WARNING TO JAPAN BY U.S.A.

Legal Obligations in the Far East.

OTHER NATIONS' INTERESTS IN CHINA. America to Stand Firmly on Her Rights. MUST MAINTAIN THE POLICY OF THE OPEN DOOR.

The Government of the United States has issued a statement setting forth its policy in regard to the Far East more especially concerning China. This statement has also been presented to the Japanese Government as a reply to the recent announcement to Powers dealing with affairs in the Orient.

The statement points out that the United States is one of the signatories of certain treaties guaranteeing the integrity of China and the maintenance of the policy of the open door. "America stands firmly on her treaty rights."

The United States adds that no treaty can be modified or terminated except by agreement among the parties concerned, and no nation can rightfully endeavour to impose its will in a situation in which the rights of other nations are involved.

Following an assurance given by the Japanese Foreign Minister to the British Ambassador, Great Britain has decided to let the matter rest.

The Japanese Government, however, has been informed that Britain cannot admit Japan's right solely to decide whether actions by other countries in China are likely to be a danger to Japan.

Britain Satisfied.

The trend of the conversations between the British Ambassador and the Japanese Foreign Minister has been such as to give the impression that the Japanese declaration on the subject of China was dictated by the British, during a question time in the House of Commons.

Excellent Bathing and Fishing.

AN EXPERIMENTAL TRIP.

Mr. Galton-Fenz writes as follows:—

"Every year I get many enquiries about the Seychelles. These lovely islands are about three days distant from Mauritius by steamer. The climate during our cold winter there is most excellent and I am told that the bathing beaches are not deep so swimmers are second to none. The great attraction here is that the cost of things is far cheaper than elsewhere in East Africa. There are three small furnished houses available at a cost of £2 to £4 per month. Services can be obtained for this period for Nis. 10 to Nis. 20. Food is also very plentiful and cheap and there are no mosquitoes. You will be pleased to hear that I have been able to arrange with the British Indian Steamship Navigation Co. for an experimental holiday trip to be run in August of this year.

Cost of Tickets.

The steamer is a "Karanja" which leaves Dur on Salomon on the 14th August. Zanibar on the 15th, and Montoux on the 16th, arriving at the Seychelles on the 19th August. "Misrepresentation and Misunderstanding."
FOUND IN ENGLAND.

[STANDARD] [CORRESPONDENT] London, April 21 (By Mail).
 The Jubilee of Croxson, Dr. E. S. Woods, returned this week from his visit to the gold fields, in a short time receiving a public address on the much discussed subject of the position of the natives of Kenya following the discovery of gold there.

In an interview, he said—"The subject is far too important for me to make anything other than a carefully considered statement. I spent three weeks there investigating missionary and political problems and especially 'probing' conditions with the new goldfields at Kakamega. There is no doubt that there has been in this country a good deal of misrepresentation and misunderstanding about the question."

African Christians.

"I should like to refer to the very much overdone criticisms on the general principle of the effect of missionary work on the native mind. Some people not only find a semi-educated native is no better and perhaps worse than one who is left in his natural state. Obviously, a native who has just been brought into contact with Christianity must have his short comings."

Government.

"On the other hand, Government people and men after him in the Administration tell me that they would far rather have a Christian African boy than a pagan for the job of minor official. They are far more capable, trustworthy and reliable."

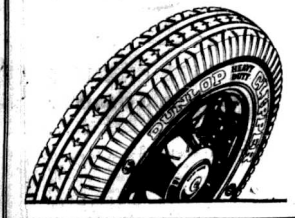

PROMOTION OF SAFETY AT SEA.

Work of Special Services of Royal Navy.

VALUABLE SURVEYS.

Many New Charts and Corrections Made.

The work done last year in promoting safety at sea and in conducting surveying knowledge by special services of the Royal Navy, is recorded in a report by Captain J. A. Edgell, Hydrographer of the Navy.

Eight surveying ships were employed for inshore waters and four in foreign stations. The first mentioned were engaged in a hydrographic survey of British waters which will take years to complete. The "Challenger" engaged a winter survey party in Labrador and will pick up its members next July. The "Endurance" worked the West Coast of Africa, and Palestine and made large scale hydrographic surveys of Malé and the Soundings in the Atlantic. The "Herald" was employed off the north coast of China the east coast of Malaya and the west coast of Burma and also carried out a series of valuable observations. A great many new charts and corrections were made.

Captain Edgell's report acknowledges the receipt of useful intelligence information from Hydrographic Departments, and mentions that many charts were published, but without mentioning the exact number of charts and other documents so freely exchanged.

Kakamega Goldfields: Number Two Area.

CERTAIN RESERVATIONS TO BE APPLIED.

To General Prospecting.

Despite Sir Albert Kitson's recommendation in his Interim Report on the Kakamega Goldfields that the whole of Area Two should be opened for general prospecting, Government has decided that there shall be certain reservations.

These reservations include one area which, containing as it does a large outcrop of low grade reef, is considered to be better suited for treatment as a unit. Another excluded area is in a "fly" belt and various other small areas are excluded for specific purposes.

Prevalence of "Fly."

Area Two of the Kitson Report is to be opened for general prospecting on May 17 with certain reservations. 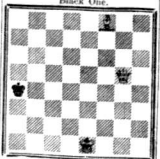

The Europeans won the top and played the White pieces on the odd-numbered boards. The pairing and the order of play was decided, as usual, by drawing the names out of a hat, and for the third time in succession Spencer Palmer was drawn against James Das who defeated him in 1932 and 1933. The game had a splendid fight James Das defeating the Vienna Attack with a King's Pawn-better. A series of judicious exchanges left the European with a positional advantage in having better development and an open King's file for a Rook attack, obtained by the sacrifice of the R. B. Pawn. Having trapped something of the remarkable preserving powers of his opponent Spencer Palmer built up a strong defensive position and refrained from premature attack with the result that he commanded of the centre and the open King's file steadily developed into a win. It was a very interesting game of 30 moves, without any obvious mistakes and it lasted about 4 hours.

Cooke came out of the opening struggles with an attack which enabled him to win the exchange of Knight for Rook, but the wily Ranjit Singh made a successful recovery with care and great cunning, and in the ending Yackie found himself with a Rook and two pawns, Pawns against two Knights. The Indian took both Pawns for one Knight and almost succeeded in drawing the game.

Menon came into the ending stage two Pawns down, but managed to win what the spectators believed was a dead lost position. This was the longest of all the games and lasted nearly 4 1/2 hours. Baron Turek's excellent defence allowed the Indian to bring his King safely through the cross and the end-game was easy for M. Amn with a piece to the good.

W. T. Hestock playing his usual "Banker's Chess" gave nothing away to Daulat Bhan, but the position was quite even when he managed to fork the Indian's King and Pawn with a Knight. Daulat Bhan having forgotten that the Pawn he was trying to capture the Knight was passed and stolen. The rest

of the game was a foregone conclusion against a man like Bostock. R. Middlebrook who has not taken part in these annual matches for many years showed an indication of his former power and so did M. A. Math. played the opening very well and for a long time the game was a draw. However experience in the opening chess enabled Middlebrook to see from a few slight advantages built up in the middle game.

Q. W. Davidson, defending a Queen's Pawn Opening had a very level fight for a long time against Tarabali M. Ali. But he secured positional advantages in the late middle game including an open Rook's file. The young player was very quick and was the victor, although they took over 5 hours.

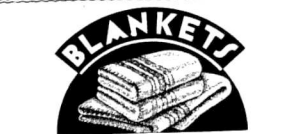

MOROCCO.

A Special Supplement of the "Financial News."

That transformation has been the result of an intense, well directed, human effort which ought to be better known in this country than it is."

Trade Opportunities.

Morocco is today a modern market, where not only are the quantities of duralumin and permanganate appreciated, but the wider range of goods is demanded. With the old Morocco British trade had many foes, and it seems as if the effect of three old laws had made the British trader a little more popular. The change that has taken place in the demands made by old customers who still are only too willing to take British goods."

AN ADVENTUROUS LION.

Tanganyika Natives' Fear of a Returned Spirit. [STANDARD CORRESPONDENT] A lion in the Bagila River terraces has been creating a great deal of excitement lately. It is usually bold, but has been known to stop up a heavy iron door in order to enter a hut. His usual rule of present conduct at least night spots besides various goats, ducks and fowls. Eggs, too, are not immune to his attacks. Numerous attempts have been made to kill him, and he is known to have been wounded on at least three occasions with spears, one in the forehead and being in the region of the shoulder.

A WIDOW'S EVIDENCE.

Appeal Against Murder Conviction.

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT] I am afraid, Your Honour, that all magistrating do not read the Code as well as they ought. I remarked the Solicitor-General, Mr. D. H. Jones, in the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa yesterday, in reply to a query from the bench regarding an irregularity in the proceedings during the preliminary examination of a Native, Basim wa Mwaia, who was subsequently found guilty in the Supreme Court of having murdered another Native, Legat wa Mwaia, in the Nyamira district on August 15, 1933, and sentenced to the death penalty. The Acting Chief Justice, Mr. Justice Hume, and Mr. Acting Justice Justice heard the appeal against the conviction. Mr. Hume will appear on behalf of the appellant. The whole case, he said, depended on the evidence of the widow of the deceased man. She was alleged to have seen the accused with three companions enter the home of her husband, steal some of the cattle there, and effect the stab which killed her husband who had attempted to prevent the theft.

Accused's Companion.

It was strange he continued, that a *mulu* *peru* had been detected against the accused's three companions before the case against him commenced and that they were not called upon to give evidence. The only evidence led in proof that cattle had been stolen from the home and that the accused was one of the thieves was that of the murdered man's wife. This evidence, he said, should not have been accepted without corroboration. Proceeding he questioned the wife's statement that after consulting the mother she accompanied to a neighbouring home and there stole six head of cattle without a hue and cry being raised for the murderer and without her assistance. This, he considered a very unlikely state of affairs. He also questioned the wife's statement that when the stable cattle were eventually traced they were found not in the accused's home but in that of another Native. Judgment will be given on Saturday.
