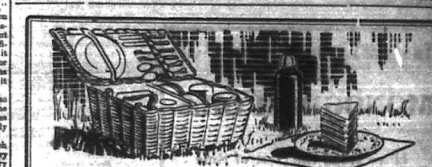

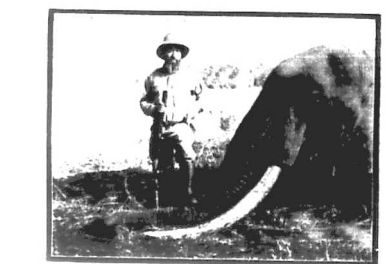

POULTRY NOTES.

Selection of Birds for the Show.

I expect that by this time most of my readers have received a show price list, and have more or less made up their minds what they are going to enter in the poultry exhibition.

In selecting birds for show, one must be in too much hurry to decide definitely on any one bird, it is a selection of several likely ones and gradually culled until you have the bird which you are most proud of. All the birds, which are put aside as likely ones should be handled. A knowledge of the standard of perfection is necessary for this.

Proposed Poultry Club.
Poultry farming has increased enormously in this country since the war, and it is high time that this branch of farming should be represented by a club or association.

Numbers of poultry farmers are anxious to become members of a club which has as its object the furtherance of their interests, but like many other things in this country it is difficult to get the initial move on.

It is proposed that a meeting should be held during show week at Nairobi when members could be recruited and committees, etc., elected. Poultry farmers who are willing to become members of such a club are asked to forward their names and addresses to me at the Z. A. Standard office. They will then receive a card informing them of date and time of the meeting.

It is hoped that as many poultry farmers as possible will endeavour to attend the meeting as the club to be a success should have an adequate representative of the interests of the whole of the poultry farming community of Kenya Colony.

A NEW LAND TAX PROPOSAL.

Levy for Upkeep of Roads.

A new proposal in the form of a tax on land owners to provide money for the upkeep of public roads is contained in the report of the Special Committee of the Legislative Council appointed to make recommendations in regard to the "Public Travel and Access Roads Ordinance."

The various amendments proposed inter alia for some of a road of some other than the land owners interested to be called upon by proprietors abroad for the maintenance of the road and to insure uniformity in the method of granting roads of some.

The Tax.
The report states further that it is suggested the time is ripe for the formulation of a scheme of local taxation for the purpose of constructing and adequately maintaining roads other than main trunk roads which would remain chargeable to Government.

The system of taxation suggested is a rate levied upon each holder of land outside a township at a rate per acre to be determined by the Government. The levy would be collected by the Lands Department and the proceeds handed to the District Road Boards for defraying a small amount in view of the fact that the Boards would decide the rate according to the nature of the District, road works to be carried out, etc.

The Government would not be asked to contribute any amount to Government accounts, but a guarantee would be given to the Government that the amount has been admitted to the Road Board and has not with practically no chance of being lost.

It is most disappointing to those who are doing their best to encourage dog breeding, and also to the K.C. Committee who are putting in much time and work to make well for exhibitors.

I still live in hope that during this last week before the entries close, entry forms and dogs will tumble in on top of each other. You will still have a day or two after the publication of these Notes to do back up and let us realize our work has not been in vain.

I have been greatly honoured by the K.C. Committee to send me down to judge fair-haired and Smooth-haired, also sighthounds in the variety sporting classes. You need have no fear I possess the courage of my convictions, and only look at one end of the chain.

I have a piece of bad news in that The "Abletude" "Q" died last week in about 24 hours from what I am told was septicaemia. This is a bad loss for Miss W. Bennett who has kindly allowed to Miss C. Bennett who had charge of the dog during his illness to be buried in England.

I am inclined to think that the form of pneumonia which has been disseminated affecting the dog is canine. My reason for saying this is because Mr. Paterson sent a bottle down to Baramba, Baringo, Kenya, and though no letter was sent back with the bottle, my sister who had kindly undertaken the charge and return of the dog, the letter was given a verbal message that the dog in the Baramba's Kennel was ill, and to look out that the bitch was kept separate.

On Mr. Paterson's bitch again reaching his farm, she became very ill, a reliable professional opinion and other young dogs the second died, and a half bred "Abletude" died.

My dog who had visited Mr. Paterson's farm, and mixed with the sick lot, undoubtedly brought the disease back home in his coat and nose. The other got ill right in a fortnight. I have never seen a dog take exactly this form before. But I am entirely well convinced this it must have been.

"Bora" who was the culprit in bringing it here, is over 6, he has died during the last outbreak. The death of the "Middleton" is evidently also over it. "Faint the Pig" was the heavy "in" pup to "Q" Fred and I was pretty sure that the blood here had also showed no symptoms and presented me with a beautiful litter of eight last week which are doing well so far.

My theory, should these pups survive I shall have three dogs to sell, one bitch, Col. Dobson has kept one bitch already. And there were only three in the litter. This blood is valuable and should not be misused.

The above will show what a risk there was in sending bitches about the country to stud dogs. And also the necessity for owners of stud dogs to take the greatest care and precautions.

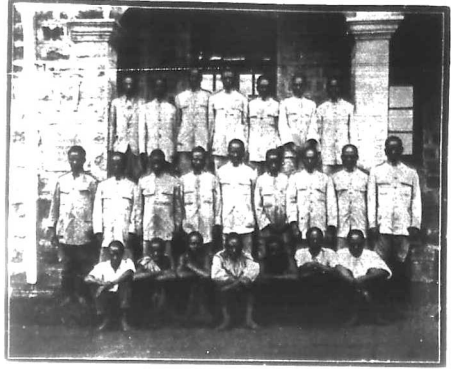

SHIPPING PROBLEMS

UGANDA TURNS DOWN THE SHIPPING CONFERENCE.

Bombshell Telegram Received.

INSUFFICIENT TIME TO CONSIDER THE QUESTION.

Standing Committee Appointed.

GOVERNMENT TO BE ASKED TO PROVIDE NECESSARY FUNDS

The Shipping Conference commenced its deliberations at the Agricultural Department Office on Wednesday. Mr. W. C. Hunter presided, the chair and there were present in addition to their Excellencies Sir Robert Coryndon and Sir Geoffrey Archer, representatives of Uganda, Tanganyika and Zanzibar and delegates from the Kenya Government, Convention of Associations, Association of E. A. Chambers of Commerce and the Indian Association.

The Conference was opened by Sir Robert Coryndon and his two heads of departments who accompanied him to Nairobi, stating his confidence that Kenya and the other territories could depend on the fullest cooperation from the Conference deal with:

- (1) Low Rates
- (2) Stable rates
- (3) Regularity of services

His Excellency stated that a standing committee be formed set up as proposed but held in the interim importance of these or any months ahead for the benefit of shipping companies. He warned the Conference that in any event any obligations undertaken they must not give the shipping companies any reason to say that the Government had not kept their side of the arrangement.

Uganda's Policy.

In a reference to the proposals of Uganda, Sir Geoffrey Archer stated that they expected to get their 100,000 tons of cotton each season which would be shipped to Mombasa to wait for an onward call and he stated he estimated that with other crops the production of Uganda to be shipped would approximate 250,000 tons. He stated that he had already talked with the Home Government the possibility of extension of the main line of Uganda Railway from Turko to Jinja.

The Resolutions

After a long discussion on two methods of approaching the rebate system was brought up and fully debated by delegates of all territories. Finally the Conference adopted a resolution in the following terms—

"In view of the handicap imposed on production by the existing system of primage, and in view of this Conference is of the opinion that their incidence should be carefully investigated with a view to their abolition if found advisable."

After discussing the mechanism of a standing committee as very much length a resolution in the following terms was adopted: "That this Conference is of the opinion that the formation of a permanent body to deal with the subjects set out in the terms of reference to this Conference, and other cognate subjects, provides the necessary financial assistance. Furthermore and that the Government of the territories concerned be approached in this matter."

It was further decided to appoint a sub-committee to draft proposals for the composition, terms and finance of the permanent standing committee and to report same to the Conference. The following

were selected to form the sub-committee: Messrs. Sir Robert Coryndon, Mr. W. C. Hunter and the Director of Agriculture with Mr. W. C. Hunter as ex-officio member. The Conference adjourned until 4.30 to-day when the sub-committee will report.

The important subject of shipping (freights and services) was discussed by a conference which was briefly reported in the E. A. Standard yesterday met in Nairobi on Wednesday afternoon. There were present—Mr. W. C. Hunter (Chairman), Mr. S. Simpson (Director of Agriculture and Mr. C. N. Logan, Director of Public Works (representing Uganda) Lt. Col. W. K. Franklin, C.M.B., D.S.O., H.M. P. (representing Tanganyika), Lt. Col. R. H. Turner, C.M.B. and Ag. Trade Commissioner for South Africa (General Manager, Uganda Railway), Director of Agriculture and Commissioner of Customs, Kenya (Mr. J. F. H. Harper) and Mr. J. F. H. Harper (Convention of Associations), Mr. P. S. Manjhi (Mombasa M. S. S. Shipping Conference Lines and Mr. F. H. Clarke' Shipping, Non-Conference Lines (Association of E. A. Chambers of Commerce); Major J. W. Milligan, R.A. (Nairobi Chamber), Mr. A. A. Legat (Ambassador), Mr. P. S. Manjhi (Mombasa M. S. S. Shipping Conference Lines and Mr. H. H. Malik (Mombasa), Mr. Hosenbhal Sultan Virji (representing the Indian Association).

After remarks by Sir Robert Coryndon, and by His Excellency Sir Geoffrey Archer, as previously reported, the Chairman, Mr. W. C. Hunter, on each side explained the disabilities under which they laboured it would then be possible for the Conference to consider methods of removing the disabilities. He did not think the Conference should go into detail and he expressed the hope that a permanent committee would be the outcome of the discussions.

Short Opinion.

Mr. P. S. Manjhi explained that as the Conference had been called as short notice and his colleagues had no sort of brief and had few facts to refer to.

Discussing the difficulties before the Conference Lines, Mr. Simpson emphasized that the great difficulty was that of the regular shipment. Just now there was plenty of cargo and it was seldom a ship left with empty space but that was not always the case. In London months ahead and both inward and outward cargo had to be taken into account. During the last few years very few shipping companies in this part of the world had made calls east, a position accentuated by the fact that the shipping conference ships possessing retailatory measures.

The great difficulty was to be sure that shipments off-ward would really come to hand, and if the shipping conference could have an absolute assurance two or three months ahead that space applied for would be filled a great deal of uncertainty would disappear. If the difficulty were given that would mean a release where, after ships have been chartered in return for stable rates of

guarantee may be given that the space would be filled or that those offering the shipment would pay for the space not filled.

Mr. Harper did not think the coffee industry could give such a guarantee and added that on reference to the Coffee Planters' Union the shipping companies could generally get an approximate idea of the cargo to be expected. Mr. Dogood said the maize industry was sufficiently organized to give an idea of what could be expected during the maize season and in order to get the crop away as quickly as possible would be prepared to give a guarantee and in cases of need to pay for dead freight.

The Chairman remarked that the maize industry was the only one in such a happy position and they must not deal only with one particular commodity. Major Milligan pointed the subject of expenses must also be considered.

Rebates.

Mr. Conway Harvey, to focus discussion, raised the question of the rebate system as one of the main disabilities of the planter.

Speaking as a shipper particularly interested in the coffee industry Major Milligan referred to the rebate system which he regarded as a contract under which in return for giving his full shipments to the Conference Lines the shipper obtained lower freight rates. At the same time it was reasonable to expect a good price even as adequacy and regularity of service. That had not been the fortunate lot of the shipper.

Continuing, Major Milligan quoted instances during the past few years where, after ships have been advertised to call on a cer-

tain date, and coffee had been loaded to the port, several postponements had taken place, in the sailing date or, in some cases, the ship had been withdrawn entirely. The result had been that coffee which was a sensitive product and susceptible to every least had had to lie in Mombasa where it deteriorated and, on arrival Home, had been short out of the market for which it had been shipped originally or, as in the case of the "Doris Castle," which was postponed several times and then sailed via South Africa, the coffee arrived in London at the same time as other ships via Suez and a flooded market resulted in financial losses to the planters.

The sub-committee made by Major Milligan were—

- (1) Postponement of sailings of advertised boats.
- (2) Cancellation of sailings.
- (3) Lack of space offered by steamers for cargo.
- (4) Inability to accept cargo owing to stowage arrangements especially in connection with mail steamers.

He asked the Conference Lines to agree that they should give the planters the right to give permission to shippers in the event of a Conference Line boat not being available to ship the produce by a non-Conference steamer which sailed before the date fixed for the Conference boat. This would relieve the planters of competition and assist planters considerably financially. He asked for greater latitude in this respect. In regard to guaranteeing cargo, he had to ask the shipowners to remember, the peculiar climatic difficulties of the country and the difficulty of giving any such guarantee.

In his view the rebate system

had good points but in return there should be stable freight, adequate space and regular sailings. Finally he quoted the reply of the Conference Lines to an enquiry for permission to ship on an outside boat cargo destined for the Mombasa which had been postponed. The permission was ultimately given with the following proviso: "Provided you do not endanger your commitments by the Mombasa"—an impossible option.

Mr. P. S. Manjhi supported the abolition of the rebate system as the only method of bringing about open competition among the shipping companies.

Mr. Harper, who supported Messrs. Harvey and Milligan, thought the Conference Lines wanted to have their cake and eat it. He maintained that the rebate system was in itself a guarantee but in return the planters received nothing from the Conference Lines. If the companies were determined that they could no longer receive the rebate system, he considered that a good price must be forthcoming. Furthermore he insisted that the Conference Lines would not get any guarantee from the Conference Lines and it was, in his view, unnecessary to demand it.

To give the other side an opportunity of presenting their views Mr. Harvey moved that in the opinion of the Conference the rebate system should be abolished. In reply Mr. Sims said the rebate system, which was very old, was primarily introduced to give a sort of bond over shippers if a company sent out steamers to a certain route and to guarantee in some way that they would not cut the cargo. They also wanted to avoid open competition by the inclusion of tramp steamers etc. picking up the cargoes for a few shillings less.

NANDI UNREST.

Chief Native Commissioner Questioned.

A REPORT N-GOMA.

Position Considered Serious and Prompt Action Needed.

At Monday's sitting of the Legislative Council Mr. Conway Harvey asked if all was well with the Nandi at the moment. He recalled that after the 1905-6 Nandi rebellion certain ngomas were absolutely prohibited by Government. On the 15th inst. the Senior Commissioner at Kiambu gave permission for an ngoma to be held. The result was that the warriors from the reserve and workers from the farms locked down in their warpaint and armed to the teeth. The ngoma had something to do with "blooding spears" and with circumcisions.

The Administration at Kapsoit before the date of the ngoma arrested the Leibon (chief witch doctor) and a number of Nandi elders and sent them to Eldoret. In the interests of public safety, Mr. Harvey asked an assurance from the C.N.C. that the Nandi would be kept under proper control. He added that the arrested Leibon was the son of the man who died in 1905 and had apparently been following in his father's footsteps. He regarded the position as serious and said prompt action was necessary.

Diverse Views.

The Chief Native Commissioner said it was rather difficult for him to say in regard to any plan that "all is well." Two Administrative officers who visited the district did not share the alarm of the man on the spot but certain action would be taken. The ngoma had no political significance and had only reference to the customary circumcisions. So

far as he was advised by capable and very experienced administrators there was no risk and no reason for alarm. A senior officer had been sent to the district and after remaining for some time would report at an early date.

RAILWAY SUFFER DEFEAT FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS SEASON.
Civil Service Win by an Odd Goal.

A FAST INTERESTING AND CLEAN CONTEST ON GYMKHANA GROUND

A large crowd of spectators gathered round the ropes on Gymkhana ground on Saturday last to watch the final tie for the Girovard Cup between Railway and Civil Service Amateurs. Those present were His Excellency Sir Robert Coryndon, Lady Coryndon, and His Excellency the Governor of Uganda, accompanied by a Government Home party. In view of the remarkable record put up by Railway during the season in that they had not lost a match, the general opinion previously to Saturday was that they would have little difficulty in annexing the trophy at the expense of Civil Service, whose display of football in league contests had always been indifferent as compared with Railway Great was everyone's surprise, however, when one of the fastest and most interesting matches played in Nairobi of late resulted in a victory for Civil Service who, after a game of a performance which they had never shown before, defeated Railway by two goals to one.

The blame for the defeat of Railway rests entirely with themselves. During the first half they had considerably the better of the game and should have crossed over at least a couple of goals to the good. They played good football throughout, but during the second half they went completely to pieces for some unknown reason and were punished by the less scientific tactics of the Service team. They certainly recovered during the last few minutes of the match but it was too late; the winning goal had been scored.

The Surprise.
 The Civil Service side exceeded the most sanguine expectations and played a remarkably good game, although strictly of the cup-tie order of kick and rush. Their combination was at no time particularly brilliant, but they were eagle in defence and broke up all Railway attacks. The forwards followed up well and with Ibbott playing a glorious game and with Thomson as a goal striking good form, the whole of the line wanted watching. Owing, a recruit to Association football, was very useful indeed for his speed and hustling tactics.

It was the halves who won the match for Service. They played a topping defensive game and invariably initiated the attacks. Both Mapp and Robbins were hard at work all through and were little less than brilliant. Mention must also be made of Pusey in goal, who by a series of excellent saves, to all intents and purposes saved the match for his side.

The weakness of Railway was in the half-back line, and the right wing of the forward line. Paterson was the pick of the halves, Gregson being right off his usual game and O'Connell being somewhat test. If the whole of the forward line had played a game like O'Connell and Mallitia a very different story might have been told—

but they didn't. Walker and Vanhagen did most of the work and it did well, but they were up against it and could not be blamed for the defeat. Hardinge, in goal had little to do.

Pusey refused, the goalkeeper and Ibbott after a wetty movement led drive with a hard shot which crossed the goal mouth. He allowed this up a second or two later with a long effort, Hardinge saving.

The game at this stage became exciting, as after Pusey had kicked twice, getting the ball swung through a rush, and a corner had been cleared, Service got away again. O'Connell opposed the corner, but the score was not opened, although Robbins was only inches high with a shot.

Railway had somewhat the better of the general run of the play, chiefly owing to better combination. O'Connell and Thomson stepped the score. From a Service goal kick Young received and neatly tapped the ball to CLOWER, who getting into position, formed the net with a lovely shot.

TRANS KZOMA ROADS.

£5,000 Extra to Make Them Useful.

AN URGENT NEED.

The fact that the Budget contains no direct provision for the maintenance and improvement of the roads in the Colony...

The point was raised on the P.W.D. Extraordinary vote by Colonel Griffiths who pointed out that present roads run parallel with the railway and would have to be altered to run in a different direction.

The Director of Public Works agreed that considerable resources must be made available. He stated that the roads had been constructed up to the Sabatia and must be surveyed first and it was awaiting definite information as to the ultimate sites of the other stations.

In reply to questions, the D.P.W. explained that the District Road Boards would be consulted before the survey work since and before work was commenced after the survey had been made.

The Director of Agriculture called attention to the seriousness of the position which had become acute. Unless something was done at an early date it would be quite impossible to get the present state of the stations. He could not undertake the delay because the station sites had already been fixed. He mentioned that there were existing over 3000 tons of produce to come down the line in the next few days and even in the settled areas of Lower Nile the road service is becoming so totally inadequate.

In answer to questions, Mr. Clegg (Vice-Chairman) said he would see what could be done to speed an office from the Land Office to help in the survey. Mr. Lord Lambert complimented this obvious necessity but had not been mentioned in the estimates where something like this essential work has been put out.

The Colonial Secretary at this stage pointed out to Colonel that a number of amendments to the Budget now stood at £20,000.

Survey and Construction. The D.P.W. favoured any addition to the estimates being sufficient to include not only survey and construction.

A discussion also took place over this estimate as to the relative values of the erection of a station at Eldoret for the assistant commissioner and the construction of an office for the Resident Commissioner. The D.P.W. was unalterably of opinion that it was undesirable to have a house for the P.W.D. official at Eldoret. He also held that if an office for the Resident Commissioner was required it should appear in the Budget at a cost of £1,000 as the sum proposed, £1,000 would not be sufficient.

The Platoon North member expressed the view that there was no need for a P.W.D. resident engineer as he could only interfere with the work of the Roads Board occasional visits were required by the people of the district to be sufficient. He also endeavoured to bring to the sympathetic consideration by the present D.P.W. that he thought a sufficiently good road capable of extension could be built with local materials for the D.P.W. involved the insertion of £1,500 in the estimates to provide for the D.P.W.'s house with the P.W.D. in the case he had made arrangements with the Colonial Secretary's office, the Colonial Secretary had said, and said that he would increase the vote and the D.P.W. could not have more than what he made out a case for the matter to be absolute.

WOMEN DEBTORS.

Liable to Imprisonment Under Civil Code.

"EASTERN STANDARD."

The Legislative Council decided on Thursday after a long and involved debate, that the new Civil Procedure Ordinance shall contain a clause providing for the imprisonment of women for default in payment of debts.

The point, which was debated earlier in the week, arose out of a clause in the Civil Procedure Ordinance providing for the imprisonment of women but in the report of the Select Committee on the Ordinance there was a recommendation that a clause be inserted under which it would be laid down that no woman could be imprisoned for debt.

Abolishing Debtors. The Attorney-General opened the debate by referring to several points raised by Mr. Shams-ud-Deen earlier in the week in regard to abolition of debtors.

Replying also to a suggestion that provision should be made for the release of debtors who, because of age or infirmity could not remain in prison, the Attorney-General said that the discretion as to whether or not a debtor could be released was not Government's business otherwise the ends of justice would be defeated. The debtor holder had that power and the Attorney-General added that he did not propose to amend the clause dealing with imprisonment of women. The Attorney-General said he could not find a single word of explanation in any books he had so far why women were not rendered liable to imprisonment for debt. He explained that women could be imprisoned at home for a period of 14 days and the court of law would not proceed until she was able to pay the debt at the date incurred. If a woman even if married, had separate property then separate property could in equity be attached.

Change Stand. A somewhat lengthy debate followed in which the Acting Attorney-General, the Commissioner of Lands, Mr. T. A. Wood, the P.M.O. and others took part and eventually 22 votes in all it was decided to include the clause providing for the imprisonment of women debtors.

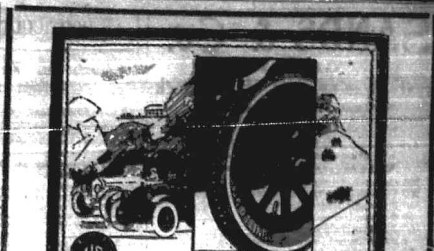

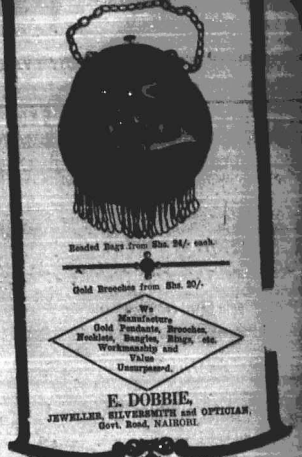

COFFEE INDUSTRY IN DANGER.

Possibility of Increase in Disease.

NEW OFFICIAL APPOINTMENT.
