Moscow, March 3. There were amazing scenes on the first day of the opening of Russia's latest and greatest treason trial which over a score of some of the most prominent figures in the history of the Russian Revolution are in the dock on charges of conspiring to overthrow the Republic...

FRENCH LABOUR CHARTER

Paris, March 3. The French Government's trouble over the British Charter which has reached the point where it will be returned separately from the present accord.

In addition to the accord it is revealed that seven prominent Soviet leaders who recently signed the Anglo-Soviet pact will be returned separately from the present accord.

CONDITIONAL ON PEACE TALKS

THE GOVERNMENT HAS ISSUED A WHITE PAPER SURVEYING THE PROGRESS ACHIEVED TO MAKE GOOD BRITAIN'S DEFENCES REGARDING THE COST IT STATES THAT THE ESTIMATES FOR THE CURRENT FINANCIAL YEAR PROVIDED FOR AN EXPENDITURE OF £284,000,000.

The indications are that the programmes in hand are likely to involve massive expenditure in 1938 in excess of the provision in the last estimate.

While future expenditure will particularly depend on the degree of success attending the efforts of the Government to achieve some agreement in international affairs, it is expected that the total expenditure on defence over the five financial years 1937-41 will exceed the sum of £1,500,000,000 mentioned in the White Paper of February, 1937.

The statement goes on to say that the speed with which the strength of the Navy is increasing is shown by tonnage figures indicating that in 1937 there was a total tonnage of 130,000 tons which has now been progressively raised to 147,000 tons at the beginning of 1938.

The programme of new ships to be laid down in 1938 includes two large and three small carriers, two destroyers, and two frigates.

Other features emphasized by the White Paper are the large number of types of aircraft being delivered to the Government and the increased number of aircraft carriers.

The strength of all ranks, say the figures, has increased by nearly 15,000.

Flotilla Expanded A British Official White Paper says the average estimate for 1937 was £283,370,000, an increase of £22,630,000 over 1937.

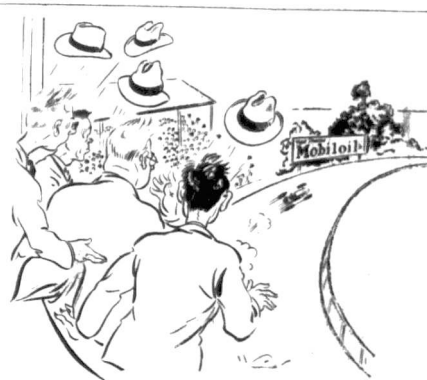

Conditions For Present Year (1934)

The Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of Kenya announces the conditions which will govern the Maize Seed Competition (1934).

The two main reasons for this Competition have remained: (1) That vendors are afforded an opportunity of an accurate and impartial test of the productive capacity of their seed; (2) That the purchasers be afforded some assurance of the merit of the seed which is offered for sale.

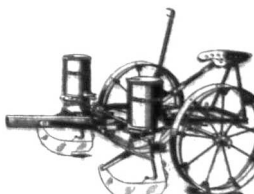

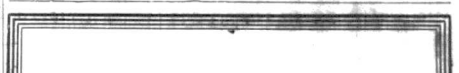

London, March 3.  
Britain without the times of departure being made available to the public was raised at question time in the House of Commons today by Mr. Dackworth.

The Assistant Postmaster General said this only applied to flights to Empire countries on the East and South African and Malaya routes.

His many friends, and countless thousands of readers who know him as the original Uncle Dick of the "Daily Mirror," will be grieved to learn of the death of Matthew Butterfield, after a long illness, of Mr. D. J. Lamb. He was forty-nine years of age.

He joined the staff of the "Daily Mirror" in 1896, and his thirty-year service was interrupted only by the time he was in the Great War. After the war he was the first man to interview Hitler after his flight across the Channel.

But it was as the creator—with Mr. A. B. Payne, the artist of the journal, of the "Pip Squawk and Wilfred that Placated," and for many years to come, by his innumerable "gaggers" and "snobs" who knew him only as Uncle Dick.

Pip Squawk and Wilfred became household names. Laying pen to word triumphant tours of the British Empire. The paper over the sea. 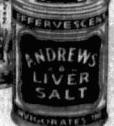

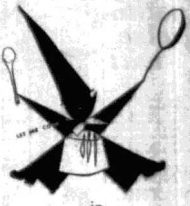

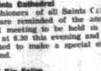

## "CONTINUANCE OF BOYCOTT MUST HARM EVERYONE"

### Value of Compromise

His Excellency the British Resident of Zanzibar addressed a representative gathering of Indians on the Government's proposals for modifying the recent slave legislation, at a meeting held in the Victoria Garden Hall, on Thursday last week.

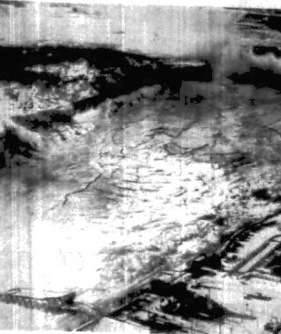
