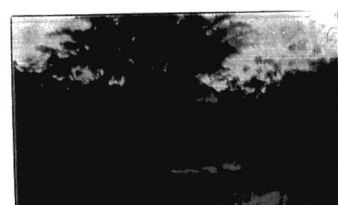

FIRST RESULTS UNFAVOURABLE TO THE CONSERVATIVES

MANY LIBERAL & LABOUR GAINS.

Mr. J. H. Harris Captures the North Hackney Seat.

SAKLAVALA UNSEATED AT BATTERSEA.

Manchester Almost Unanimous in Favor of Free Trade.

LEADERS OF ALL PARTIES DEFEATED.

[THROUGH SEVEN'S AGENCY.]

The weather in London to-day was fine but cold. Polling booths were set up in many constituencies and in others at eight o'clock after which hour there was a slight falling of voters. They will mostly finish in the evening however and are expected the polling will be speedy.

The results of about 200 out of 204 constituencies will be declared to-night beginning at 7:30. In London the result of the remainder will be declared to-morrow commencing at midnight.

A black pall of fog descended over London just when electioneering revellers were beginning to assemble.

All traffic became chaotic in a few minutes. Buses crawled along piloted by their conductors followed by a flock of taxis thankful for guidance and crowds became shabby figures and dispirited hordes.

A feature of the elections was the early polling of women who were nearly second by vote in the east. There was heavy polling in the southern industrial constituencies, but there was generally a marked absence of contest.

Mr. Baldwin and other leaders of the parties received enthusiastic ovations in their respective constituencies.

Tragedies and a Fire.

There were tragedies during the day, and besides the death of a woman at Brighton after riding an old mare at Durdan on a public poll the poll stopped on the ice and fell on his head and died.

The fifteen contests at Glasgow were very lively.

The Countess of Warwick was defeated by her efforts as a Labour candidate for Warwick and Leamington and remained in bed most of the day.

A few leaks out at the offices of the "Lincoln Chronicle" and several papers exist.

A window in the Conservative committee room at Edmonton, where eight women were working was smashed, it is believed by opponents, though two constables on duty outside did not see anyone approach.

Sir Samuel Hoare Hobbed.

The crowd broke through the police cordons at the Town Hall, Chelmsford, and chased the victorious Sir Samuel Hoare to his committee room where he struck him, whereas the defeated Labour

candidate Hon. Bertrand Russell was carried shoulder high.

AT THE EMPIRE EXHIBITION

A Visit to Wembley.

GROWTH OF LOWWAYS TOGETHER WITH

A Potted Empire.

(BY R. F. S. DEWDNEY.)

London, Oct. 10.

There just past a visit to London, a lovely sister of rubber people should see London's lovely beauty.

Two hours I have made a complete tour of the Empire Exhibition, a party of London localities was invited to visit the site of the British Empire Exhibition at Wembley. The plans and layout for the exhibition are the result of progress that has been made.

It is only by a personal visit that one can really appreciate the magnitude of the undertaking. One of the officials in charge of the exhibition is interested that Mr. Colwyn is taking in the preliminary of the exhibition, when I agreed with my friend.

YARD-AND-A-HALF SKIRTS.

To make Stockings Last

Stockings are an expensive item in the dress outfit of the woman of today. When they become worn, wearing with the new variety, it is a waste of money. It is not always for allowance if her stockings are to be above reproach, and slight to the eye does just above the top of the shoe.

There are ways in which the life of stockings may be greatly prolonged. Artificial silk stockings, being made of synthetic fibers, will become tougher and stronger if both all sides are soaked in cold water before being worn. The water fills out the vegetable cells, making the waste by friction up and become more resistant.

The French method of washing out the feet of feet, with stockings every time they are worn, is also effective in prolonging their life. The moisture that is given out by the feet impregnates the material, and this is regularly removed, the silk will last longer.

Not every fiber is "silk-like." Many a woman has been that slightly smaller than those of perfectly proportioned feet. This means that the heels rub up and down inside for shoes and bring down an increased strain on the stockings. To counteract this, a layer of velvet sewn inside the shoe is valuable. It will rub the shoe to a fine, soft texture and minimize the rub. Little stocking protectors of woven thread are sold in many shops; they cover the sides, toes and heels of the feet and save wear on the stockings themselves.

A solution that is actually ten in a semiquintal and plain form is said for applying to knit or a premium and stretchable. It can be used with impunity, will still stand holding without tearing the proverbial knit.

Kenya's New Constitution

Composition of Legislative Council Gazetted

FIVE ELECTED INDIANS.

Provision for Representation of the African Interests

The new constitution for Kenya was published in the Official Gazette on Wednesday in the form of Additional Instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet by His Excellency the Governor.

Constitution

The Legislative Council of the Colony shall consist of the Governor as President, ten ex-officio Members, Nominated Official Members not exceeding five, and not more than six African Elected Members, five Indian Elected Members, and one Nominated Indian Member to represent the interests of the African community.

The Public Interest

The Indian and Arab Elected Members of the Legislative Council shall be such persons who may be elected in accordance with the provisions of any law made in that behalf by the Governor in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State who may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal the Nominated Official Member (if any) of the Council to represent the interests of the Arab community in Kenya and shall be appointed by the Governor by an instrument under the Public Seal in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal all such Nominated Indian Members (if any) of the Council to represent the interests of the Arab community and shall in any case vacate their seats at the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment, but may be re-appointed.

The New Voters

Thereafter the Instructions set forth the order of precedence from official members down to Nominated Indian Members and then to African voters to the above. The Council consists of twelve Indian and Arab voters who are asked to apply to have their names registered as voters. The application form asks particular questions regarding character, nationality, age, etc., and whether applicant has been in prison for more than 12 months before bankruptcy or received relief from public funds within a year of the date of application.

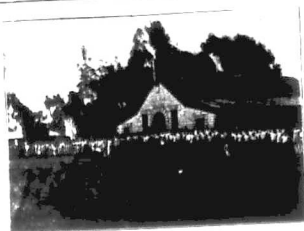

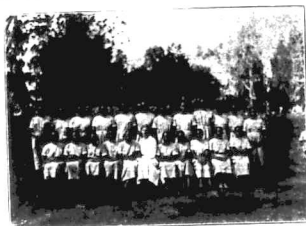

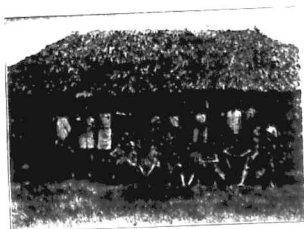

SHIPPING MATTERS

Uganda Views on the Committee.

DIFFERENCES OF OPINION.
While Kenya officials and public men were in Uganda, an opportunity which presented itself was taken to discuss the proposed Shipping Committee. It will be remembered that at the recent meeting of the Shipping Conference in Nairobi (attended by Uganda's Governor and other representatives) a telegram was received from the Uganda Chamber of Commerce dissociating themselves from the scheme.

At the meeting in Uganda Mr. Hobbs, the Kenya Director of Agriculture gave the proposed scheme to the meeting, pointing out in what way it was thought that the Committee would be of use to Uganda. He emphasized that it would be necessary if the Committee was to be a success that more or less accurate statistics should be compiled for the various countries of future export and of the probable amount of shipping coming forward over certain periods.

Mr. Cameron said he did not think general statistics would be of any use and that he considered it impossible to give anything at all in the way of specific ones. The Hon. Mr. Lewis said that he did not consider specific statistics required. The Committee would require general ones only and as far as he knew Uganda was the only country of those proposed for members of the Shipping Committee.

Colonel Franklin suggested that they should consider their shipping difficulties and then suggest remedies. Undoubtedly they had difficulties and delays with their shipping and it was the proposed purpose of the Shipping Committee to obviate these. He suggested that the meeting should consider this before turning the committee down.

Mr. Cameron reiterated that he considered that general figures were useless and that specific ones were necessary. The Hon. Mr. Lewis, Met. at all general figures give averages and averages more accurate than individual figures.

A few days ago Mr. Cameron then read the letter from the Chamber of Commerce to Mr. Jarvis, the Hon. the Chief Secretary, that had contained the now famous cable to Kenya. He suggested that Colonel Franklin's offer could take over the job proposed for the Committee, and that payment should be made by that means. The committee concerned that the same assistance required. That would be cheaper than the amount suggested as contribution proper. Colonel Franklin said that this was the difficulty small shippers encountered but thought that Uganda could get over the difficulty of having representatives on the Committee by having an agent at Mombasa. In his position he was not allowed to take money for his assistance.

Mr. Lewis pointed out that it was in the interests of all that they should see to it that they looked into the matter for their own good at meetings of the Committee and that therefore there was no need for Uganda to have representatives on the Committee at all.

Mr. Cameron said that it was not necessary for that meeting to decide the question definitely at all, but to look into the matter for the Chamber of Commerce and the Uganda Chamber of Commerce respectively.

NAIROBI MATTERS

Abatement of Steamer Service Wanted.

EXPORT STORAGE.
A meeting of the Mwanza Chamber of Commerce was held on November 12, when, in view of the then impending visit of Mr. Robert Coryndon and Mr. F. W. Bell, the following matters were brought up:—
1. That the Uganda Railway should be asked to provide storage accommodation for exports after acceptance, thus relieving the exporters of the difficulty of paying rent to the Customs Authorities, after the expiration of the "free" period.

2. That an endorser be made to induce the Uganda Railway to alter the round lake steamer service, so that the two boats which arrive in Mwanza within two days of each other as at present. Either that the s.s. "Hunings" be timed to arrive two days earlier, or the s.s. "Uganda" be delayed two days or more. This, in addition to greatly facilitating postal matters with Kenya, would also be severely handicapped under the present system.

3. That the freight on gum from Mwanza to Kilindiini be reduced as the rate now ruling is much higher in proportion to the cost than the rate on prospects of other similar produce.

4. That more information be obtained regarding the proposed change in the rate of service round the lake, whether it is proposed with special reference to the following points:—

- (a) What Ports will be called at by the new service
- (b) What would be the rates charged on produce from these ports
- (c) What would be the rates from these ports to Mwanza.
- (d) Whether it is proposed to give this service all the year round, or for a portion of the year only.
- (e) What the extent of this service being inaugurated, whether by smaller and stronger companies, and what accommodation they will be provided at each port.

Robert Coryndon.

"The Government of Kenya has been instructed by His Majesty's Government to explore the matter further on his return to the Colony, and in concert with the Government of Uganda, to submit proposals to the Secretary of State for the Colonies for giving effect to that measure of control of immigration which the economic interests of the natives of both dependencies require."

"My Committee apprehends that after such proposals are submitted to the Secretary of State, the Office by the Government of Kenya the Colonial Office may approve of the proposals, and in connection to the unfavourable rights of Indians in this matter. My Committee submit that the method of financing the railway should be absolutely unacceptable to the Government of India."

"The nature of the proposals of Kenya can be easily gathered from the past but has played a part in the Kenya question, and it is an exaggeration to say that India has no longer any interest in the Kenya question. Mr. Robert Coryndon to do even have been in the past, the rights of Indians in Kenya."

Anxious Regarding Ruhr and Rhine.

POINCARRE UNRENDING

(THROUGH BETTER'S AGENCY) London, December 14. Following the publication in Berlin yesterday of an unprinted statement that the German government will shortly attempt to enter into direct negotiations with France and Belgium in regard to the future of the Rhineland and the Ruhr, a Paris message received today from the French government states that M. Poincarre is unyielding in his attitude towards the German proposal.

The French government, it is stated, has no intention of entering into direct negotiations with Germany until the latter has first agreed to the evacuation of the Ruhr and the Rhineland by the German troops. It is further stated that the French government is anxious to see the German government make a definite statement regarding its intention to evacuate the Ruhr and the Rhineland.

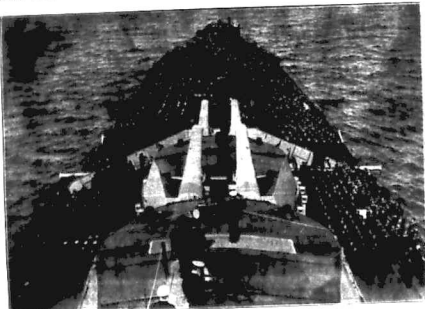

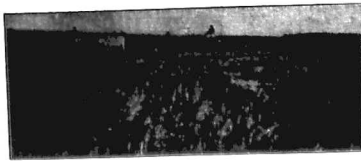

WHEAT GROWING ON THE PLATEAU.



One of the most encouraging signs of the future in the Transvaal Province today is the increasing attention being paid to wheat growing and the readiness of those engaged in it that they have not yet got down to "small business." This is largely due to the extensions that have taken place in the milling industry during the past year and to the greater attention contemplated in the near future. Messrs. Chapman Ltd. which carries the name of Lord Desborough is so intimately identified with wheat that the credit of having paved the way and the track of their efforts are now to be seen in a rapidly increasing area under wheat and of not less importance a firm market for the wheat when grown.

This time last year the position of the wheat grower was so very different that one hardly imagines such a transformation taking place in the short space of twelve months. 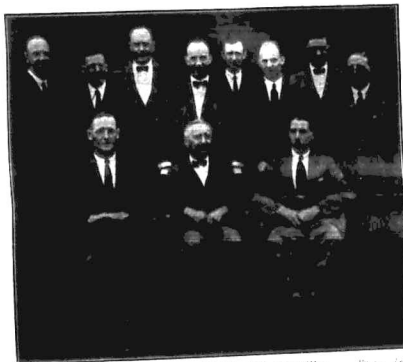

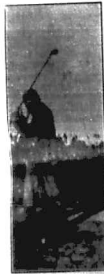

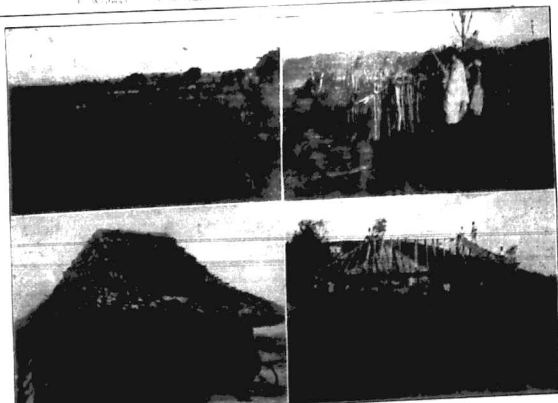

**Suicide to Shooting of
Naiiro Cook.**

DISPUTES ABOUT FARM

D. M. Morrison, an English settler, has been sentenced to three years imprisonment for the shooting of a cat on the morning of the 12th, for the charge was one of murder.

He had been absent from the house all afternoon, and when accused returned, he found the foot brought in, used aggressive and abusive language, and said he (accused) never saw any of the food deceased had eaten—all he wanted was drink. This was asperated and provoked an accused that he picked up an empty bottle from the table and

struck deceased on the head with it. He denied having been drunk himself on that occasion, though he had had a few drinks.

Alleged Attack.

Accused further stated that after the servants had left the room, he sat down at the table with some private writing he was engaged upon, thinking no further of the cook's insolence except to report the affair to Mr. Russell, the boy's employer on his part. About half an hour afterwards, deceased came in through the front door, which opened into the room in which accused was sitting. Accused did not look up or take any notice as deceased went hastily through the intervening room into Mr. Russell's bedroom, but in a few moments he saw him at the corner of the table opposite where he sat, hold a revolver in his right hand and muttering to himself.

Accused said that realising the danger, he ducked sharply, and taking a step forward, shot out both fists, the left towards the revolver. Something hit him on the left eye, either the butt of the revolver or deceased's elbow, but

just immediately before that it shot west of there was no struggle. Accused had not closed with deceased, intending only to knock the revolver out of his hand before he fired. The bullet struck deceased's head, and he dropped where he stood.

An Accident.

Accused maintained that the incident was purely accidental. He wanted to wash a tin in the pail in Aruba, but the boys had already washed it. After a considerable time, a passing settler took a message to a couple of neighbours.

After accused's counsel had addressed the Court, His Honour, Acting Chief Justice Alexander, summed up, and the two assessors retired to consider the case. They finally agreed that accused was guilty of culpable homicide, not amounting to murder, with which His Honour concurred, passing sentence of 3 years rigorous imprisonment.

Mails for Export.

During the week ending December 14, 12,000 bags of maize were received at Kilindi for export.

The total number graded was 12,000 bags, of which 3,700 had been classed in grade two, 67 in grade seven, 1,007 in grade ten (free of weevil), and 7,611 in grade eight (relatively weevil). Of the 1,245 bags reported 500 were sold, 7 were unsold, and 692 were weevily, while three bags were rejected for other reasons. Of the 500 bags of free maize, 140 came from Lusaka (10.4 per cent.), 118 from Kiligi (15 per cent.) and 20 from Lambara (17.5 per cent.) and 26 from other stations.

Prisoner Re-captured.

In the Magistrate's Court on Wednesday, the case was introduced in which a Dutchman, L. M. Joubert, was charged with escaping from lawful custody at Eldoret, after having been sentenced to a term of imprisonment. He was placed in the Eldoret Police Station for the night, three being sent for Eldoret, preparatory to his being transferred to grade and managed to unnerve the lock and decamp. He was recaptured some time later at Thika. A sentence of four months' H.L. was imposed to commence at the conclusion of his present sentence.

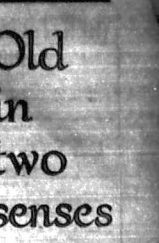
