should be a necessary to maintain the educational opportunities in Kenya at their present level. The increase of £120,013 in this respect represents no expansion.

leave on the premises for sixty years, was removed.

Mr. J. T. Mistry stated that his client had held a licence for several years and had recently a licence of Abdul Wahid, who therefore had no claim at all to such a licence. The fact that one licence in the vicinity was granted to the client a few months ago proved that the building was suitable.

Mr. J. T. Mistry was not far forward, and when the point of Mr. Abdul Wahid's application for a licence nearby, the licence was issued by the Town Clerk stated that the Municipality was of the opinion that one licence in the vicinity was sufficient and that two should not be granted. The T. T. Trustee Association, represented by Mr. D. H. Newman, also thought one licence was sufficient in the area.

Comer Petitions

When the applications for licences in the outlying districts came forward various petitions were presented and were presented by the representatives of the applicants. On the other hand representatives of the firms in the respective areas already having licence submitted, there was no necessity for special licences.

In the case of Portough's Mill-shed, the case of Courthouse Mill-shed, the Town Clerk explained that insufficient information had been put forward in connection with the application for a restaurant licence. 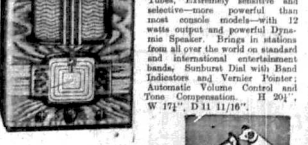

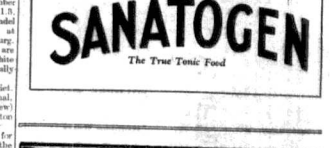

of license to applicants holding such licenses in the preceding twelve months. Major Cavendish-Desnoek also said that the Government should not be so lenient to private motorists. He thought that the Government should have full powers.

Referring to the damage caused by the motor traffic, the speaker stated that in some cases the roads were damaged to the extent of being unusable for heavy vehicles. He suggested that if they were really preparing them to plant something there, it was not necessary to have a license. 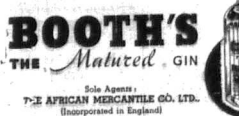
