JAPANESE TROOPS REACH RAILWAY FROM HONG KONG

Surprising Speed of S. China Invasion

WITH A SPEED THAT HAS SURPRISED FOREIGN OBSERVERS, AND THAT SUGGESTS THAT THE CHINESE FORCES HAVE STILL OFFERED NO SERIOUS RESISTANCE, THE JAPANESE INVASION IS PUSHING ON FROM HAI BEI, WHERE THE LANDING OF TROOPS CONTINUES.

Along the Canton-Kowloon railway has been reached and out about 15 miles from Hong Kong, and Tokyo stated that the Japanese forces are now six miles north of Waihow, which is 30 miles east of Canton.

Earlier, about a thousand refugees have entered Hong Kong, and it is reported that negotiations are in progress for the establishment of a safety zone for them in Chinese territory adjoining the Colony.

ATATURK "GRAVELY ILL"

At Ankara, Oct. 17.—It is reliably learned that Japanese troops have landed near Canton and are pushing on to the south coast of China. The Japanese force which is being completely interrupted.

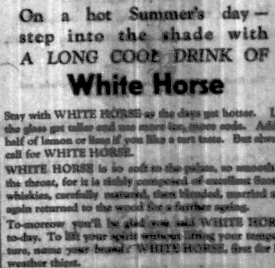



"IRISH PARTITION LIMITS CHANCE OF WAR AID"

Mr. de Valera demands All-Ireland Parliament

THE PRIME MINISTER OF IRELAND, MR. DE VALERA, IN THE COURSE OF A PRESS INTERVIEW DEMANDED THAT NORTHERN IRELAND SHOULD BE UNITED WITH IRELAND. HE SAID THAT WHILE PARTITION REMAINED, THE CHANCES THAT IRELAND COULD OPERATE WITH BRITAIN IN WARTIME WERE VERY SMALL.

Mr. de Valera suggested a single Parliament for all Ireland, to sit at Dún Dealgach and to control services now administered by the Imperial Parliament—defence, foreign policy, Post Office and certain customs and excise duties—while Northern Ireland could retain its local Parliament. A Belfast newspaper accuses Mr. de Valera of trying to blackmail the British Government.

The reply of Lord Cranston, Prime Minister of Northern Ireland was "I can only refer to the old battle cry—'No surrender'."

On the evening of Northern Ireland, Mr. de Valera said that they were trying to take advantage of the recent international situation to bring about a new partition. He said that the new partition would be based on religious lines and would be a step towards a complete separation of the two parts of the island. He said that the British Government was trying to force a new partition on Ireland and that he would not accept it. TROOPS MARCH INTO OLD JERUSALEM

Palestine Partition Plan May Be Dropped

HALF-PAST THREE YESTERDAY MORNING TROOPS OF THE GOLDSTRICK GUARDS MARCHED INTO THE OLD CITY OF JERUSALEM, WHERE CONTINUAL SHOOTING FROM CONCEALED ARAB MACHINE-GUN AND RIFLE POSTS HAD LED PRACTICALLY TO A STATE OF SIEGE. THE PURPOSE OF THE MARCH WAS TO CLEAR THE CITY OF REBELS, BUT LITTLE HAS BEEN REVEALED AS TO THE PROGRESS OF THE OPERATIONS WITHIN THE CITY WALLS. UP TO ONE O'CLOCK YESTERDAY, NINE ARAB WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED AND TWO BRITISH WOUNDED.

It is being widely reported in Britain that the proposals to partition Palestine may be dropped, on the recommendations of the Woodhead Commission, but the only official statement is that the Woodhead report has not yet been received, and that any statements are just speculation.

It is believed that the Palestine question took a prominent place in yesterday's Cabinet meeting in London, and the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, had a consultation with the Prime Minister and the Foreign Secretary before the meeting.

On Oct. 19, the Goldstrick Guards entered the Old City of Jerusalem at the invitation of the British High Commissioner for Palestine, Sir Herbert Plumer, and were met by a large number of Arab volunteers who were armed with rifles and shotguns.

Lord Craigavon Confident

Belief, October 19. In the Northern Ireland Parliament, Lord Craigavon, Premier, said that there need be no fear of any movement in the Northern Ireland, which would be detrimental to the interests of the British Empire. He stated that the Government were confident that the Northern Ireland would remain loyal to the British Empire.
