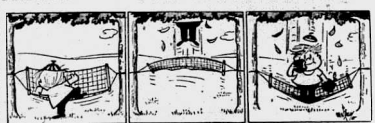

Delegates discuss better use of water

of water GOVERNOR WARNS: BE PRACTICAL

AFRICA's biggest conference on water, attended by delegates from 25 countries and seven international organizations, was opened at the High Commission yesterday.

The conference, opened by the Governor of Kenya, Sir Patrick Besson.

It was presided over by the Commissioner for Technical Cooperation South of the Sahara, Mr. J. H. G. M. B. The 120 delegates will discuss the problems connected with water resources and land-use for two days.

The Governor defined the object of the conference as being to ensure that the very best use is made of every drop of rain that falls on Africa.

DEVELOPING AFRICA

He spoke of the "sometimes catastrophic" failure of land policies in Africa because of the rise in population and the demand for increasingly high standards.

He said: "So often you provide to the administrators has been to reduce the population in an area, or to transform some-marginal graziers into peasants." This advice was not usually practical, and the hydrologists must produce a plan which would allow the present population to remain on the land and produce more food or more cash crop.

LECTION DIARY

Secretary's conception of his task in Kenya was described by Mr. Iain Macleod himself when he received me at the Colonial Office for an exclusive interview on the current scene in Colony. Here are the questions as they were put and the full text of Mr. Macleod's replies—

QUESTION 1. The election in Kenya is overshadowed by two issues: the future well-being of minorities and the release of Jomo Kenyatta. Your policy in both these respects has been under heavy fire. On the eve of the elections can you allay these concerns?

ANSWER. The election will be decided by the people of Kenya through machinery which has been established. We do not intend to express any opinions on parties or their candidates or their policies, but I understand anxieties to which you refer and will do my best to answer your questions.

As regards minorities I do think it is important that people should not lose sight of paragraph 11 of the White Paper issued after Lancaster House. There I said one of the aims of H.M. Government was to achieve a general acceptance by all of the right of each community to remain in Kenya and a part in public life. I also mentioned three main principles which rested our policy towards future constitutional development in Kenya.

I have not changed my views on this and I do not expect to do so. I conceive my role in Kenya to be trying to help to create conditions in which all those who have made their homes in Kenya will continue to do so and apply the principles to which I have referred in various stages of constitutional development.

There will be no transfer of power under the new constitution. There will be greater African participation in the Legislature and in the Council of Ministers — and I am sure that that is right and that it would be, and that it will be, in the long-term interests of Kenya, which are electoral and other constitutional arrangements which will be made in due time to go in company with those who already have experience; so that we can develop over a period of genuine cooperation at political level between those who are to be exercised in Kenya's problems and needs, especially in the economic sphere, and that those who will have a worthwhile part to play in Kenya's economy will not be prevented from playing that part.

As to Kenya's aid, I may the Governor explained why he could not order Kenya's release and I fully agree with his statement. The Governor's concern is not to be over-enthusiastic about Kenya's release and he has applied and continues to apply in Kenya's case, as in indeed in other cases, is that of danger to the security of the country. The criterion has not changed.

Economy 'basically sound'

QUESTION 2. A major criticism of the Lancaster House Constitution was that it took no account of economic consequences. Is this a valid point?

ANSWER. I do not think it is a valid point. The economy basically sound. The economic difficulties need only be abridged and I believe that the tide will turn. We have actually have the new constitution in force and working.

All parties, including myself, who have worked out the basic principles of this next constitutional step, have taken into account a number of other important factors into account. I think the factors and the grants contemplated, and other arrangements, are the main groups was the disastrous political and economic consequences of Kenya that was working in Kenya were not achieved.

QUESTION 3 and 4. Accepting the fact that H.M. Government is seeking of the present situation of Kenya, could you enlarge on the "flexible instruments" you mentioned in the Lancaster House Constitution, as you mentioned in the Colony? ANSWER. I would be premature for me to be more specific about financial aid just at this time of ways over and over again, giving it in a number of ways over and over the normal C.D. and W. grants and loans. 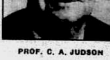

Corporation of India

TRADITIONS OF EAST AFRICA IN THE £210,000 HQ.

By Ronald Hutton

BUILT at a cost of more than £210,000 the Life Insurance Corporation of India, the Jeevan Bharti Building, its new headquarters in Nairobi combines the latest architectural techniques and contemporary design with traditional Indian features.

The word 'Jeevan' is Sanskrit for 'Life' and is used here to signify life insurance, while 'Bharti' means 'of India', so that the true translation of the building's name is simply 'Life Insurance of India'. Situated in the centre of the City Square on Coronation Avenue, the building consists of a ten-storey central wing with two seven-storey side wings. With a height of 115ft. it is the tallest building in the centre of Nairobi.

The total area of construction is 65,000 sq. ft. with a main frontage of 125ft., facing on Coronation Avenue. Construction is of reinforced concrete throughout, with hollow tile and reinforced rib floors.

Though the general styling and design is contemporary, opportunity has been taken to introduce traditional Indian features. In the centre of the main entrance court the Ashoka capital is mounted on a pillar, identical in detail and proportions to the ancient original which forms the emblem of the Government of India.

Doors open automatically

A series of internal main doors are also carved in Indian motifs, and hinged panels similarly carved are being brought from India to be fitted on the two sides of the main entrance.

The entrance hall is paved with Indian pink and black Abu nashua while the walls are lined with pink Abu marfi. The floor above ground level are all of East African wood.

Spacious corridors are provided on all floors, the lift and staircase hall on each being closed off by two pairs of large double doors paneled and treated in Indian architectural detail with carefully carved arabesques.

Exterior finish consists of a facing of grey Makrana and white Gattina marble from India, with a lower slabs used for the external facing on all the upper floors in a green glazed tile panels between white concrete ribs.

All office facing east and west are protected from direct sun by the reinforced concrete covers and adjustable metal louvers. All window frames on the ground and first floors are in polished aluminium.

A novel feature of the building is that the main entrance doors, which are of the traditional Indian style, are electrically operated and open automatically on a person approaching a given point on the way in or out of the building.

The doors will be flanked by two panels carved in bas-relief, each 10ft. high and nearly seven feet wide. These panels have been designed and executed by an Indian artist and are being specially shipped from India.

Welfare our responsibility

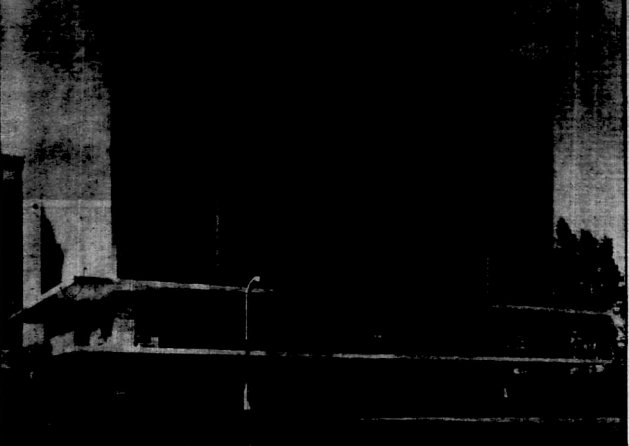
The two north gables of the building, which are faced in pink Makrana marble from India, the Corporation's emblem consists of a central lamp flanked by two hands, protecting the lamp from the rain. The hands are in the form of the Ashoka Capital in Sanskrit 'Yoga Kshema Yabhyashan', which means 'Your welfare is our responsibility'.

The motto is taken from Bhagavad Gita which appears in the Mahabharata, one of the Hindu epics. The black rock Krishna Infants Hospital, which the welfare of the people is the responsibility of the Corporation, has no need to worry about the material problems of life.

A TESTIMONY

The magnificent building built in Nairobi, the Corporation of India, is the unshakable testimony to the welfare of the future of Kenya.

LIFE insurance business has been carried on in East Africa since shortly before the end of the last century, and throughout this period Kenya has been the main centre of insurance activity in the three territories.

Overseas insurance concerns operating in East Africa included no fewer than 38 Indian companies, 17 with registered offices in East Africa and the rest operating through agents. One of the Indian companies began its operations in East Africa 50 years ago.

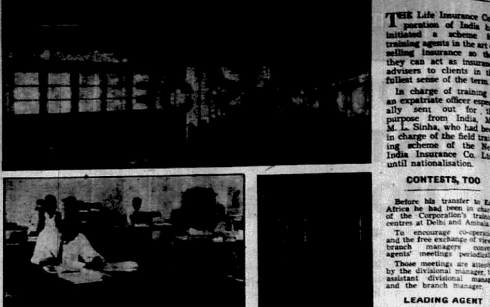

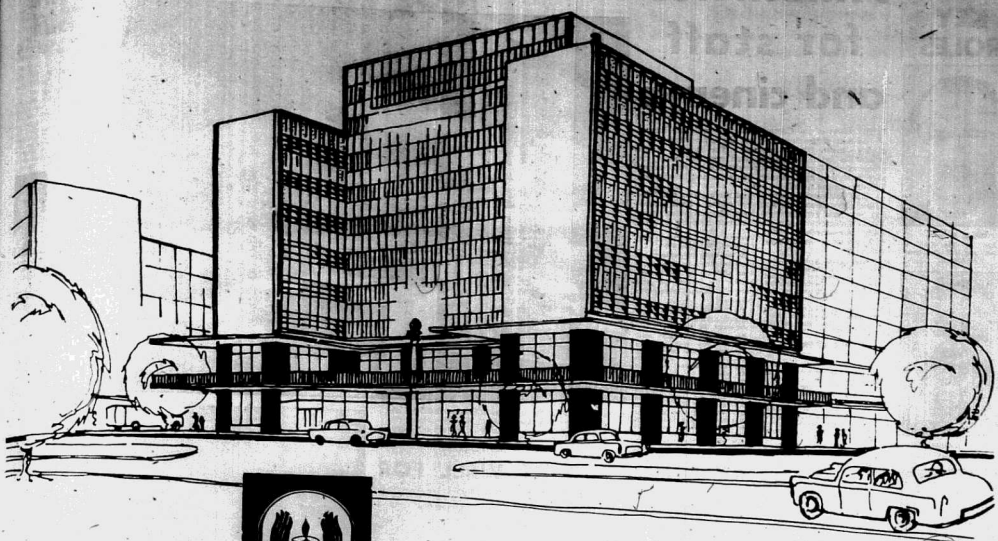

THE offices of the Commissioner for India are located on half of the first floor and the entire second floor of the Jeevan Bhairati building. THE Jeevan Bhairati Building is the first building to be constructed by the Insurance Corporation of India since its establishment. Section inter-ethnic attacked DELEGATION OF ALL RACES TO LONDON URGED

APPEAL FOR NO VIOLENCE DURING AFRICANS' 'SACRIFICE'

Standard Staff Reporter, Mombasa. **THE KNU call for a three-day general strike beginning on February 27 to have the release of Kenya was received with cheers by a crowd of about 25,000 who attended a KNU Mass Meeting at the Municipal Stadium yesterday.**

Before speaking on the future of the Coastal Strip, Kenya read two letters which had been received by KNU, which appealed to Europeans, Asians, Arabs and Africans to work hard for African autonomy.

West Europe set for car boom

BUT BRITAIN AND U.S. FIGHT MENACE OF GROWING SLUMP

MOST of West Europe's motor-car makers are preparing for booming conditions this year while Britain and the United States industry is faced with short-time working and redundancy, according to a Reuters survey.

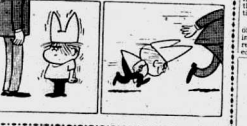
