PRAGUE CONSTERNATION

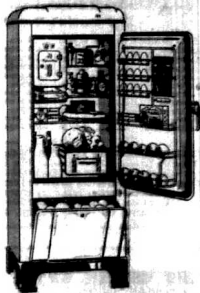

WHAT HERR HITLER Value Of SAID ABOUT The Guide Colonies Movement

Significant Exchange At Godesberg

The full text of what passed between Mr. Chamberlain and Herr Hitler at Godesberg with reference to Colonial and British dominions upon the exchanges, are now available. The main part of the talk was repeated to me already, already at Berchtesgaden, namely that this was a discussion of the territorial situation in Europe and that he had no wish to include any race in Germany. In the second place, he said that he had no wish to have any territory outside Europe that he wanted to be friends with, and that he had no wish to see any other people in the Sudeten question could be got out of my head. 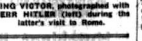
