SECRETARY FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS RESIGNS

Disagreement Over Talks With Italy

COMMONS STATEMENTS

MR ANTHONY EDEN, SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS SINCE DECEMBER 1941, HAS RESIGNED, AS ALSO HAS LORD CHAMBRIER. THEY ARE UNABLE TO ACCEPT THE CABINET'S DECISION IN FAVOUR OF THE IMMEDIATE OPENING OF NEGOTIATIONS WITH ITALY WITH A VIEW TO A BETTER ANGLO-ITALIAN RELATIONSHIP.

The announcements of the resignations late on Sunday evening were the culmination of an anxious week-and-a-half regarded in many quarters as the most critical since the Abdication.

Both the Prime Minister and Mr Eden made statements on the position in the House of Commons last night.

Details of the negotiations between the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs had led him to believe that the Foreign Secretary would be asked to resign.

He had written to Mr. Eden with a request that he be allowed to remain in office, and was disappointed by his answer.

The Foreign Secretary returned to Downing Street at 7.45 and left home at 8.45.

No announcement of his resignation could be made to satisfy both the Foreign Secretary and the Prime Minister, who had written to the latter, in the King's name.

Explanation of Letters

Mr. Eden, in his letter of resignation, said:

"The events of the last few days have made plain the difference between our two views of foreign policy, and this view is greatly important in itself and in its bearings on other consequences. I cannot recommend to Parliament... a policy which can only bring disaster."

Apart from this, I have become convinced that we must know you have also, of the importance of diplomatic relations between the two countries, and in this respect, the problems of the day and also in respect of the future, we should seek to reach them. 

EMPIRE AIR MAIL SCHEME

Extension of the "All Up" Service to Include India/Malaya Section

As from the first February, 1938, the "all up" Empire Air Mail Scheme will be extended to the following countries:

Egypt, Syria, Palestine and Trans-Jordan.

BRITISH INDIA (including British Indian Post offices on the Persian Gulf, French India and Tibet, but excluding Portuguese India).

CYPRUS, BECHUANALAND, UGANDA, MALAYA;

Federated Malay States, Malaya, Straits Settlements;

NORTH BORNEO, SARAWAK, CANADA, NEWFOUNDLAND.

All first class mail for the above countries will be carried on the Empire Air Mail Scheme services at a flat rate of postage as follows:

Letters: 20 cents for each 4 oz.

Postals: 15 cents each.

Reply postcards: 30 cents each.

The same conditions will apply to this extended service as apply to countries already participating in the "all up" Empire Air Mail Scheme.

The above mentioned postage rates for first class mail cancel all previous air and surface rates and the use of blue air mail labels will no longer be necessary.

Postal articles other than first class mail matter are subject to the existing rates of postage which may be conveyed by surface routes unless prepaid at letter rate.

Air Mail parcel post is not available to the countries named but such items will be accepted as first class mail prepaid at the same rate as subject to the maximum weight of 4 lbs. 6 oz. not being exceeded. The existing surface mail parcel rates remain unaltered.

Registered correspondence may be transmitted by air under the new scheme by the payment of a registration fee of 20 cents in addition to the normal postage rate.

Insured items (including insured boxes) may also be tendered for delivery by air at the charge and conditions laid down in the Regulations.

As the "all up" Empire Air Mail Scheme develops and extends, it is anticipated that other Empire countries will participate in the scheme. Further details in this respect will be notified from time to time.

THE ENQUIRY: OBLIGATIONS TO FINANCE COMMITTEE

To the Editor, "E. A. Standard":
Sir,—In their Election Manifesto
of 1935, all members of the recent Legislative
Assembly gave their support to the
Legislative Assembly for election to
the Kenyan Parliament. It is now
deemed that in that instance there
was a majority in favour of the
Kenya Government, and the most
probable view is that they may
have in favour of Income Tax can
be regarded as a "one pending enquiry". An early
date would be preferable, but practically all
who have harboured such a view
have had to give way to the
views of those who have not.

The Income Tax Ordinance came
into force on January 1st, 1938, and

enough to allow every member of

concern to the enterprise
and investment of the country.
Furthermore, the nature of Income
Tax legislation is such that
any committee that purports
to give an impartial and
comprehensive judgment. For these
reasons, it is felt necessary that
any Committee of Enquiry
should be given the power
to include persons specially
knowledgeable in the economics
of Kenya enterprises and
persons who have no or have
little knowledge of the local
Administration.

It is felt that the proposed
enquiry should be limited to
the examination of the
Income Tax Ordinance, and
that the Standing Finance Committee

The attempt to produce a crisis merely superficial can be seen in the fact that the League of Nations, upon which so much stock has been laid, has had nothing to do with it.

The deceptions made by Great Britain, France and the United States in the pretences of the Committee put have failed the League; over a thousand delegations have been sent to Geneva.

The League at the present time is in a position to confer a surgical operation. It would die without a struggle, but it might prove fatal. There is nothing for it but to let the healing work go on, until it is safe and await its results.









Mr. Lloyd George and Premier Come to Grips

THE CENSURE MOTION

HEAVILY EXCHANGES BETWEEN MR. LLOYD GEORGE AND MR. NEVILLE CHAMBERLAIN WERE A FEATURE OF THE DEBATE IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS ON THE LABOUR OPPOSITION'S MOTION OF CENSURE ARISING OUT OF THE RESIGNATION OF THE FOREIGN SECRETARY.

Mr. Lloyd George accused the Prime Minister of having purposely withheld information from the Cabinet because he wanted to ensure Mr. Eden's resignation. This was denied by Mr. Chamberlain.

Mr. Winston Churchill speaking in support of Mr. Eden said it had been a good week for dictators and declared Signor Mussolini had succeeded in his vendetta.

London, February 22.—Sir H. R. Wilson, MP, and Sir Arthur Greenwood moved the Labour vote of censure on the Government.

That the House deplores the conduct of the Foreign Secretary because he has agreed to resign his office and has not done so; and that the House advises in their conduct of foreign affairs.

We do not advise the Government of tending our election slogan "We want peace" if we are to be asked to defend the League of Nations.

The Foreign Office policy.

He asked for an assurance that the Government were not going to support a neutral Italy and that we were not going to have a policy of truckle and snuff. We do not advise the Government to reverse its policy; they challenged the Government to meet the challenge.

Reform of League

Mr. Chamberlain replied referring to the reform of the League of Nations that the League constituted was unable to provide effective security for anybody and that the most important task of the League of Nations or small weak nations interested in the League was to keep them against aggression.

He would stay in the League until the League was reconstituted and had valuable work to do. He would support the League even if the League would ever do it. The best work to do in its members was to make the League more effective in upholding its principles.

Mr. Churchill's article in the *Covenant*, even Article 14 dealing with Sanctions, he hoped would be reconstituted so that it might be adopted by the League powers originally intended.

Good for Dictators

Mr. Eden's resignation was good for the League of Nations. Hitler had said he would have been a good candidate against Mr. Eden.

He sketched the picture of Hitler's dictatorial temperament which would have been compelled to settle in the League of Nations where they had given little satisfaction.

It was easy to see why Italy wanted external security which certain parts of Italy had been granted largely to themselves.

Referring to the Italian annexation of Corfu, he said there was little that Italy was able to do as the League was not very convincing.

Good for Austria

Others and their shadows should have been during a quiet period. Lloyd George and Mr. Chamberlain.

Relief for Farmers — MORE INTEREST ON AGRICULTURAL ADVANCES

A proposal to raise charging under Agricultural Advances Ordinance was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on the 18th January. The proposal aims at widening up of the existing scheme so as far as possible the amount given to the Government by the payment of a bill to amend the Agricultural Advances Ordinance. The amendment in Council has appeared in the gazette introduced into Legislative Assembly.

The Principal Commissioner is now an ordinary employee and the proposal is to give him a salary of £1,000 per annum. It is proposed that farmers who had exhausted all their resources in the interests of the country to make room on the land should be given preference in the distribution of participants in the scheme. The proposal is aimed at removing the long-standing difficulty in practice of giving preference to applicants whose savings and locust infestations were the most serious and had with largely large areas of damage.

1939, Less Than Year

Therefore it is proposed to cease charging interest on advances as from January 1st of this year. The maximum interest of 5% of the maximum amount of the loan will be a loan of £1,000, which must be added the sum of £100,000 estimated for the year.
