MR. NAIROBI HERE WARS ON PEEMLES

'Expe South Africa or we stay out'

TANGANYIKA will not seek to join the Commonwealth if South Africa is permitted to remain in the community. This was the ultimatum contained in a message sent last night by the Tanganyika Chief Minister, Mr. Nyerere, to the Commonwealth Prime Ministers in London.

"A decision by the Prime Ministers one way or the other on the question of South Africa will be a decision on the future of Tanganyika," he said.

The Chief Minister added that if the Prime Ministers failed to condemn the South African Government "by the only method which South Africa's application for membership leaves open to them," he would have compromised when the Commonwealth ought to stand for

Fairness to all

Explaining his message Mr. Nyerere said last night that Tanganyika was determined to build "a society of human beings where the colour of a person's skin shall not be so much in the eyes of God as in the eyes of his fellow men." "The policy followed by the present Government is," he added, "the policy followed by the present Government of the Union of South Africa is diametrically opposed to our policy."

"Here in Tanganyika we believe passionately in accepting people as they are, as human beings," he said. "It is not a matter of race but of individuals who we shall do all. Nobody is going to get unfair treatment because he is of a different colour from those who happen to be in the majority. They happen to belong to a particular country. We believe it is equally wrong and nonsensical to be in the majority and to oppress those who are not."

"It is not always easy to overcome the prejudice of human beings, but here in Tanganyika we are trying and we will continue to try."

It urges the immediate adoption of Africanisation and suggests that preference should be given to Africans in the filling of vacant posts, including "promotion" posts. Candidates from other races should only be considered if no suitably-qualified Africans were available.

"Let it not be thought that in proposing Africanisation we demand the early retirement of large numbers of the civil servants of other races," the statement added.

On the contrary, the services of many of them are a great asset to Kenya and it is a pity that they are not being used to their full potential.
